GIGANTIC AIR RAID

Zeebrugge Bombed. SIXTY FIVE MACHINES ENGAGED.

London, March 20. The Admiralty's account of the night raiding a combined force of approximately 60 Zeppelins, Junkers, and German bombers and planes, accompanied by 65 fighting machines, attacked the Zeppelin station at Zeebrugge, and the munitions at Hookloze, near the mouth of the Scheldt, which, on a severe, misty night, on March 19, all the aircraft returned safely. One Zeppelin was destroyed, and another was damaged.

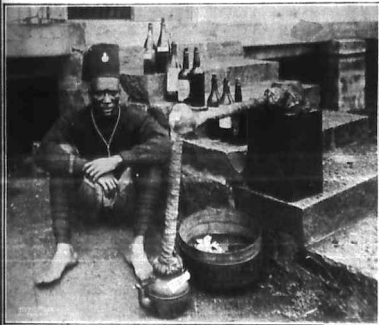

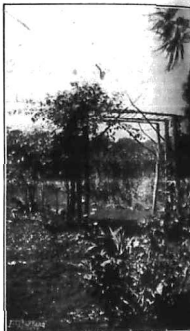

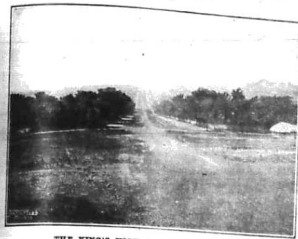

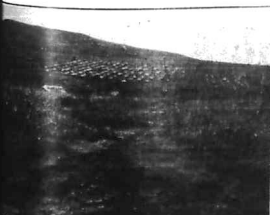

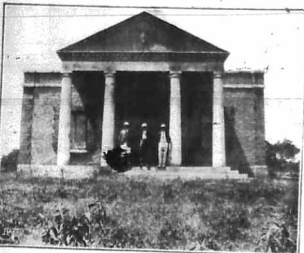

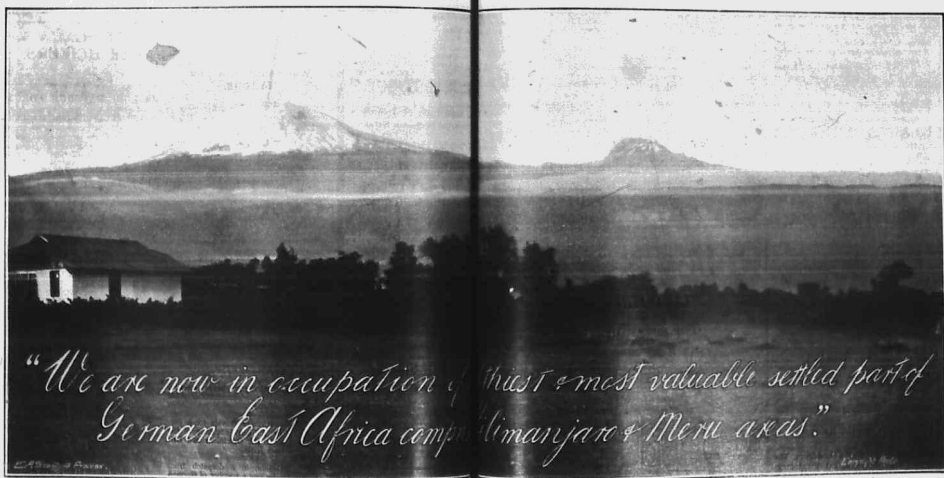
