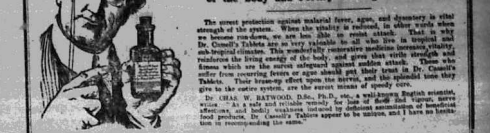

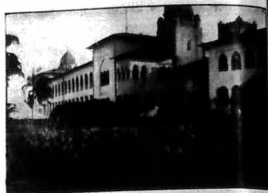

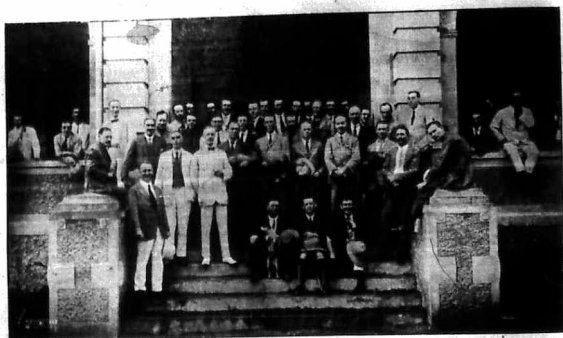

WOMAN'S WORLD. FASHIONS. HOME AND FIRESIDE. BY MOLLY

NOTES OF THE WEEK.

I have to acknowledge an exceptionally large batch of letters, most of which are most encouraging. The following one I publish as the reply I am able to give may prove of interest to many readers.

Your Molly—It would be very kind for any of your readers who give a good recipe for spruce hair, I might as well try. The best I can give is a hair-oil for putting in the comb, we have a bar of vitamin at a time and it's very difficult to keep it longer than eight days away from salting. I tested some and found to ask for the recipe, but my husband was not the one to give away secrets. Trusting to your generosity to think, etc.

In reply to my correspondent, I can supply her with three different pickles or brine, all of which I can recommend for the different purposes they are treated.

Dry Salting for Beef.—Pound and mix well together 2 lbs. salt, 1 lb. sugar, 1 lb. brown sugar and 1 teaspoonful black pepper. Rub moist well with this mixture; turn and rub well each day until well enough.

Pickle for Beef.—Four quarts water, and add to it 2 lbs. salt, 1 lb. sugar or fructose, 2 lbs. saltpetre, 2 lbs. cranial coriander seeds, 2 lbs. whole black pepper, and 2 lbs. whole allspice. Boil all together until all the steam has disappeared, and when cold, throw 9 over the meat to be pickled, this being in a cool day and airy place. This pickle will last for 12 weeks.

Pickle for Herring.—Mix and pound well together 1 lb. salt, 2 lbs. coarse sugar, 1 lb. saltpetre and 1 teaspoonful bicarbonate of soda, then rub well into pieces of venison and leave for about 24 hours, after which hang in a cool day and airy place. This pickle is for 12 weeks.

I hope that my correspondent and others interested will find these pickles useful. I would be very pleased to hear the result of the use of any one of these recipes fully. I have used the two first successfully.

I have found an advantage in the careful use of a wooden shaver to rub the meat in the thickest part to enable the brine to penetrate.

A step in the right direction has been taken by the Director of Education in calling a meeting of parents to appoint a school committee and a ladies committee.

Both these committees are quite good, but it does seem somewhat extraordinary that of the four ladies appointed, three have their husbands also on the school committee, with the result that three thus will only voice their husband's ideas, or vice-versa.

However, we will all hope great things from these committees for the betterment of the children. I shall hope that they will also endeavor to obtain for the teachers such remunerative as one expects to give to members of a profession with such heavy responsibility.

The heavy rains which we have experienced in Nairobi these few days have once more turned all our streets into well known liquid roads—into the well known quagmires.

On Tuesday next the Merry Melodists are giving a performance at the Palace in aid of the funds of the Hospital Visiting and Comforts Society. I sincerely hope that many will patronize the show, for two reasons.

Secondly the Society who is to receive the funds secured, has worked for a considerable time in a quiet unobtrusive way and the cheerfulness of the ladies of the committee has been greatly appreciated by the patients. Funds are needed for the good cause, the prices for the same are very low, but as do our little bit unobtrusively and besides enjoy a delightful evening.

WHAT WOMEN CAN MAKE AT HOME. A Fashionable and Useful Costume.

In all the newest fashions, one can distinctly discern the Russian inspiration, and here, in sketch No. 1998 is illustrated a costume cut on the Russian lines, which is at once smart and useful. It is an ideal shape, as it fastens so easily up to the neck. As the diagram indicates, the pattern is composed of few parts, and the entire making is quite within the limitations of the amateur dressmaker. The coat pattern consists of back, front, upper and under sleeve, cuff, collar, and belt portions. When cutting out, lay the pattern on the material with the centre back of the coat and the centre back of the skirt and fronts of the coat to the selvages. The front of the coat straps will overlap to the left side, and in these cold, damp days extra warmth is thus supplied to the chest.

