The Water Supply in Nairobi.

If there is a great lack of foresight on the part of the authorities responsible, that only a small man was laid from the Kikuyu camp at Nairobi to supply the needs of water. There is ample water for the needs of a city as large as Johannesburg, and although nearly 4 years have elapsed since a further extension of the water supply was approved by the Government within the Municipal area, the authorities have apparently taken no trouble to meet the need of the town for water. We hear that although several plot holders have applied in the last three years to have the water laid on, their demands have met with no response, though influential people who applied afterwards have been successful.

LOCAL SPORT IN NAIROBI

There has been in the past an almost complete cessation of cricket intervals in the history of Sport in Nairobi but none of these has lasted so long or been so complete as that existing now, and which dates from the beginning of December. The absence of a number of K. A. R. Officers on the Riviera Expedition is, of course, to some extent responsible for this period of inactivity, and the executive head experienced in Nairobi during the past five weeks or so has paralysed even the most enthusiastic among the local sportsmen. Cricket has made some kind of a show but even this lacks energy and there appears little hope that any matches of interest will take place before the rains set in.

There is an opinion among the best known and most regular upholders of Sport here that the time has arrived for some attempt to be made to form a kind of Central Board of Control to manage Sport in general and there is an almost universal opinion that definite seasons should be set apart for the different games during which our fixtures could be arranged. It is, of course, possible to pay Association football and hockey all the year round but Cricket and Rugby football must of necessity leave their own special seasonal periods.

If a selection of this kind could be engineered there would undoubtedly be a greater interest taken by both players and public in all branches of Sport, and there would be great satisfaction in the knowledge that the various sports which are so popular and exciting such as would serve to maintain and encourage the existence of the most healthy and cleanly spirit possible in Amateur Sport and would be a guarantee against the intrusion of any attempt at professionalism such as is so rife in the old country. Nairobi has one great need, and that is for a roomy central sports ground, say in the proposed Public Park, at the present moment the only cricket ground is the only decent ground in the town and Parklands Sports Club Ground, though capable of great things, will never be a central field. The few few of a most deserving Club are greatly handicapped for lack of a ground in which to be hoped that some provision, such as suggested above, will be made.

PURE RUBBER.

TO THE EDITOR OF "THE EAST AFRICAN STANDARD."
 Sir—Rubber Planters in the Protectorate may become somewhat alarmed by reports of the manufacture of artificial rubber and in view of this and the great interest now being taken in rubber planting in this country the following extract from the Imperial Department of Agriculture, West Indies, dated December 29th last should prove reassuring.

"The possibility of artificial or Synthetic rubber being put on a competitive market with the natural product is mentioned in a statement coming from a London-based authority and published in the West India Committee Circular of November 12th. It is pointed out that only a few specimens of artificial rubber have been prepared, and that the specimens taken three years ago and cost 200 times the price of the natural article. Professor Tilden told us does not believe in the commercial manufacture of rubber nor did the late Mr. Webber, who spent thirty-five years in research in this direction."

A Coffee Planter at the Kilimanjaro has realized sixteen thousand rupees this season for the sale of berries and hopes next year to realize thirty thousand.

THE Kings African Rifles returned to Nairobi on the 11th instant looking very fit after the campaign. A few officers and one company of men are still in the Kisi country.

MESSRS Newland Tarlton & Co. are opening a branch office at Nakuru, where Mr. E. A. Webb Morris will look after their interests. We understand that they propose erecting stock yards and conducting a business of the same description as they at present carry at Nairobi.

WHILE watching some river sports recently a crowd of some 40 to 50 Hindus collected on a staging which being swept precipitated them into the water. The current being very swift several were drowned and most of them had very narrow escapes. The friends of one man after vainly trying all the resources of the "Hindoo" religion, at last dug a hole in the ground and placed a charcoal fire therein. They then laid the unfortunate patient over the hole. He came to shortly afterwards.

THERE has been a good deal of work on foot since some of which has been openly shown, among the Mohamedan Indians engaged on the Railway. On Thursday last a food granary across country to the Railway authorities not treating the Muharram as a holiday. We support the Railway authorities as we are one of the opinion the Indian Moha. are very little inclined to trade on his numerous religious holidays.

FARMERS deserve the sympathy of the community at present as owing to the failure of the rains the crops are likely to be ruined. The natives are feeling the drought too, as is shown by the fact that they are buying food. A record sale, was made the other day when a settler disposed of one hundred loads of maize at the rate of five rupees per load. It is said wind that blow no one any good.

WE have been reading in a Fort-... guess East African contains plenty of the speech made by His Excellency, the Governor-General of Portuguese East Africa at the recent opening of the local Parliament and noted the manner in which he dealt with the ever present Native Question. His Excellency said—

"It must not be thought from what I have just said that I am an enemy of the natives; I consider that the religious and all other values of the native are of great importance."

