# Extra-Ordinary Incident

A White Man Made Away With.

Five Natives Arrested.

At Mombasa on Friday morning December 20th news was brought in to the Police of the loss of Mr. Thomas London, the Chief Cable Engineer of the great cable ship now lyans in Kindini Harbour pending the commencement of the

aving of the new cable to Beira. It appears that on the Thursday two officers of the cable ship went ashore on the Mainland for a 'shoot.' They each picked up a native as a guide and went different ways arranging to neet at the landing place at noon. From that time onward, Mr.

From that time onward, Mr. London has been missing. On Friday morning the Inspector of Police at Kilindini with several Native Police went across the harbour and commenced a vigorous search and were joined later by a number of the cable ship's company. The search was made more difficult owing to the fact that the guide boys who accompanied the white men were both missing and the natives who live in considerable numbers in the neighbourhood where the missing officer was last seen declined to give any information whatsoever.

On the Saturday and Sunday olunteer parties of whitemen joined the searching parties, several staving 24th notwithstanding there has been an average of over forty native police men continuously searching nothing transpired to solve the mystery. On the 24th, Assistant Liwali Ali bin Salim camped on the Mainland and called all the natives of the District together and held several 'shauries the result of which we are unable to give with suthority as the Police and local authorities are properly very reticent. We give however, the following rumours which are current

The Liwali was able to secure the guide boy who accompanied the missing man. This boy it appears was hidden in a hut a considerable distance away and it is alleged that the boy has stated that two natives white man had any money on him after answering the question the guide it appears ran away and left his temporary master in the Bush. There is little doubt that foul play has occurred and that several arrests Dean Sin, have been made and we hope in our next issue to be able to publish a definite statement and that the body has been recovered

LATER :- It is momentarily expec ed that news of the discovery of the body will be brought in. From confessions made there can be now little doubt that the unfortunate gentle-man has lost his life, stabbed to death by native ruffians for the sake of a few rupees.