There are in the coat pattern, just the usual bodice and shoulder seams which require to be closed. The fronts should be faced with unlined or bound, and a hem fastens the lower edge of the garment. The sleeves have the two usual seams, and are finished at the wrists open with a small pointed buttoned cuff and deep cuff. They are sewn in at the armholes in the ordinary

The Hon. A. C. MacDonald said that experiments on tobacco growing in this country for the last three or four years had proved that the soil was too rich to produce a high quality of tobacco. Good tobacco was grown in the Usain Gishu. His Excellency stated that it appeared to be better to keep making experiments with tobacco when some of the settlers wanted to do so. At the present tobacco export's time it is not safe for six months, nothing could be done at present.

The Hon. A. C. MacDonald mentioned that the Government Farm at Naivasha had the best crop for the last year or eight years and he had no doubt that a Government Farm on the Usain Gishu would yield a slight interest.

The Hon. P. H. Clarke asked that the Director of Agriculture would institute a permanent exhibition of local products at the Agricultural Office at Mombasa; this the Hon. Director of Agriculture promised to do.

#### VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

As to whether the Veterinary Department should be controlled by the Agricultural Department or not was the subject of an interesting debate.

Lord Delamere said that if the Veterinary Department was under the jurisdiction of the Agricultural Department then let them know it. He thought it was a very bad plan to let the two departments run separately.

The Hon. A. C. MacDonald stated that the Veterinary Department was not under the control of the Agricultural Department. Lord Delamere said that it seemed that the Veterinary Department spent a great deal of its time thinking how to annoy the Director of Agriculture.

The Hon. (Capt.) Hoey said that the veterinary service was totally unsatisfactory and that it should be brought directly under the Director of Agriculture.

Lord Delamere stated that everyone was dissatisfied with the working of the Veterinary Department, and to bring the matter to a point he would propose that the Veterinary Department be cut out from the extent of £100. The Hon. (Capt.) Hoey seconded the proposition, but the motion was lost by eight votes to six.

#### DIPS.

The question of paying £15 to every settler who installs a suitable dip on his farm was next considered.

The Hon. (Capt.) Hoey said that this might be done away with just now, as, owing to the price of cement, no one was erecting dips.

Lord Delamere said that he was of course in sympathy with dips, but money must be found for education.

The Hon. Chief Secretary thought this item might be reduced by £1,000 and this was agreed to.

#### P.W.D.

At this point the Director of the Public Works Department (Mr. W. MacGregor Ross) took the oath as a member of the Council.

Lord Delamere said that, as far as he could see, most of the work covered by the estimates was for Nairobi and surroundings, and Mombasa. He did not think that new roads should be made at all just now, and in any case Nairobi was being given so much that he thought it should be taxed in some manner. Twenty thousand pounds was to be spent over a large country like this and almost £15,000 was going to Nairobi and its surroundings. This, to the speaker, seemed to be wrong.

One of the items in the estimates was £500 for the reconstruction of the Ngong Road; this the Hon. (Capt.) Hoey took exception to, saying that upon the Usain Gishu they were quite pleased with an amount for maintenance and why should not the Ngong people have the same. After some discussion the Hon. Director of Public Works said he would take a little time and revise the estimate. The following is a copy of the revision:

#### SCHEDULE OF ROAD DEMANDS 1917-1918.

Mombasa Island roads, £5,000; opening of a route from Kisumu to the Railway, £2,500; Mombasa Island, Fort Hall Road, £2,500; certain roads and drains in the new Native Quarter, Nairobi, £5,000; reconstruction of Government Road from VI Avenue to the Bazaar, £1,000; reconstruction on Ngong Road including a bridge over the Mbagathi, £500; roads and bridges in the Native Reserve, Kyamburi, £666; bridge over the Ruiru, Kyamburi District, £200; three bridges on Mohoroni-Tinderet Road, £1,850; total, £19,816.

The Council agreed to accept these new figures, thus adding almost £700 to the total for educational purposes.

#### GAME WARDEN'S DEPARTMENT.

The Hon. Chief Secretary explained that the Chief Game Warden's position was vacant.

Lord Delamere proposed that the position of Game Warden be left so until after

the war, and that the money first be set towards education. The Council took the same view and it was agreed to be postponed.

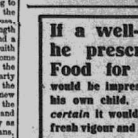
