

ALLIED TRADE.

Cheering Statement.

London, May 20.  
Mr. Chamberlain, in the House of Commons, in the course of a speech, foreshadowed the adoption of measures to facilitate a new national and Imperial war loan. He said that the loan would either entirely Protect or Free Trade, but that it was more important, which would develop more rapidly, the rôle of the Empire. He was speaking on the Finance Bill, and on the enormous financial strength of the nation, in comparison with Germany. Mr. Chamberlain said that manufacturers who were making sacrifices for the war had established a claim to consideration. We were asked for our purpose, he said. The Government must do its best to meet the claims of those who had suffered. Also, those industries vital to Britain which had not yet got the outbreak of war must be given every encouragement to make advances towards agreement. Mr. Chamberlain said that the British representatives at the Economic Conference were not bound to any rigid school of thought.

We continue, despite a most vigorous German offensive, to hold the north-east corner of the Somme, and to repel the attacks of the enemy.

The King replied: "I warmly appreciate the message you have sent to me in the name of the armies of the British Empire, which with what you have commanded, I trust, will bring us victory."

Field-Marshal's Message.




