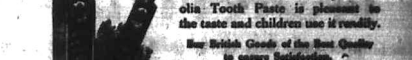

many other urgent necessities. They also equipped hospitals and hospital trains and fitted up steamers for the transport of horses and mules.

Locomotives have been overhauled and fitted for service in Mesopotamia and East Africa, and immense supplies have been taken, not only from the stores of Indian railways but from their working equipment and rolling stock. The railways have helped us, therefore, in a double sense and I think I may fairly say that without India we should have fared badly and that with her help we have won the war.

There is very little doubt that a much larger quantity of coal could be produced in India if labour was more plentiful. It is thought that this increase might be 40 to 50 per cent of the present output, but as we all know, Indian labour is irregular in its habits and during the monsoon months the men often return to their villages to cultivate their fields. It is very necessary, therefore, that efforts should be made wherever possible to give them land near to the collieries where they could make a permanent home. We often hear of the great surplus of labour in India, but in practice there is very frequently a shortage and at certain times in the year this shortage is greatly accentuated, to such an extent that unless stocks are held in reserve the position very soon becomes difficult.

In the Bengal districts the daily wage per head is only about 7½ annas, and in the Report of the Indian Industrial Commission, which has just been published it is stated that the supply of labour is at present insufficient and intermittent and is liable to be seriously affected by a good harvest or by an outbreak of an epidemic disease, in some forms of which the coal fields have in the past been liable. The Commission, however, recognising the great importance of the coal industry to India have recommended a special survey of the coal position throughout the country and it is in some ways might lead to more mines being opened up and to an improved system of railway connections, labour and organisation generally, all very necessary improvements.

As regards the pressure on the railways, I will just give you a few figures to show how greatly the railway traffic has increased. Before the war Indian coal required in Bombay was brought round from Calcutta by sea and in 1918, the year before the war, the amount of coal received in Bombay by sea was 1,160,000 tons, of which over half came from Calcutta. In that year only 90,000 tons were received in Bombay by rail. In 1917, however, 22,000 tons, most of which came from Calcutta, whereas the amount received by rail was just under 2½ million tons.

Another important mineral in India is manganese and the output of this has rapidly increased in recent years. Quite lately, however, owing to the war and to difficulties in connection with freight the output has fallen, but there is a very great future for the manganese trade of India and if a larger quantity could be used in India itself it would be a very good thing. At present manganese is mainly exported in a raw state to other countries, although the few existing iron and steel companies in India have since the war manufactured considerable quantities of ferro-manganese.

The manganese mines are mainly in the Central Provinces and to a smaller extent in Chotanagpur, Bombay, Madras and elsewhere. This of course is another mineral which requires a large number of railway wagons and there has been great pressure at times to bring supplies to the ports for shipment to this country and elsewhere. It is also a mineral that must be carried cheaply as the competition of other countries has to be faced.

many cases of severe malaria. They also equipped hospitals and hospitals trains and fitted up ambulances for the transport of horses and mules.

Provisionally have been overhauled and repaired in the hospitals in East Africa, and insurance supplies have been taken, not only from the stores of Indian railways but from their working equipment.

It is a double vex and I think I may safely say that without Indian aid we should have fared badly and that such aid we have now the war.

There is very little doubt that a much larger quantity of coal could be produced in India if labour was more plentiful. It is thought that this increase might be 40 to 50 per cent. of the present output, but as we are all local Indian labour we regulate in its habits and during the monsoon months the men often return to their villages to cultivate their fields. It is very necessary, therefore, that efforts should be made wherever possible to give them land near to the colonies where they could make a permanent home. We often hear of the great surplus of labour in India, but in practice India is very frequently a shortage and at certain times in the year this shortage is greatly accentuated, to such an extent that unless stocks are held in reserve the position very soon becomes difficult.

