Squabbles Among the Native Boys

SILENCE

(By Margaret Peterson)

"There is a sound of misery by night." As the poet says. Let us investigate it, or rather picture it in words as we see it, by peeping through the bathroom door. First, there is a stretch of magnificent moonlight, moonlight, such as the home dwellers in England never see. It clothes the world in silver, it turns the drabdest scenery into a marvellous picture of black and white. The garden is very beautiful under it, the trees stand like giant sentinels against a sky of deepest purple alive with shining stars. Just across the strip of path are the servants' houses, one with its door open, so that I can see plainly the fantastic group gathered round the kitchen fire! This is the revelry then, the servants are partaking of their real meal; throughout the day they can be seen chowing odd fragments, but in the day they assemble together and partake of their one cooked meal in the day. And the group, outlined as it is by the dancing flames, with that stretch of tropic moonlight in front of it, might well be taken for an assembly of cannibal eaters, partaking of a lately captured foe.

The other night there was a painful scene. Into my peaceful drawing room burst an agitated boy, evidently on the border line of tears, followed by an irate cook, bearing a saucepan heavily laden with bits. "Bitoko koda, I have always thought, singularly unappetizing, it is, however, as much a proverbial meal of this country as roast beef is of England."

"What is the matter?" I ask with a certain amount of patience, being new to the country and its ways.

"The cook is bad," staves my boy, his dignified face contorted in its effort not to shed tears. "He has taken my food and thrown it about the kitchen floor."

That is what I have always suspected the cook of doing with the food which passes through his hands. I eye him severely, and he breaks at once into indignant sobs.

Is it Right?

Is it right for a boy to cook his food in the absence of the Master? Is it what the Mukhya wishes the boys to do? He has been cook for a great many years and never has he known a Mukhya who liked the boys to cook their food in the absence of the Master.

As he speaks he waves the saucepan about to give emphasis to his remarks, scattering chunks of bitoko on my so-called drawing room carpet.

I look at Yohana. "Certainly, it is not right to use the saucepan," he agrees. "But the cook himself has always done it until to-night. It is because he does not like me, since I told of how he stole the eggs, that he threw all my food on the floor. I cannot eat my food from off the floor."

"Not all your food," I suggest. A great portion of it is scattered on the drawing-room floor. "Pick up the bits," I command, "and go away, both of you. Tomorrow, I will think."

That is my usual method of settling squabbles. And for the rest, my snuopans sit in a dock row in the pantry now when the day's cooking is done, and a very old, large saucepan has been allotted to the cooking of bitoko and such like mysteries.

The Cook Feinds

I can see it in me at the moment. The cook proceeds; there is peace between him and the head boy again, commented by the fact that Yohana is allowing the cook to wear a rather serious look of his own. These troubles are forgotten over the evening meal. As a rule, I am bound to admit, that the cook has a good deal to contend with.

"Can I, Mukhya," he asks, with indignation in his voice, "make a cake with this?"

This consists of a small teaspoon of butter. Uncle Yohana at a glance the change of the butter, he has on-

lively his own ideas as to how long a pound ought to last.

"There will be none for the Master's bread," he says to me fiercely, on the occasions when I try and side with the cook.

The freight glimmers and plays on the various members of the group. Seated, grumpy like, on the brick fireplace, his toes almost poking the cooking bitoko, is Maritini. Maritini, otherwise pantry boy, and golf caddy, and, notoriously, the greedy member of the family. If ever I ask after the fate of a specially designed pudding, with a view to future consumption, it is to hear that Maritini has eaten it on its way out from the pantry. He is always hungry, and his figure, outlined with a certain plumpness, bears witness to the fact that hunger does not always go unsatisfied.

He has, in addition, the very ugliest face I have ever seen. Ugly and grumpy like, but, I have always thought until quite recently, at least good natured.

The other day Yohana brought me a formidable looking hunting knife.

"Will you look it away in the store, Mukhya," he said.

"Why," I asked, slightly astonished.

"It is Maritini's, and Maritini has said that in the night he will bit Nimeranyaga with it and so cause him to die."

Nimeranyaga is the other Toto, slim and rather aggressively excited.

"Where are they?" I ask.

The Game.

A fearful Nimeranyaga arrives, followed by, the for once in a way aggressive, Maritini. The grumpy

wears his cap at a fierce angle, his face even displays temper. They share a room, it seems, and Nimeranyaga has purchased a knife, but he has not threatened to kill Maritini he has only jeered at him because he is fat.

The grumpy looks peaceful enough to-night. His black face glitters, his eyes glint on the bitoko—and the graceful Nimeranyaga is leaning against him most affectionately.

No party would be complete without the ayah. She is evidently somewhat of a wit, and I gather that she is credited with a certain superior knowledge of our doings. I have seen her mimicking me once or twice; she does it very well. She occupied, therefore, a seat of honour. A wooden packing case in the centre of the group. Her back is towards me, but I can make out the definite carriage of her slim hand and bare shoulders; the light drapery of vivid juico colour that she wears round her body.

