ITALY'S SHARE.

Assisting Allies in France

UNTAINTED WARFARE

(By W. H. Buttress.)
 not without interest to try a sketch of the general of the ground upon which the Italians are staying the persistent attacks of the Austrians, if they proved successful, heavily menace our Western offensive. The general probably finds it difficult to land what is being done by the Italians to assist our forces on the eastern front. Their conditions for deploying their troops, in view of the nature of the country, a marvel to most people.

part of the country. Over the Alps the Italians are driving back the Austrians. The mountains may be described as a country torn and channelled by scabrous rivers, deep ravines, and treacherous mountain paths. The background there are the mountains whose shadow is cast upon the plains. It is perhaps no place on earth where the immense irregular crests of the high peaked mountains which envelop the country of the Alps. Imagine your standing on the edge of the Italian Plains on a perfect morning, an Italian summer day, and looking around you gaze upon a landscape more than one-third of the Italian front, which can be seen as a snake amongst the mountains stretching from near the Swiss frontier to the Adriatic. The extent of the Italian front is close on 450 miles, which is far short of the length of the trench works of Belgium and France.

Natural Barriers

The Italian Army have to guard the front, but in some places it is necessary to post sentries as there are innumerable natural barriers which are impassable even by well trained Alpine troops. Obstacles with which the Italian Army have to contend are insurmountable. The Austrians, on the other hand, have a slight advantage, in that they are fighting their way down the Alps, while the Italians have to fight their way up the high and glassy-sided mountains. One of the greatest achievements in strategy and military engineering is the method adopted by the Italians for bringing up guns, ammunition and food; also a marvellous system they have evolved of evacuating their wounded from the mountains with carnivorous animals waiting to swallow up any unfortunate soldier should any mishap occur in his journey from the mountain tops to the green plains below. The Austrians, who have the advantage over the Italians, cannot, however, force their way across the fertile fields to the cities of the Plains.

Unity the Strength

The recent move by the Italians gave the Allied forces in France the opportunity to strike, and they have done so. Italy has sent troops to France, and we have sent troops to Italy. Unity in times like these means strength. The people of Italy have been spared the ravages of France, Belgium, Serbia, and they are fighting their utmost so that such a thing will not overcome them. Indications point to the fact that Austria spent all his man power, and we may feel assured that the war of Italy is still effectively ended.

These facts form some enlightenment as to the meaning of the offensive in France. The Italians are pressing the Austrians out of Austria, and Austria cannot send her troops to Germany, neither can Germany send help to Austria. Therefore the attacks which the Italians are making are daily increasing our advantage over the Germans in France. With the help of the Italian Army in France, we can afford to send troops to places like Salonika, and also spare more men for the Salonika front. Italy has done its part in still doing her part in the present tactics, and is helping our present offensive in France, and to future movements should be fully watched.

WEAR OF BIG GUNS.

Influence on Cost of the War

The wear of large guns has a most important influence on the cost of the war, not only on account of the expense of effecting repairs, but because such wear leads to inaccuracy of fire, and so increases the amount of ammunition expended to attain a definite objective, writes Major T. G. Tulloch, in "Arms, and Explosives." In short, if a few thousandths of an inch of steel at the commencement of the rifling of guns, etc., could be prevented from wearing away in so short a time as at present, the reduction in the cost of the war, so far as guns, ammunition, transport, etc., are concerned, is almost incalculable.

Major Tulloch differentiates between the damage to the bore near the breach end—damage for which he retains the usual term "corrosion"—and that near the muzzle, which he prefers to call "erosion," as it is a purely mechanical effect. The causes which produce the first-named class of damage are

complex, and include the effects of temperature, the form and dimensions of the powder chamber, the chemical and physical qualities of the powder used, the weight of charge and rapidity of fire, the gas, escape past the projectile, and the composition and physical properties of the steel used for the inner tubes of the gun. As regards the physical properties of the steel used for the inner tubes, Major Tulloch considers that the heat treatment should be subject to the analysis of the steel and the forging effect, and he urges the necessity of obtaining more effective forging of the portion of the tube forming the bore, and suggests certain methods of securing this result. With regard to the erosion near the muzzle, due to frictional wear and metallic fouling, it is pointed out that to secure good shooting it is desirable to prevent such fouling by all practical means, such as slightly bell-mouthing the bore, and, as indicative of the importance of this matter, he states that by electrolytic methods over 1500 weight of copper have been removed from the bore of an 8in. gun after firing just over 100 rounds.