In the Bengal districts the daily wage per head is only about 7½ annas and the support of the Indian industrial Commission which has just been published it is stated that the supply of labour is at present insufficient and intermittent and is liable to be seriously affected by a good harvest or by the outbreak of an epidemic disease, to some forms of which the coal fields have in the past been liable. The Commission, however, recognizing the great importance of the coal industry to India has recommended a special survey of the coal position throughout the various regions and suggested organizational measures generally, all very necessary improvements.

As regards the pressure on the railways, I will just give you a few figures to show how greatly the railway trade has increased. Before the war Indian coal required in Bombay was brought round from Calcutta by sea and in 1913, the year before the war, the amount of coal required in Bombay by sea was 1,169,000 tons of which only 500,000 tons came from Calcutta. In that year only 23,000 tons were received in Bombay by rail. In 1917, however, the amount received by sea was only 22,000 tons, whereas the amount received by rail was just under 2½ million tons.

Another important mineral in India is manganese and the output of this has rapidly increased in recent years. Quite lately, however, owing to the war and to difficulties in connection with freight the output has fallen, but there is a very great demand for the manganese fields of India and if a larger quantity could be used in India itself it would be a very good thing. As mineral manganese is mainly exported in a raw state to other countries, although the iron industry and steel companies in India have since the war manufactured considerable quantities of ferro-manganese.

The manganese mines are mainly in the Central Provinces and to a lesser extent in Chhattisgarh, Bombay, Madras and elsewhere. This of course is another mineral which requires a large number of railway wagons and there has been some discussion at Ahmednagar as to the ports for shipment in this country and elsewhere. It is also a mineral that must be secured cheaply as the competition of other countries has to be faced.

RUBBER IN UGANDA

T. H. BROWN, E.A. STATIONER.

Sir.—Your Kampala correspondent seems to have made a slip in referring to the rubber growing industry up here. Reading his article one would gather that planting started up here in coffee growing, and until the coffee appeared to be getting on, rubber was not thought of. The real history of planting is exactly the opposite. Kivuva Coy. was the first concern to take up planting seriously and this was located as a rubber growing Company.

A few coffee trees growing amongst the rubber trees gave such good results in 1910, 1911 and 1912, that it was considered that coffee promised as good returns as rubber, and the period of waiting was only 3 years against 6 years with rubber. This led to attention being drawn from rubber to coffee, particularly on new estates starting. At Kivuva although we went in largely for coffee, we also kept up our rubber planting, and before the coffee was proved to be not so good as we had hoped we had gone a good way to prove rubber to be a success.

Coffee undoubtedly, up to the advent of leaf disease in 1913, was doing extraordinarily well and paid handsomely. Since then it has, to say the least, not given large profits. Your correspondent is certainly right in saying that rubber is the crop to plant up here. It is doing every bit as well as he has said. There are of course those who state that we shall have the same of rubber that we have heard of coffee in a few years, but a study of the history of the two crops should allay their fears. Coffee has a black history everywhere in the Eastern tropics, instances Ceylon, Natal and India, whereas rubber wherever it has been grown has proved a commercial success.

It is easy to account for this. Rubber is peculiar in that it is not a fruit crop, and providing you can grow your trees, it does not matter a bit whether insects or diseases intrude upon the trees, you get your rubber. You thus altogether escape the worry that is always present when growing a fruit. All fruit trees have their leaf seasons everywhere, and this is where rubber scores. The critical flowering and fruiting stage is of no importance to the rubber grower, as it is with most crops and he can look with equanimity on a failure here.

Your correspondent suggests that I give some information of the relative costs of bringing rubber into the country in this and other countries. This information is readily available to all those who see financial papers or the rubber share handbooks, and it can be readily seen how strong the position is up here. In Uganda £20 is sufficient to bring an acre into bearing. In Malaya £20 is considered a reasonable figure. A study of the share markets will show the value placed on an acre of rubber in being in the East. I know of a Company whose capitalization is £25 per acre and their shares stand at 150 per cent. premium. This shows that the market value of the rubber is about £150 per acre. Another Company whose shares stand at £10 per cent. and there is no other as low as this, has its 41 shares standing at over £7. This shows that the market valuation is over £150 per acre. And so all through the list. Where the capitalization cost is low it will be found that the premium placed on the shares in the market being the buying price up to between £100 and £200 per acre. Everyone is aware that the dividends paid warrant this. Several companies have paid an average dividend of 500 per cent for the last 3 or 4 years. I do not say that we will do this in Uganda, nor am I desirous of becoming better up here. It will pay me to invest in the very best shares, but I do wish to show that the position is a very strong one and that we are doing the right thing in giving it the attention that we are.

