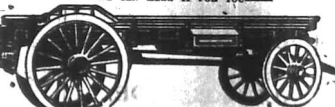

Keep a careful watch on the trend of events in now, but which will be irrevocable in the past when the whole population consisted of natives and officials, but we made emphatically that we are convinced that the majority of the people in this Protectorate—whether settlers or otherwise—have the interests of the country at heart, and we are confident that it develops along the proper lines, but unfortunately no concrete suggestions have been made to impress questions in forthcoming, and there appears to be no one to whom we can take their views. It is a pity that at the present time, and in a period of paramount importance that the quarters that matter. We have taken a number of measures, but the question of the disposal of the late German colonies in Africa is a matter which has made their attitude perfectly clear as regards the Pacific islands, while the people of South Africa have stated quite definitely their absolute opposition to any suggestion of returning to the German territories previously known as German South-West Africa and German East Africa. The coveted territory in East Africa concerns this Protectorate more than any other country in the world, and yet no word has so far been forthcoming as to the people's views on the subject. We know we are voicing public opinion when we say that under no circumstances would we wish the return of the Hutu to the neighboring territory, but we are opposed with anything approaching equality, but that is not our business. We must place the facts on record. However, just as the people of East Africa are entitled to their views, so are the people of the Protectorate. But the question of the disposal of the conquered German colonies is only one of the many matters on which a free expression of public opinion is essential, especially in times like the present. The views of British East Africa may possibly be of value in the future.

The representation of the past few weeks of ample proof of the fact, because it has been clearly shown that our local Administration does not represent the views of the people. We have seen the views of the people recently expressed, and the views put forward by the local Government are found to be far from the views which the great and far-reaching people of the Protectorate are entitled to. In fact, the people of the Protectorate are entitled to know that if by acting things they wish to take up one day to find ways and means to be taken into consideration, which is diametrically opposed to their own and aspirations. It is a pity that the late East Africa Protectorate is practically the only representative body to which the interests in the proper quarters, and the suggestion has been made, possibly that an East African House should be formed in London, the object of bringing the views of the East African people to the notice of the Government. This is a far from the fact that the Protectorate ought to have had some official representatives at Home long ago, and although the war militates against such being done at the moment, we are hopeful of seeing something definite materialize in this direction in the not far distant future. In the meantime, it is a case of being up and doing, no good ever resulted from sitting down and adopting the "wait and see" policy. It is true that our population is a comparatively small and a scattered one, but these facts do not constitute insurmountable obstacles. The recent Forward Movement which culminated in the big mass meeting in Nairobi shows quite clearly that we can do more, and what ought to be done for the future is not more than we are capable of. We must make it our business to work more closely with the other Dominions of the Empire where placed their views on record as such clear and categorical terms. We appeal to our leading citizens and settlers to give these matters their most earnest consideration, in order to ensure that British East Africa does not suffer in any way through failure to make its voice heard.

'NOT INFREQUENTLY AN UNMITIGATED NUISANCE.'
In the course of the evidence before the Military Service Commission, Mr. W. H. Hill, Principal Commissioner, testified that the provision applied to married officers was an unmitigated nuisance. This mobility was emphasized. If officers were A.I.C.'s at a station, and one was married, there would be a great deal of trouble. ACTING GENERAL MANAGER'S EVIDENCE

At the sitting of the Economic Commission of East Africa, Mr. Church, Acting General Manager of the Uganda Railway, gave evidence in the course of which he stated that he had been in the country for 22 years.

G.E.A. TRADE Carriage of Goods REGULATIONS ISSUED UNDER MARTIAL LAW.

In reference to trade in Vol between East Africa and the Occupied Territory (Central East Africa) the undersigned regulations, which have been issued by the Controller of Customs...

1. Goods intended for carriage across the frontier shall be delivered to the Customs Station of Mombasa or Tanga on the Tanganyika Railway.