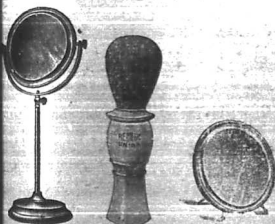

MOMBASA
A Few Caustic Comments from Coast

QUESTIONS ASKED

The following is taken from the Mombasa Times:
"Every sympathy must be entertained for the Greek hero Hercules in his twelve gigantic labours, and his cleansing of the Augean stables has become typical of administrative reform. In British East Africa we have some such a labour to be performed in clearing the edifice of Government of its accretions. There are obstructions everywhere and lumber which make it difficult to move on the rubbish heap, while in regard to the executive staff there are many soldiers who claim an urgent remedy in respect to certain officials who should be granted their pensions and told to go. In short a 'Clean Sweep' is demanded."

That the present system, or want of system fails, most people will agree, but when we come to details and enquire where and why it fails we find ourselves in a dilemma. To talk the Coast only, the public want to know two things at the outset, namely, (1) What are the reasons that certain things shall not be done, and (2) On what authority are such decisions based? We know the body, but find it not so easy to find the reasons. The public should be alerted in the scheme of Progress. By contrasting present incongruous and inadequate conditions with what we hope to see in the near future, we shall arrive at a true perspective of things.

Take the route through the island, first. Who decided that the routing of the Kilindini Road should stop at Salma Road, and that the work be diverted towards a footpath to the Kisumu Ferry, and what authority the officer or department responsible had for him to make the decision? Also, on whose authority was the gully line shifted to one side, causing small lakes in the wet weather, when a decent road with a footpath could have been laid at little extra expense? The state of the road beyond the new portion is a disgrace in all weathers, but after a fall of rain it is simply abominable, and passing traffic often sprays passers-by with showers of muddy water. How many ladies' dresses have been ruined lately from this condition of affairs?

If the approaches to the ferries are being improved, why not the

actual "glissade" down the cliff to Labani Ferry. It would be interesting to know who had the brains to construct a water chute instead of a road down to the ferry. Even in the dry weather this is a very slippery descent in the present rainy season. Cloths are expensive enough, without having one's wearing apparel soiled and spoiled unnecessarily. This and other everyday facts show there is a lack of common sense here on the Island, and in some cases on the mainland.

People are beginning to ask, too, who decided, and upon what authority, that the best part of the Island, namely the Sea-Beach, should be almost exclusively reserved for official residences? Nobody disputes the right of the official to a good house in a suitable position, but the right to a monopoly of this nature is strongly disputed. Also, who decided, and on what authority, that the sale of residential plots on the Island should be postponed for months past everybody, including Government, has known the urgent need for them. Then, again, who decided that the sale of certain property, the sale of the government sites at Kilindini should be so long delayed?

In holding up the sale of the government sites at Kilindini, the party in question, whoever he may be, has also demanded a grave responsibility, far with the most exorbitant increase of the rental charges of the Customs Department due to the great competition at the Pier, the public need is at a stage when something must be done. The public must see that there is a change made from the present state of affairs. Those Customs rental charges are another instance of what is done without reference to the public's convenience or circumstances. These charges are almost virtually a confiscation penalties, and they come at a time when money is scarce. They have caused a considerable amount of embarrassment to merchants.

The work of various Departments is easily hampered by the lack of sufficient and efficient staffs and what work is done is often done casually and with lack of system. The remedy for this state of affairs is an elected Municipal body, not advisory only, but with full powers of action. It will probably be stated that the Trustees stand in the way of this, but in our opinion this is not so, as it is a recognised principle that municipal rates are levied for services rendered, and therefore there cannot be a complaint that they are too high. The same should certainly have a say in their own affairs. They say only a small poll-tax as directed by law, but in reality we all pay the tax in a hundred ways, and it is taxation all the same.

Municipal revenue would be made up of many fees that are now paid for by the public, such as the profits made on the water supply, ferries, charity lines, etc., which, now go into the general revenue of the country, and which, we believe, amounts to more than what would be the ordinary way of known as municipal expenditure.

Warning

"Parody Parliament"

In discussing some aspects of Socialist Germany, M. Henry reminds us that the Social Democratic Party is profoundly affected by the fact that Germany is the least united country in Europe. He also underlines the further fact that the Reichstag is a "parody Parliament, the importance of which foreigners always over rate."

