FALL OF JERUSALEM
Allenby's Striking Success
TURKS SURRENDER TO BRITISH ON BEING ISOLATED

The British advance on Palestine has been pushed forward with vigor and success, and Holy City has now fallen into our hands. Our lines, with the slight of spring sword grass, aimed attacking Jerusalem, but worked round on each side, and succeeded in isolating the city. The Turks, finding themselves surrounded, threw arms and General Allenby's forces.

An official report from the British Headquarters in Palestine states that General Allenby has completed the capture of Jerusalem.

HOLY CITY SURROUNDED.
LONDON, December 12.
Mr. Bonar Law announced in the House of Commons today that Jerusalem, after being six days, had surrendered. In the course of his announcement, Mr. Bonar Law said that General Allenby reported that on December 8, he attacked the enemy's positions west of Jerusalem. Within a few hours his troops, advancing from the direction of Bethlehem, drove back the enemy, and entered Jerusalem on the east, established themselves on the Jerusalem-Jericho road. President, Mr. Bonar Law said that General Allenby, together with a British General, accompanied by British, French, and Italian Mohammedan representatives, was on their way to reconquer the city and Holy places. General Allenby proposed to enter the city officially as a conqueror, accompanied by the commanders of the British and Italian contingents, and the heads of the French, Italian missions. The capture of Jerusalem has in some degree, been adopted, owing to the great care which had been taken to do little damage to sacred places in and around the city.

HAILED WITH REVERENCE

LONDON, December 11.
The King has despatched the following message to General Allenby:
The occupation of Jerusalem will be received throughout the Empire with the greatest satisfaction. I heartily congratulate you and all ranks on the success. The achievement is a fitting sequel to your hard-fought and fighting, and the operations by which the all-British supply transport and water were overcome. I rejoice that the saintly dispensation preserved intact the places.

NAIROBI, December 12.
Telegram announcing the fall of Jerusalem has received at the Secretariat from Mr. Walter J. Murray of the State for the Colonies, in the form of which he says:

BRITISH PRISONERS
Total Enemy Captures

RETAILED STATEMENT BY UNDER SECRETARY FOR WAR
LONDON, December 11.

THOUSANDS OF LIVES LOST.
HUGE DAMAGE DONE.
(THROUGH RECENT'S ASSAULT.)

LONDON, December 6.

We passed the Turia as far as Karatash village, 25 miles to the north of Dohi-Abbas, through which the enemy was driven on Wednesday after a sharp engagement. ALLIED PLANES PENETRATE INTO GERMANY.
LONDON, December 7.

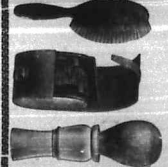

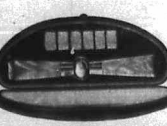

**Germany Again Visited.**  
BIG SUCCESSSES BY BOTH SERVICES.

LONDON, December 12.  
Our aircraft have again scored considerable success, and a raid into Germany yielded good results.

**St. Dunlop's Hoag succeeds:**

**BRITAIN AND PEACE**

**Enemy's Communications**  
GERMAN ENDEAVOURS MEET WITH FAILURE  
(THANSON BROTHERS' AERONAUT.)

LONDON, December 12.  
An important announcement regarding the enemy's endeavor to obtain a preliminary peace, was made by Mr. Balfour in the House of Commons today.

The Secretary for Foreign Affairs stated that, in September last, the Government received from Germany a communication, which was sent through a neutral diplomatic channel, to the effect that Germany would be glad to make a communication to the British Government regarding peace.

**BRITAIN'S REPLY.**  
The Government replied that they were prepared to receive any communication Germany desired to make to them, and discuss it with the Government of the Allies.

The Government also informed France, Italy, Japan, Russia and the United States of the German suggestion and of their reply.

No answer to Britain's communication had been received, and no other official communication received.

**ARTILLERY ACTIVITY**  
Comparative Calm Along the French Front

LONDON, December 12.  
There is a lull on the French sector of the Western Front, both sides being content to operate only with their guns.

A French communiqué states:  
"There has been moderate reciprocal artillery activity along the greater part of the front."

**BRILLIANT NAVAL AFFAIR**  
Italian Lighter Sink Enemy Battleship

LONDON, December 12.  
An exceedingly brilliant victory has been scored by the Italian light naval force.