2. Goods consigned to his Majesty's agent or military agent, the Civil Government of the Occupied Territory or the official of the Civil Administration may be loaded direct by, and consigned to, any other station on the Tanganyika Railway.

3. Goods consigned to any other station on the Tanganyika Railway, in order to be carried to the frontier, shall be loaded at either Mombasa or Tanga prior to their departure from the station.

4. The carriage of merchandise by passenger is prohibited.

5. No packages of loaded at Mombasa or Tanga shall be delivered to any other station on the Tanganyika Railway unless authorized by the Civil Government.

6. At Tanga all goods shall be off-loaded at the Port Graham for clearance, with the exception of British produce of British origin, which may be released by the Customs at the Railway Station.

7. Goods may be consigned from any station on the Tanganyika Railway to any station on the Uganda Railway on the following conditions:

(a) No bookings shall be accepted by the Railway authorities unless the consignor produces an export permit, duly passed by the Customs at Tanga or Mombasa.

(b) The consignor shall be liable for the payment of the import duties, leviable under the East African Protective Customs Ordinance, on all goods consigned to any station on the Uganda Railway, other than Mombasa, and further for a charge of 20 cents per package for export administration expenses.

(c) Two copies of each waybill for bookings from Mombasa shall be furnished by the consignor to the Customs at Mombasa, and one copy of each waybill for bookings from Tanga shall be sent to the Customs at Tanga or Mombasa before the departure of the train.

(d) The Regulations shall come into operation on or after 15th April, 1916, and on 10th December, 1916, are amended.

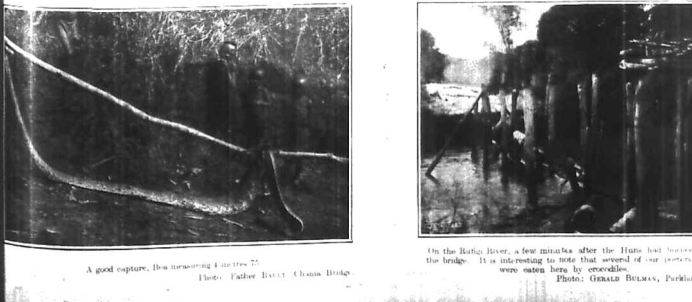

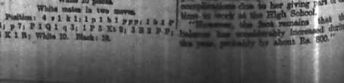

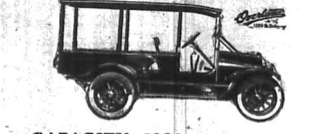

GENERAL GOUGH Member of Famous British Fighting

General Sir Hubert de la Poer Gough, K.C.B., K.C.V.O., according to Mr. Lloyd George, was seen recalled by the War Office in connection with the retirement of the 5th Army on the Somme front.

Born in 1870, General Gough served in the Third Expedition and in the South African War. On the outbreak of the European War he commanded the 1st Cavalry Brigade during the retreat from Mons and the Battle of the Marne. His Brigade was one of the first to arrive at the Aisne on September 12, 1914, and a few weeks later, when the Cavalry Corps was formed under Sir Edmund Allenby, he was given command of the 2nd Cavalry Division. His Division was the first part of the British force to leave on October 8 for France.

In the first Battle of Ypres when the small British Army bottled the door of the North against the German army, his Division fought a famous part. In General Smith-Barbar's advance towards Lens Haenan in the course of the left flank, clearing out the Germans from the Forest of Nevele, the Hill of Cassel, and the Esplanade. Along with the Cavalry Division it reconquered the line of the Ypres, and later held the front between Zandvoorde and Messines on the left of Allenby's Corps. He had general staffings of October 30, 31, and 11, and December 1, before the First World War, and he was recalled to the front in 1918. He was recalled to the front in 1918.

Sir Hubert Gough's 2nd Cavalry Division was in the Battle of Neuve Chapelle, but failed to get the expected line of going into action. 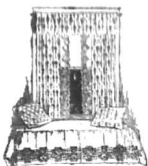
