



KING'S SPEECH. Tribute to Forces. HOPES REGARDING IRISH CONVENTION. (THORSON BARNES'S AGENT.) On Friday, we published the first portion of the text of the King's speech, delivered at the prorogation of Parliament. In this the Majesty referred to the great work which had happened since last he addressed the House, particularly referring to the entry of the United States into the war.

"TUSCANIA" SUNK. American Troops on Board. COMPARATIVELY SMALL NUMBER MISSING. (THORSON BARNES'S AGENT.) LONDON, February 15. The Admiralty announces that the "Tuscania" was torpedoed on Tuesday night off Ireland, carrying American troops. American soldiers to the amount of 2,011 were saved. One hundred and forty-one of the crew and 55 others out of a total of 2,397 were also saved, two hundred and one are missing.

HEAVY RAIDING. Increased Activity. BRITISH AND GERMANS BUSILY ENGAGED. (THORSON BARNES'S AGENT.) LONDON, February 8. An official communication from Sir Douglas Haig states that he successfully raided the east of Arras, taking prisoners. Hostile artillery was active in the regions of Cambrai and Lens. Sir Douglas Haig reports that he raided an enemy post to the southeast of Quantin, killing or capturing several of the garrison. He captured twelve prisoners from the enemy.

GERMANS BEATEN. All Attacks Fail. CONTINUOUS BOMBARDMENTS ON FRENCH FRONT. (THORSON BARNES'S AGENT.) LONDON, February 8. An official French communication says: "There was the liveliest reciprocal artillery fighting at Cambrai, Perpy, Flixin, in the region to the north of the Aisne, in the sector of Steneger and at Hill 344, on the right bank of the Meuse, and Hartmannswillerkopf."

On the other hand, Russia, distracted by internal dissensions, has not been able to devote the masses and the other allied forces to great sallies which she hoped, and for the moment, has continued to bear the brunt of the Allied attack. The negotiations which have been opened up by her with the enemy, however, prove that the ambitions which prevailed this week are not yet abandoned. These tragic events have added to the burden of the other Allies, but have not lessened the vigor and loyalty with which one and all continue to pursue their common aim. In the positions of the changing events, the determination of the demarcation line of the world to remain, the demarcation line stands out ever more clearly. In all the statures of war, the moral and military forces have displayed throughout the year noble courage, high constancy and fine determination which have won for them the admiration of the people.

AMERICA'S TRIBUTE. LONDON, February 9. It is now officially estimated that less than 150 are missing as the result of the "Tuscania" disaster. The ship was captained by Captain McLean, the skipper of the vessel, was rescued. The British Admiralty states that 2,395 were saved from the "Tuscania" which was sunk on Tuesday night. It is estimated that 120 bodies have been recovered. LONDON, February 11. 