I was very pleased to learn from your correspondent that many new planters are going in for rubber. I am sure that they will find it a very profitable investment. KYAMBU CHAPLAINCY

The Rev. E. A. STATIONER. Sir.—It may interest your readers to know that the Rev. W. F. Lott, who has been our Chaplain for the last eight years, is shortly going to the District. His many thanks to the Chaplaincy are accordingly made a small presentation to him on his departure and before leaving the

show and South Wales Coal Owners' Association, showing that for 15 months ending in the middle of last January, the mines had produced 24,000,000 tons of coal, valued at £8,500,000 in wages, while the nation lost in the output of coal £5,918,777 tons.

This picture would be sufficiently serious were there not for quite another side, namely, the determination of the country as a whole that it should permit the production of coal in our national life, and I venture to think that if Mr. Lloyd George made now another speech in this country he would get a larger measure of support than ever, since Bolshevist tendencies would swing over a large number of voters who previously voted against the Administration.

Generally speaking the Trade Union leaders and Executives have behaved well. Not a single strike has been authorized or been the object of special sanction with the exception of the one promoted by the Locomotive Engineers, and this must be, as far as I know, the only one. Union rivalry. The public too has unconsciously faced its appalling inconveniences with real courage. Thousands of people have walked backwards and forwards to their work, often from 10 to 15 miles in all, and among those who have been his hardest are the postmen, policemen, and the like who commence their day's labour about four to five o'clock in the morning, and walk backwards whatever, on the streets, and shop girls who have arrived at their places of business steadily from out and put up bravely all the day, with a possibility they may not have sufficient time to walk their turn in securing food.

"JOHN BULL'S" ADVICE.

The middle classes have perhaps suffered less, and yet is it not impossible to find sympathy with the cry of the strikers while the others returning from the front who have to tramp across London, where accommodation is crowded to excess, are particularly outspoken at the exactions of a class with whom as a result of their disregard of the "golden rule" in the war they have every little sympathy. Accordingly if the strikers do not win this time they will win at all. Conditions have wholly favoured them. The weather has been appalling, something very like a blizzard occurring on the third day of the strike. Owing to the absence of any real preparations could be made. The Government too, are slow in moving. Now the outlook is different. There is hope that Mr. Lloyd George's Ministry, while recognizing the legitimate claims of labour, will crush by all the means in its power the reckless and irresponsible action of those who ignore absolutely the rights of the general public to some consideration for its health comfort and ordinary everyday existence. Meanwhile, capital is scared, trade is at a standstill, and some firms are preparing to go abroad. "John Bull" is wise in advising the working classes not to keep a good which lays the golden eggs.

MOTOR ACCIDENT.

Bank Official's Narrow Escape.

The general public will bear with regret the accident which befell Mr. H. Parker, of the Standard Bank of South Africa, Ltd., in Bombay on Tuesday afternoon, whilst riding a motor-cycle.

It appears that he was turning the corner of Corporation Road into Maudsland Terrace, round the premises of His Excellency General Ayres, when a military motor-car was passing. Owing to the sharp corner there, neither the driver of the car, a native, nor the cyclist had any means of escape, and the cyclist approached until the collision threatened.

From the statements of eyewitnesses and an inspection of the spot where the accident occurred, it seems that probably the motor-car driver in trying to avoid, as he thought, running into the cyclist, swerved off his proper course and met the cyclist close up against the trolley-lines. He had continued in his direct course it is believed that the cyclist would have probably cleared the car, but he (the car driver) seems to have done what he considered best under the circumstances.