The Socialist Party in the Reichstag appears at first sight rather imposing. It consists of more than a hundred deputies, but many of them (and this is important to remember) are not radicals in disposition. And yet when all is said and done, wide differences do the number of Socialists in the Reichstag really make? The Parliament has no influence on the policy of the Empire. Ministerial responsibility is unknown to the Constitution. The vote if the Reichstag can never force a Minister to resign.

How little united Germany really is, is illustrated by the inter-State jealousy. Thus M. Henry tells of a Munich Socialist who was obliged to live in Prussia for a time. One evening in a cafe a talkative Berliner began to speak of Munich. He knew where Karsten came from, and jeered at the Wittenshaech. "You've got a fine king," he said alluding to the unfortunate Otto. "He's mad!" "True enough," replied Karsten; "but at least we have shut him up."

while you let yours run about in freedom." As to the business men of Germany, M. Henry declares they cannot suffer for an ideal, and are "always afraid of revolution and of policemen." Their code of commercial morality he illustrates by a story:

A certain great merchant of Berlin had brought a doubtful section against a competitor. Unable to be present at the decision, he asked his lawyer to inform him without fail of the result. The latter, proud of having won the case for his client, telegraphed triumphantly:—"The just cause has triumphed." But the merchant wired an immediate reply:—"Appeal as once."

Unattractive Women

One of the largest and most astonishing of M. Henry's chapters is that devoted to German women. In the main they are not attractive. The women of the German towns make a poor impression because they lack that grace without which even actual beauty will often pass unnoticed. Their movements are awkward and stiff.

Once married, the German girl of the middle class is finished with Sex in her is dead. Why waste time on feminine grace and a careful toilet when her future is totally settled and it is no longer necessary to attract. The insipid German girl becomes the German housewife, a kind of domestic Minister whose only duties are to populate Germany and take care of her home.

German women of higher rank are equally unattractive. Even when decked out in the richest clothes that France can provide, they remain "always foreigner." Nothing M. Henry affirms, is "more dismal than a Prussian costume on a German woman." And there is a darker shade to the picture.

These women who have plunged suddenly into luxury, those who have become easy victims to the most shameless snobbery, wallow in self-indulgences and exceed every limit in their desire to show that they see above prejudice. They know no more how to wear their dress than their clothes. Only someone who has lived in Berlin society, who has jostled all the scandals and all the baseness, can understand the moral degradation of certain of these upstart wealthy women who have been thrown too suddenly into an untripe social organization.

Everywhere the blight of Germany is traced by M. Henry to the pernicious influence of Prussia and its spirit of "verboten." He gives a delightful account of a musical ball which he organized at Munich, which was one elaborate satire on the Prussian spirit. It was entitled "Tough Darkest Germany," and the moral mottoes all enforced the moral.

Upon the walls appeared these injunctions dear to Prussian arrogance: "Keep to the right." "Head up." "Shut your mouth." "Spitting is forbidden." "Shouting is forbidden." "Walking is forbidden." "Standing is forbidden." "In fact, everything is forbidden."

Why He Love Policeman

Why He Loves them may be as many policemen in France and England as in Germany, but the German policeman is "more ubiquitous, thicker, heavier, and, as he smells of the barrack yard, he is more noticeable." It is this question of the policeman which dominated the letter from the German friend in exile, Carl von Lovetow, which M. Henry reprints as the epitome of his remarkable book. Here Lovetow writes:—

A German loves the police, being by instinct a coward. He is terrified of the Apache. He prefers to surrender all liberty in order that he may pass from one tavern to another without unpleasant encounters. The French prefer to risk an awkward encounter and not to be bothered day in and day out with a crew of policemen, who make them brank up to keep to the right.

What is it the root of all this? Here Lovetow answers at once:—"The mentality of the apocryphal 'ghosthood.' In other words, the influence of Marie Antoinette, the reformer of Marie Antoinette, the reformer of Germany. No nation can live on a tin. All the great



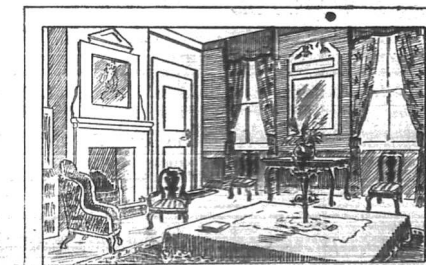

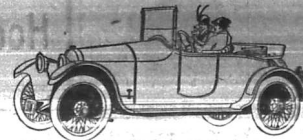