WHY GOOD BOWLERS ARE SCARCE IN ENGLAND.

A Chat with Mr. F. R. Nopforth.

To the majority of boys taking in school cricket more attractive than bowling and hence it is to be found one reason for the dearth of first class amateur bowlers in England. Then again at the public schools the courses of amateur cricket the cricketers masters and the professionals rarely pay the same attention at least in the case of juniors to the boy who has some natural aptitude for bowling and hence encounter in their ranks a few who give promise of developing into a great batsman. For the latter everything is done to foster and develop his natural talent, but the former, as often as not, is left to work out his own bowling salvation, and under such conditions the schoolboy bowler has to face, and hence, to my mind, the real cause of the paucity of good amateur bowlers. The schoolboy bowler has to plumb pitches, which afford him absolutely no assistance, and against boys, many of whom are hereditary batsmen, and who have been carefully coached and trained to meet an attack far superior to his own. It is not surprising then, that the young bowler meets with little or no success, gets disheartened and disgusted, and either gives up the ball for the back, or, if he had no aptitude with the latter, "checks" altogether.

Certainly, no far as my own bowling career is concerned, I am positive that whatever success I made was mainly due to the first instance to the fact that when I started bowling as a boy in Australia, I did so on pitches on which even a first class batsman might have found some difficulty in keeping the average intact. I got some practice, but what was far more important at that time, although I may not have realized it, I gained absolute confidence in my ability to "tom" people out, and when it came to bowling on true wickets, this confidence proved and strengthened me to overcome fresh difficulties that presented themselves. But, as a rule, the English public school boy bowler has to attempt a task beyond his powers, and it is the unduly favored batsman who gets the unsavory favor of confidence at the unfortunate bowler's expense. Taken on the other hand, professional bowlers in their general capacity are not so much dismayed by the fact that they bowl for a living. They do not, and the professional will practice more assiduously and take his work more seriously than the average amateur bowler is inclined to do. But the real reason of their ascendancy in my opinion, is the confidence they gained as boys from bowling on wickets which, at least put them on an equality with the batsman.—Ogilvy Times

BRIDGE. DOUBLING A HEART CALL.

The following question was put to me by a reader:—Would a bridge player under any circumstances be justified in doubling his opponent's heart call if he was "chance"? If yes, under what circumstances? Now this is a question which has very likely occurred to many readers as one of the potential problems of the game, though perhaps they have never in their actual experience met with a hand which tempted them to adopt such a course. It certainly requires a good deal of hardihood to double an expensive suit like hearts when you hold a trump because experiments of this kind are not to be made lightly. Never is a very extreme word and bridge a game in which exceptional cases are not often met. It is not to be taken for granted that a player who has not observed the rules and contracts of the game, of course it would be the maddest of mad pranks to double either hearts or diamonds and risk having their doubled, with out a trump in one's hand but it is nevertheless possible to conceive occasions when one might be justified in doing so. For instance the dealer or his partner made hearts with the score at 24 to love in his favor and the leader held the trump major that is to say king, queen of each plain suit might be worth his while to double with no trump at all, on the chance that his partner, though not himself strong enough to double, could give some assistance on trumps. With such a hand as this—which, however, is one which one would not pick up at a twelve-month—the writer thinks that he would very likely make a dash for game at the score of 24 to love in his favor, so unless he had a rather indignant partner, for doubling without a trump is, of course, very unorthodox.

sources of infection of contagion should be guarded against; Quarantine Regulations introduced; sick animals isolated; hardship enforced upon the one for the protection of the many, and severe punishment meted out to all audacious who tried to hide an outbreak of infectious or contagious diseases among their herds or flocks.

As it is also recognized that it is the duty of the Government to take such vigorous measures for protecting the good health of our domestic stock, and that it is more than the duty of our Government to adopt equally vigorous measures for the protection of human good health, it is not surprising we have allowed Leprosy to spread unchecked in our midst.

It may be argued that Leprosy could be traced to certain areas and does not need drastic measures, but this species of argument falls away to a mockery when we consider that any other human diseases are being allowed to spread unchecked among us.

The greatest human scourge in East Africa is not Leprosy, Plague or Sleeping Sickness but an older disease and one more insidious and deadly in its dissemination and infection, namely—the Venereal. There are many persons in the old country who attempt to hide from themselves the fact that they are suffering from any great extent or decline in sexual existence or the same place as the other human plagues, but we in East Africa would be wiser if we adopted the attitude that we know on Medical authority that no other of our known diseases can be so readily contracted and so easily cured.
