Our Views and Criticisms.

If the case was trivial how came the Assistant Crown Advocate This case in itself is a trivial one the Assistant Crown Advocate, to be engaged in it. Only a few days previously the same Officer of the Crown refused on the ground that it was a police matter to take up a case where a headman was charged with farming out his master's labourers to an Arab, for personal emodiment, without his master's knowledge. but it has been brought to the notice of this Court by the Assistant Crown Advocate who considers the punish-ment awarded to be excessive. The facts are shortly that a private servant of the Deputy Inspector General Police was roughly hawled into the Police Station at Mombasa

We do not know what course the Assistant Crown Advocate adopted in requesting the High Court to reduce the punishment but we do know that it is usually a difficult, tedious and somewhat expensive process for an ordinary ing for a revision of a first class Magistrate's Judgment. Pre-sumably some clause in our locally made procedure allows for Crown Prosecutors to apply on behalf of an accused for reduction of sentence as The Deputy Inspector General Police himself thereon interfered, unfortunately, seeing that the person concerned was his own servant, but for reduction of sentence as we find no provision in the Indian Criminal Procedure Code.

> We read the evidence in a different way. In our opinion the proofs were overwhelming that from the very first moment the accused objected to be accossed by the Police. We are of by the Police. The learned Magistrate prior to hearing the defence withdrew the more serious charge but after hearing the defence expressed his segme that he had done so by the we must presume that there were ample grounds for the charge of grounds for the charge of resisting the police in the exe-cution of their duty.

The result of this revision is that the accused gets off free, if his fine is paid by his master.

It is not, however, on account of the Judgments we ask His Excellency to make himself congularate with the affair, but on account of the various irregularities which have occurred in connection with the case and which in the interests of the welfare of the Projectorate need investigation.
