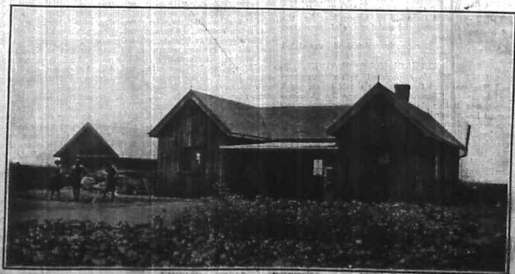

SEPARATE PEACE

Rumania's Hands Forced. GOVERNMENT DECIDES TO BEGIN NEGOTIATIONS.

(Through Reuters' Agency.)

LONDON, March 1. Rumania has now decided to enter peace negotiations.

Reuters' correspondent at Jassy, telegraphing on February 29, says it is daily intimated that in view of the reality of the facts and the situation created on the Eastern front by the Russian Government has decided to begin peace negotiations with the Central Powers, but only on the condition that the negotiations will be conducted on a basis acceptable in every respect.

Reports as to the acceptance of peace as a price are being.

Reuters' correspondent at Amsterdam states that the Rumanian Government has demanded that the King of Rumania should abdicate in favour of his brother Prince William, or should take refuge in Rumania regarding the restoration of the throne.

A German communication transmitted yesterday says that a further armistice has been agreed in order to continue peace negotiations.

According to Reuters' correspondent at Jassy, Rumania has definitely decided to enter into peace negotiations with the Central Powers.

At a sitting of the Rumanian Council of Ministers, at which King Ferdinand, it was decided to reject the offer of an armistice on March 1, that Rumania had entered into peace negotiations with the Central Powers.

This message concludes: "Negotiations will open shortly at Bucharest."

COMBINED RAIDS

Prisoners Captured. BRITISH TROOPS PENETRATE GERMAN LINES.

(Through Reuters' Agency.)

LONDON, March 1. Sir Douglas Haig, reporting on aviation, says we bombed the railway stations to the west of Lille and other targets, and brought down an enemy machine. All of our machines were successful.

In his night raid to the south of Houthulst, near Belgium to the Dommel, British troops, including the 1st and 2nd Divisions, penetrated the German lines to a depth of 1,000 yards, taking prisoners and inflicting heavy losses of casualties.

Heavy artillery fire covered the night raid, and the British troops were successful in penetrating the German lines.

A later message from the Commander-in-Chief says that we successfully raided the German lines to the north of the Ypres-Salerno Railway. There has been no further fighting in the neighbourhood of Valenciennes, eastward of Ypres.

The Portuguese took some prisoners in their operations. They have been leading a steady advance on the German lines.

PEACE IN THE EAST

Signed on Sunday. PROVINCIAL SOVIETS DISSATISFIED WITH TERMS.

(Through Reuters' Agency.)

LONDON, March 1. Active preparations are being made in Russia to sign the German armistice.

According to an official wireless message from Russia, a proclamation, issued by the President of the Central Soviets and the Committee of Defense at Petrograd, declares that the armistice is being signed for the defence of the country, which will have to wait a long time but will not capitulate until the last moment.

The proclamation says all our preparations are being made to sign the armistice at Petrograd and Moscow, and says that troops must be organized and sent to the front without delay.

A Russian official message, transmitted by wireless, states that the peace delegation at Brest-Litovsk reports that the Central Powers, replying to the request for a cessation of hostilities, declare that signing will come only when the peace treaty is signed. Three days are allowed for negotiations commencing today.

A later message says that Lenin has received a message from the Peace Delegation asking for a truce and a cessation of hostilities.

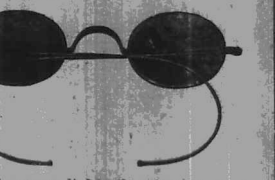

Official Announcement of Pension Procedure

(To the Editor of "East African Standard.")

Sir.—In view of the uncertainty that appears to exist as regards military pensions and disability allowances, it has been considered desirable to furnish information in the best possible form for general information in your columns. I enclose copy of a memo for which I shall be glad if you will find space in your issue.

Application as to disability compensation to members of the East African Forces, including members of the East African Forces, is made to the principal or deputy principal of the pension department of the Ministry of Defence, London.

The Government has provided a special provision to members of local forces or those dependent on them, and this part is executed as applications are received. In receipt of the medical report on any man discharged on account of military service, it is taken to secure payment to him of any disability compensation to which he may be entitled under the Royal Warrant for Army Pensions, whilst in the case of the death of a member of any local force, steps are taken, upon the receipt of intimation of such death, to ascertain whether the deceased left any persons dependent upon him. If such is the case, the pension payable to the dependent of the deceased is taken to secure payment to some payment where such dependents may be residing. The number of such persons allowed is graduated according to the rank of the deceased.

It is possible that claims on behalf of members of local forces discharged or deceased during the early part of the war may have escaped notice, but it is always open to any persons interested to bring any such case to the notice of the Department.

BIG MOMBASA FIRE

Damage £6,000

30,000 BAGS OF SEED COTTON DESTROYED.

[From Our Own Correspondent.]

MOMBASA, March 8.—A fire breaking out yesterday morning at 4 o'clock, destroyed a large quantity of seed cotton, belonging to Mr. Kilindi Bridge, that is being stored at the Kilindi Warehouse.