The sound of their voices comes across the moonlight to me. "Gentle"—"Bitoko"—"the doings of the Mukhya"—and then back again to "Gentle." Money rules the world here as elsewhere; money through the power of the stomachs. But they will be off to bed soon, they are early birds these people, and my kitchen will become the home of a few sheep. Today night with loving care and despite my many remonstrances, these cook sheepheads use flock into them—they are one day to be good and on such they are very valuable to the cook.

And since will sleep down on the moonlight, the silence of an African night with no trains or buses or bells, or policeman's feet to break into its emptiness.

KILIMAFEZA

Official Statement by Directorate

PRODUCING STATE

With regard to the photographs appearing in our weekly, of the first output of gold from the Kilimafeza Gold Mines, it has been thought desirable by the Directorate to give shareholders and the public a short resume, through the press, of the Company's history, with a view to acquainting them with the difficulties which have been experienced before reaching the producing stage, and the result of several milling operations now happily in progress.

The Company was registered in June, 1914, and the manager and staff proceeded to the Mine in July to prepare for the installation of the reduction plant, and to press forward further development work, but the manager and his staff were G.E.A. in consequence of the outbreak of war. The plant arrived at Mombasa in the month of August, 1914, where it was stored until September, 1917, when permission was granted by the Administration to re-start operations.

In the intervening period the military authorities had requisitioned for war purposes, one of the Company's boilers, which it has not been possible to replace, and this loss has seriously handicapped crushing operations and has added materially to the cost of production of 6 dwts per ton. In other words the company has made a profit as the mine of 16 dwts or 23-96 per ton of ore milled. This return and the reports received by the Board on the development of the mine have confirmed them in their most sanguine expectations, and they look forward with confidence to the Company's future.

Failure of Rains

Owing to the loss of one of the boilers before referred to it was only possible to put into commission one of the Company's Treman Mills, the running of which has been very irregular on account of the shortage of water owing to the failure of the customary rains. Ordinarily at this time of the year the Ombaji River—which flows past the Company's holdings—is a roaring torrent, but the rainfall during this season has been insufficient to meet the mills requirements, which has rendered continuous milling impracticable. Three weirs have, however, been thrown across the river capable of conserving 5,000,000 gallons of water, and the management anticipate no further troubles in this respect after the fall of the water under other several boilers, and have made arrangements to complete their cyanide plant, and it is confidently expected that the entire plant will be running at full strength well before the end of the current year.

The gold shown in the photograph is the result of 38 days intermittent crushing by the reduced plant, and represents in the aggregate one month's run of 20 working days. The gold won is of the value approximately of Rs. 18,000, and has been extracted from 259 tons of ore; the recovery over the whole being 23 dwts, at a cost of production of 6 dwts per ton. In other words the company has made a profit as the mine of 16 dwts or 23-96 per ton of ore milled. WAR WOMEN

Well-known Novelist's View SECRET KEPT

Since the beginning of the war women have proved pretty conclusively that there are comparatively few men's jobs they cannot master, writes Edwin Pugh, the well-known novelist, in the London "Daily Mail."

On the land, on the railways, in the workshops, and the vehicular traffic of the crowded streets—in a hundred new, unaccustomed occupations, alike exacting and demanding, that only a little while ago, seemed to require all a man's strength and skill and nerve.

But perhaps what most amazes business and professional men is that they should have "made good" as clerks.

Before the war there was considerable prejudice among business and professional men against the idea of women acting as clerks. They were never employed in the solicitor's offices, or (I think) in the offices of insurance companies. And doubtless there were many other offices from which they were rigorously excluded. They were cheaper than men clerks, and it had never been demonstrably proved that they were less efficient. No; the objection to them was that they were not so trustworthy as men, that most of them could not be relied on to keep a secret, and that therefore it was unwise to allow them the least insight into the details of private and confidential transactions.

A Mistake Impression

Speaking at first hand, from my own eight years' experience of a solicitor's office, I can say without any paltering that it was thought wisely about our clerical affairs. We imagined them as discussing with their friends and neighbours, and especially the members of their own family, all manner of family scandals and other delicate matters.

that we men were in honour bound to say nothing about.

For it is a mistake to suppose, when you have breathed your innumerable soul into a solicitor's car, that what you have told him goes no farther. It goes no farther than the outer walls of his office. But no solicitor could ever carry on his business properly who tried to withhold his clients' secrets from the knowledge of his clerks, even if it were possible for him to do so. And what is true of a solicitor's office is more or less true of every other office.

If solicitors and other clerks told only a tithe of all they know about what is hidden not only from the public, but also from intimate connections of the parties concerned, the whole fabric of society would totter to its fall. And I have never heard or known of any clerk betraying his trust in his integrity. It is a tradition among clerks as sacred as the "Kiss-and-never-tell" tradition of every true man.

But when women are hired or set other things—then they do tell.

An Old Gibe Exploded

Would they be any more reliable about business affairs than they are about love affairs? It was generally assumed that they were not, and as they were never permitted to enter the office of any business or professional man to whom the most intimate self-revelations and inviolable confidences were the mere commonplace of his everyday routine.

And now they are everywhere. There are very few offices, large or small, in which you will not at least one woman clerk taking the place of a former man. They are the repository of all kinds of momentous secrets, and their male predecessors were the betrayers of faith, branches of filence. There have been only a few scandals and exposures. There have been cases of mail and bribery. But in none of these cases has the name of a woman clerk appeared.
