

MEXICAN CRISIS.

A War Cloud. U.S.A. MILITARY MOBILISED.

President Huerta's Object.

London, June 19. Huerta's correspondence in Washington says that Carranza's demand that the American troops should enter Mexico, and President Wilson's objection to the mobilization of the United States military has been followed, yesterday, by an order providing for additional recruits for both coasts.

Rapid developments are expected in the Carranza's demand is regarded as an ultimatum. It is believed that President Wilson does not intend to acquiesce. It is reported that 100,000 men will respond to the mobilization order, and with the militia pending his orders, 20,000 regulars will then be released for service in Mexico should war ensue.

A later message from Washington states that President Wilson has completed two crises, one very largely due to Carranza, and the other to Austria, the latter demanding an apology and reparation for torpedoing the fish steamer "Perthalia" in the Mediterranean. The United States has refused to give any such apology.

London, June 19. Huerta's correspondence in Washington says that the American note, dated through the State Department, to the United States should be withdrawn from Carranza, but have been sent to the Mexican ambassador.

The note indicates the Carranza Government for the discussion time and temper of June last year.

ITALIAN FRONT.
Enemy's Thrust Parried.
STEADY ADVANCE.
 (FROM OUR SPECIAL AGENT.)

Rome, June 23. A Rome communique reports that several attacks on the Tuscan Front have been repulsed. The enemy's left night attacks in the Paganella Valley were driven off. The enemy made further fruitless and costly attacks between the Idage and Breda.

A Rome communique reports the continued Italian counter-offensive.

In these engagements, which are everywhere favoured in the Italian press, the enemy's heavy artillery and costly efforts, especially in reading the lines, were repulsed but was not ultimately stopped by the Italians, who in face of the persistent resistance offered by an entrenched enemy, supported by numerous batteries—repulsed to the head of the Paganella Valley. The Allies made two positions, inflicting heavy losses on the enemy, and capturing 200 prisoners, six guns, four machine-guns and much material.

An Italian air squadron has been busy for 24 hours 190 times, and 60,000 aerobically the enemy's movements to the north of Breda.
