Mr. Parker was flung into the road, his motor-cycle being damaged, but, though he sustained shock, he is believed to be unhurt, and is being nursed by the B.E.A. Corporation medical assistants, and conveyed him to hospital for medical treatment.

WHY MEAT WAS LATE

Interesting Explanation by Mr. Mortimer

TO THE EDITOR, E.A. STANDARD.
Sir,—Will you allow me to explain through the medium of your column the cause of the unusual commotion in the neighbourhood of the various Butchers' shops this (Sat.) morning.

On account of the great prevalence of quarantine restrictions on all the active reserves in the country and at frequent intervals in the various cattle feeding districts all the butchers have had to slaughter a large proportion of their cattle on the M.T. premises at the commencement at Athi River and later at Mbagathi.

While the Military Live Stock Corps was in existence the cattle were supplied by the live stock officers, since they were disbanded the butchers have been able to purchase directly from the Government.

From Athi River the beef was brought by the U.R. and since the removal of the slaughter house to Mbagathi the military tractor of their trolly line.

During the heavy rains of the last few days there has been considerable damage done to the track and there by the reason causing considerable delay. This is what happened on Thursday and Friday this week, owing to the track and the Nairobi during the forenoon of the following days. Consequently the beef which should have been on the tracks at the M.T. premises was not ready for this (Sat.) morning's sales did not arrive until almost noon for closing.

We see so accurately as this, as we appreciate too highly the privilege extended to us and we realize too well the difficulties the M.T. men have had to contend with, that we are not prepared to be discontinued shortly, may I take this opportunity of tendering the thanks of the butchers to the Traffic Master of the U.R. to the O.F. Live Stock and his staff and to the military authorities at Mbagathi or the help they have given them to the cause of the help of the authorities. Nairobi would during many weeks have had no meat supply.

As I have acted as secretary to the three European firms during the whole of the past week, may I sell their mouths open in this explanation and expression of thanks.

SOLDIER SETTLERS

THE EDITOR, E.A. STANDARD.
Sir,—It would seem that a certain amount of nonsense is being written and talked about the land settlement scheme, some by people who have an axe to grind, some by ex-soldiers whose sole idea is that of getting something for nothing. I do not see how anything could be better for a country, particularly a budding one, than to find it supplied with a poor white class. Everybody knows that a farm cannot be run on £2000 capital; and if these ex-soldiers had the necessary capital, it would be spent in three years and the country flooded with destitute whites loafing for their bread. One says the country is ripe for settlement when no schools or medical attendance are available, and if by chance the white settler makes a visit his home he how many years would he have to work to save up the money to pay here.

One looks on all the schemes should go home once every three years. This I imagine would apply to the poor woman, as much as her husband, who would wonder how after the former could afford this luxury with a husband whose sole capital is some land plus £2000.

Again, in the E.A.A. we have seen large numbers of B.N.C.O.s sent out from Home. How many of these would make model settlers? The whole question is the army is

for himself, not a particularly useful training for a settler. Just before the war there was a big slump in Canada primarily due to the settlement with the less Government grant of 100 acres. Thousands tried to work their land with insufficient capital, with the result that most of these to the Government or become the property of the capitalist. In Canada things were so bad that practically all farm and stock sales extended payments at 2 per cent. over the space of three years. These sales taken by the Bank with the natural result that the unfortunate settler being unable to meet his liability, became the slave of the Bank. I am not panning these lines from mere snobishness, but I am firmly convinced that what has happened before will happen again, and it is much better a man is warned in time than he should put two or three good years and £500 capital only to find himself destitute after the period: Encourage your model settler; he can afford to buy his experience, the poor man cannot. Encourage your model settler to bring out men to work for him, and train them in time to work up themselves

to have good business ideas. People who are ignorant of how to plan and run a business will not succeed in running a business. Give the man who has the money to let it be run under the management of a big firm and a man continues to do it till he is able to sell out, but save the man who has the money.