An official Italian communiqué says:  
"Our light craft on Sunday night, after penetrating the defenses both by sea and by land, entered Trieste and discharged four torpedoes against two warships of the 'Sennar' class."

"Our vessels returned safely, despite the many torpedoes fired by the enemy, and the Italian fleet."

**WOLFFE CASE**

**Appeal Dismissed.**  
INTERESTING SMUGGLING EPISODE RECALLED.

[From Our Own Correspondent.]  
MOMBASA, December 12.  
A considerable amount of interest was attracted throughout the Protectorate, during June this year in what was commonly known as the "Wolffe Case."  
In this case David Wolffe, of Nairobi, was charged in His Majesty's High Court, Mombasa, on Monday, June 26, under the Customs Laws, with smuggling opium.

The charge was as follows:—  
(1) That he did at Mombasa on April 21, 1917, make and subscribe a false declaration on a document purporting to be a true declaration of the contents of his personal baggage, the same being false and untrue, contrary to section 118 of the Customs Ordinance, 1912, whereby he had forfeited the sum of Rs. 1,000.  
(2) That he was at Mombasa, on April 21, knowingly concerned in evading duties of Customs upon or dealing with certain goods with intent to defraud His Majesty's Government of the duties of Customs in respect thereof contrary to section 119 of the Customs Ordinance, 1912, whereby he had forfeited the sum of Rs. 20,000, being the value of the goods for which he had been charged with evading duties.

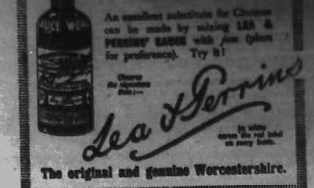
**JEWELRY OF GREAT PRICE.**  
Among the goods mentioned, there were diamonds of various sizes, ruby, sapphire, emerald, and gemstones of the highest quality, also pearls, bracelets of all shapes and sizes, and Indian jewelry valued at Rs. 10,000.  
The case was adjourned from June until August, August 25, and was concluded on August 27, the jury, after an absence of five minutes, returning a verdict of guilty on the two counts. Judge Hamilton thereupon passed sentence of a fine of Rs. 1,000 on the first count and of Rs. 20,000 on the second, making a total of Rs. 21,000. David Wolffe appealed against the sentence, and the case was heard this week, when Judge Hamilton's verdict was upheld.

**BURGLARY IN NAIROBI**

Thieves Secure £100 Worth of Goods.  
Nairobi was the scene of a daring, if not a sensational, burglary on Friday night. The thieves obtained £100 worth of goods from the Government Road in Nairobi to gold and jewelry. The means by which they obtained admission to the premises was by climbing the large pipe which carries water to the street with a stone. The thieves had secured the premises, carrying with them, rings, etc., the property valued at about £100.  
The Police have the matter well in hand, and are in the search of the thieves, and will be able to catch them, as going to prove, they already stated of the steps which have been taken.

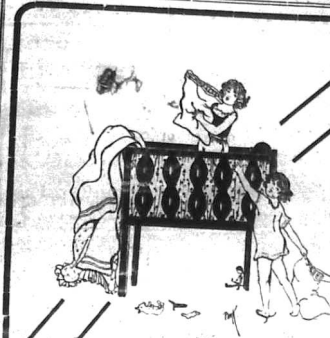

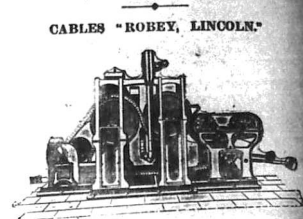

Two legal men were amongst the candidates offering themselves for election, and both were defeated, which in some respects, is a pity, as a legal mind would have been very useful to the Committee when engaged in the task of framing various rules and regulations. We are hopeful, however, that the cooperation with his new fellow-Committee men, will be able to do yet more good work on behalf of the City of the Capital. 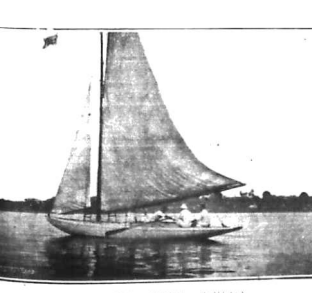

