#### LABOUR QUESTION.

We the Kenyan "East African Standard." Sir—In your daily issue of Tuesday last, dealing with the question of my Government's policy towards the Economic Commission, you take me to task for approving the suggestion of Mr. J. S. H. Morris that nothing was further from my thoughts than making any such suggestion. Not only do I deny the charge, but I would assure you in the eyes of the British nation at large, that the methods of forced labour are inherently wrong, and reactionary results are likely to follow from any proposal to introduce them. In my evidence I said that I entirely disclaimed supporting of forced labour, which statement you will find slightly altered in your report.

The point which you raise, whether there should be some place in our dealing with the question of natives as that the influence of white men on the natives is very great, especially in the rural state, is a force which is not fully realized. It is a force which is not only responsible for the splitting up of the tribe, but also for the deterioration of the native. The means whereby a native becomes a slave are many and varied. One may appeal to his military needs—his desire for better food, his desire for a better home, his desire to add to his natural dignity and love of position.

Or one may appeal to his desire for money. When he comes into contact with the drawing of an awakening intelligence, the result is that he becomes a slave. He finds that a man is somewhat higher than a brute beast. To all these the native responds, and it is this that has led him to-day he is actually responding in thousands to the highest call of his nature upon him. The native officials and set-tatives throughout the country. Innumerable instances could be given where beneficial results were often experienced in the small details of life that have come to the notice. What about the native names and the part of the general question of education? As a point I have inferred already, to my knowledge, seems to be that their fitness to the inheritance of their native charges, with the result that there is a

decrease in crime, more peaceful districts and greater interest in the Native Affairs Department world. I am convinced that the time will come when the people of this country that its economic future would be severely hit.
