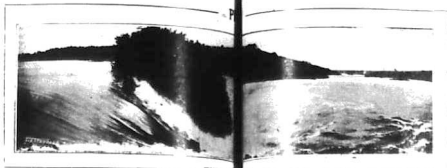

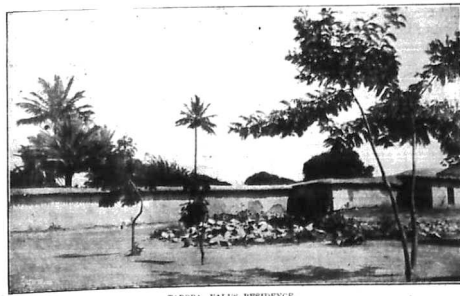

ply for its own preservation, it will not hesitate to postpone defeat by sacrificing territory which is only used to the purpose indicated in Sir Douglas Haig's letter. 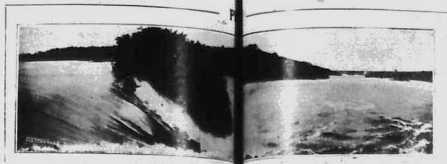

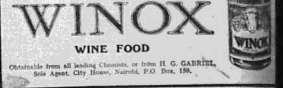

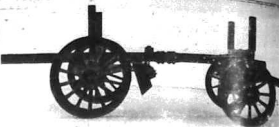
