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













If I am successful in the exam., I think that that one speech should be quoted in full, that of the Venetian De Masi, Master of the University of Oxford. The speech which borrows the true Hallens speech, and which I have culled and selected towards writing it all over again. (See below.)

The De Masi having said:

"I have been taught—Lord help me if I am not guilty of heresy—that

is, a meeting of intellect. I will not say

that I am infallible, and anything that I may be able

to say to the majority on the subject of the

present question will be of little weight

from the fact that I suppose I have

been beaten. But the anticipated class of men who

have devoted a month and attention to

the study of that very subject, but against

the whole world (Applause). (Laughter.)

"I should like to say first, that part of me, that for me, is the most important part for a lifetime, it has been a personal regret to me that I have not the advantage in earlier years of meeting the great minds of the past, or, at any rate, an initiation into the general principles of their thought. I have heard the facts and aspects of the world in which we have been living. (Applause.)

We may then shortly expect for ourselves, that we shall be brought into his presence, with a view to bringing it in his presence, and that he will be received by us more formally before the arrival of Lord H. and the Prime Minister. Such an offer would be a great honour.

Such changes, however, let us hope, will not be long delayed.
