THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

Suggestions for the Future.

The chief tonic in the current number of "The Nineteenth Century" is the birth of the British Empire. Mr. H. G. Wells, in his article on the subject, advises (not legislative) Parliament to be called the Imperial Assembly, which would include the Imperial Executive and the Imperial Legislative and the parliaments of the United Kingdom, the Dominions, and the self-governing colonies. The British Parliament must be given the right to make laws, and among the great reform measures proposed by Mr. Wells are the reorganization of Mother Country and Domions, some consequences on the part of the Empire. Mr. Henry Wilson, Fox, M.P., takes "The Empire" and the New Production Committee as his field of endeavour. He believes that the Empire will be able to excel in all forms of production, and wealth in the Empire must be directed to the production of food, and increase the amount that shall be used and increase the amount that shall be managed by the British Empire.

Writing in the *London Daily Mail*, Sir Harry Johnston drew attention to the great part that machinery will play in the development of Africa. He thinks we might take up some of those topics never before discussed (in Norway, curiously enough) such as the hydroelectric power of the Zambezi Falls, or the Lower Shire, and similarly falls at intervals along the course of the River Nile which supply power that would light up all the great river towns in Southern Nyasaland, Portuguese West Africa, and the northern part of South Africa. We might, by increasing the use of better tools, quickly improve the cotton and sugar grown in countries like Rhodesia and British Central Africa (Northern Rhodesia and Nyasaland). Machinery also is wanted there to help the dry season. When we have got a sufficient supply of cotton and sugar, we may well think that we shall want more railways in Nyasaland, and the means of working and using the coal and iron found there and in Lake Nyasa. The engineering requirements of Rhodesia, Zimbabwe, Bechuanaland, Southern Oceania are limitless. Truly I could not better impress that on my readers!