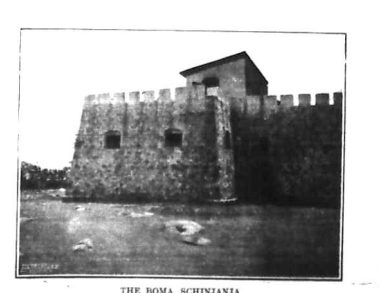

ELDORET, December 10.  
Our District Commissioner must undoubtedly deem himself a particularly fortunate mortal, for he will shortly be in the proud possession of a wooden floor in his office. The P.W.D. is busy on its construction at the moment. We are getting on! A glimpse of my recent notes on the Post-Office, a final "write" "Congratulations on your strictures on the P.O., but why not a few words as to D.C.'s Office!" As a matter of fact, the wretched level requires more considerable repairs than I can call to mind at the moment, so the subject must stand over until I have sufficient leisure to dip into my dictionary. I have seen better offices!

It surprises me that it has never occurred to any dignitary to raise a dust storm during a trial. If he did not succeed in checking the utterances of his rival, it would at least, surely, have the effect of clouding the judge and of the magistrate. A shuffling of the feet, and the trick is done. In normal times officials get six months leave after every two and a half years service, and if this is not necessary by reason of climatic conditions, it is certainly deserved by them, by reason of the state in which they are housed and officed.

**ARCHDEACON CHADWICK**

**Meeting at Estabbe Regarding Proposed Memorial**

[From a Correspondent.]

In connection with the proposed memorial to the late Archdeacon Chadwick, a public meeting was held at Estabbe, Uganda on Friday, December 7, in the High Court (kindly loaned for the purpose by the Acting Chief Justice, D. Kingston Esq.), to discuss the possibility of erecting a memorial to the late Archdeacon Chadwick, who, for more than seven years, was chaplain at Estabbe.

The chaplain (Rev. J. E. M. Hannington), was in the chair. The meeting was very representative and various suggestions were discussed. Major C. A. Wiggins proposed: "That a memorial be erected in Estabbe, that it take the form of a church for St. John's Church, and that—subscriptions for the same be invited for this purpose." He stated that the motion was seconded by Mr. F. Guthrie Smith and carried.

Mr. C. V. Egan, Director of Public Works, had kindly drawn up plans and estimated that the cost would be roughly £250.

Major Wiggins said that there was Rs. 1,000 on deposit in the bank and this was earmarked for the building of a church, being proceeds of a bazaar, held in April last, and that there was another Rs. 1,000 in general fund, which had been saved for the same purpose and which could be voted at the next vestry meeting so that they now required about £130 to £150. If this could be collected (and he felt sure it could), for the purpose of a memorial to Archdeacon Chadwick, they could get the church at once. A suitable brass plate could be erected in the church.

A committee was then formed to appeal for funds etc., consisting of the Chaplain (Rev. J. E. M. Hannington), and the Church-warden (Major M. C. Wiggins) and Mr. C. I. Bruton) ex-officio, and Messrs. B. C. Allen, C.M.G., and C. V. Egan, with power to co-opt two other members. Subscriptions to the above object will be gladly received and acknowledged by the Chaplain or either of the Church-Wardens, Estabbe.

We have received from the Secretariat, a copy of Parliamentary Paper, Miscellaneous No. 13 (1917), on the subject of "Treatment by the German of British Prisoners and Natives in German East Africa." Most of the subject matter appeared in the "East African Standard" some time back.

CHRISTMAS IN INDIA

Symptoms of Man's Universal Discontent

(By MARGARET PETERSON.)

(Special to the "E. A. Standard.") "For, in 'twain and forced laughter," and if ademas follow after.

We are rather by some mocking Christmas jags. Kipling wrote that about Christmas in India. I don't know why, but must have been feeling very pessimistic. For Kipling, as a rule, feels the magic, has his eyes held, by the glamour of the East. He does not stop to put India in her, he "thinks the East a calling" in his dreams. But one Christmas he must have had a rather time. Perhaps he was ill or in debt or something. For those are the times when we feel really homesick. That is to say, not for any place except the one we happen to be in. A pessimist, by the way, is a man who chews his quinine pill instead of swallowing it. Anyway, my recollections of Christmas in India are of cheery times. True, there is no snow on the ground, no little robin red breast of Christmas card fame; no kids from the neighbouring village to send cards outside your bedroom window, but though your domestic cannot sing cards for you they do their very best to remind you that the Sabbath begins one great Burns Deen has dawned.

