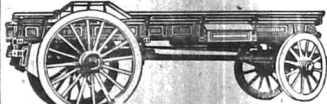

### ANZAC SUCCESS

#### Highly Important Terrain Captured

(THOROS BERTON'S AGENCY.)

LONDON, May 8. Reuters' correspondent at the British Headquarters, writing on May 6, says: "The Anzacs advanced during the past 24 hours has been confined to Australian troops. Following on Saturday morning when the Anzacs advanced their line between the Anzacs and the British, a depth of 700 yards, they again launched a successful offensive last night and captured a further 700 yards, including the summit of the Anzacs, on a front of about 11 miles. They drove back the enemy along the front by an average distance of 500 yards."

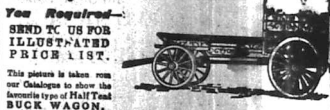