It is a day, for instance, when without danger of being considered impertinent they may respectfully point out to the adults that a little hushaboo will not come again. Big Daps in the native villages are always celebrated by the giving of gifts to the poor. Therefore, on Christmas morning do not you emerge on to your verandah for your early tea, it is to be greeted by a long train of domestic slaves, arrayed in festive attire, eagerly smiling and "obsequious," while they levade upon your head all the blessings of the season.

GIFTS FROM THE STAFF.

There is your cook, arrayed for the moment in spotless linen, though his usual working garb is a rusty and worn tea class rag. In his hands he holds a marvellous concoction in the way of a cake. He is radiantly decorated with pink, green, and red string. He has used your most expensive dessert in the way of crystallized cherries and violets to add to his decorations. It has not occurred to him that in using all your materials and his own time, for which you pay, he is the younger member of the family, who is worth the any "Mummy, will you give me a shilling to buy you a present with." He is radiantly proud of his work, and the other servants are visibly a little jealous. The better stands out, still in will starved parquets. He is in charge of all the other domestics and rather important in comparison. Also, he tries to extract some show in the honor of the cake. He takes it from the cook and presents it to you. Doubtless he was the hand to dole out the cherries and violets and this is his reward.

Next in order come the harem, with probably two assistants rolled together for the occasion. The harem and his satellites perform the duties of hushaboo in India. They dust and clean, and are always to be seen very much in evidence with a peculiar dirty duster. Should it be clean they are almost you would probably accuse them of sin and being of the same religion as yourself having worked. The table boy is a mild mannered Gout, and being of the same religion as yourself has purchased a Christmas card for you, a fact which is viewed with some disfavor by the other servants.

Next in order to the harem come the cook boy, the youth who accompanies the cook to market in the mornings, and who can be seen returning heavily laden, a basket on his head and a couple of five fowls hanging head downwards in his hands. Next to him stands the hushaboo, the gentleman with a mustache about the garden in the morning with a great pail of water slung to his back, retreating the weary warth. He is a friend of the gardener and is therefore able to present you with a tight little bouquet of flowers, rosebuds and pansies.

The gardener's own gift is a magnificent bouquet. A brilliant margaret in the center, fringed by flaming gold-bone flowers, with an outer circle of geranium.

WHERE THE HEART IS

Even the horses have to be present at the winter of honor. Their hooves have been polished with my best best polish, I believe it is; their coats have been made to shine, their tails have been plaited with precision, garlands bedeck them, in each foot a flower has been twisted.

So Christmas Day opens in India; a radiant, untroubled sky, dust that shines like a certain silver with precision, garlands bedeck them, in each foot a flower has been twisted.

"Home is where the heart is, where are that shrine may be." We carry our Christmas with us, just in case we should be in India or Africa instead of England. And, indeed, I think homesickness is generally speaking only a symptom of man's universal discontent.

"When his hat he wants it cold; When his coat he wants it hot; Always wanting what is not."

To be homesick for England when one is in the East carries no worse pang with it than to "Hear the East a calling" when one is in England. Grey skies perpetually, make you shiver the hot, vivid sunbakes; cold and rain, make you long for the blissing warmth of an Indian day. And very often at home, sitting in some stately lodging house doing some, I have longed for the sound of bare native feet on chrome matting and the flap flap of a punkah.

That is the way of the world, always with a little discontent to push one going. A man's truck must exceed his grasp or what's a lawyer for? But I feel that Kipling rather wronged India by that "twain and forced laughter" touch.

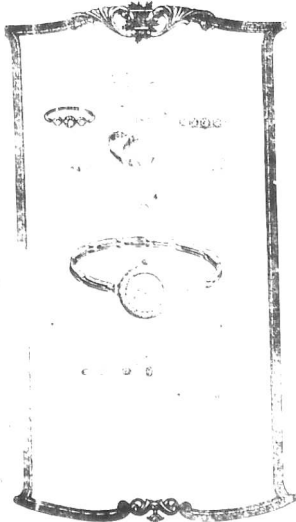
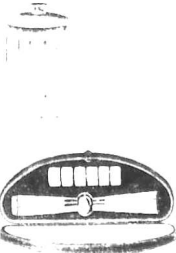
