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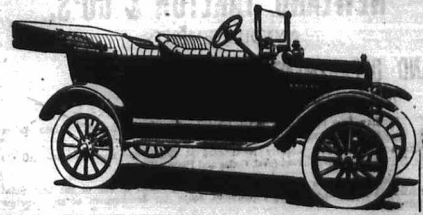

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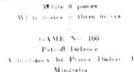

Local Roads Tested by Recent Rain

UREMI NEEDS FROM OUR OWN CORNERSTONE

Lamu, June 5. The rains which began on the 1st of the Province—and the principal producing districts on the mainland—are proving a severe trial to the people during the present rains. Flooding is prevailing between Lamu and Witu reports water on the track to the extent. The short sections have been maintained by the E.W.D. have stood the test of the floods very well but are not high enough, and need more concrete, while several important sections have not yet had anything done to them.

The long road to the Mwaniki-Witu section of the Mwaniki-Kau road on the Witu coast, everything remains to be done. The road is the principal main road in the Province, and is the only means of communication between Lamu and Witu, and the shortest and best route to the producing districts of the Tana River. These districts are inaccessible by sea from about April until the first of August, that is, during the height of the S. W. monsoon, during which it is impossible for ships to get to the mouth of the river. This season outside of the rainy season, during which the main route is in the very worst state of disrepair. As an indication of the state of affairs as doing to the development and trade of the Province, I will mention that an important concern, engaged in developing most work on the Tana River has a considerable quantity of its produce lying at Kilipa which is urgently required at Mombasa, as the latter will have to be used throughout when the above season opens. Lamu is now being held up and put to inconvenience and loss on account of the fact that mechanical plant that is essential to the development of the work is lying at Mombasa, and cannot be got through until the above season.

A WITAL ROAD. In both of these cases the provision of a road, practicable for wheel traffic, between Mwaniki and Lamu would enable transport to be effected by Lamu to which port the Coastal steamer runs, and the proposed road of the Province, the construction of which is being undertaken by the Government, would be a great benefit to the Province, permitting the free trade of goods by lighter without recourse to the state of the weather outside. The provision of such a road is essential for the future growth of the Province, inasmuch as it would open an important link in a through route down the Coast to Mombasa, linking up the Coast towns on a route which is now being undertaken by the construction of a road, and by making a beginning on those sections that are in urgent need of improvement, the work of connecting the through route will all be the easier when the time comes. The country through which this road would pass is very level, and presents no engineering difficulties worth mentioning with the exception of certain rocks, some of which could be bridged, and, for the most part, might be traversed by pack animals. The principal obstacle between Lamu and Mombasa is, probably, the "Kisumu" bridge, which is 31 miles in length, and 10 days good heavy gully in fair weather on foot. The latter method is not a business proposition, while the former is only a casual way, but that out of consideration I doubt if they have averaged one mile in each direction for the past year.

As illustrating how very casual the weather service is, I would state that the agents published a notice that a Coast steamer, bound for Mombasa, would call here last week-end. As a consequence of this notice "passengers" made arrangements to travel, shipped off their goods, all ready and well accompanied at the Port Office. But the steamer did not call. It called safely by sea, but in still calm and fine weather.

True as it may be that such a through road presents but little in the way of engineering difficulties, and that therefore, by comparison, it is comparatively easy to do, there are yet the financial and other considerations to be considered and the question arises as to the source from which such expenditure might be met. I submit, as my opinion on this question, that the amount of revenue over and above that from Province will not be found to go a long way towards paying the necessary expenditure. I am not an official, and therefore have no access to the figures, but I believe it is my hope to find that the Protectorate is making a profit out of Tanaland, and, if such is proved to be the case, then Tanaland should be able to have its most crying needs attended to without further delay. King then. 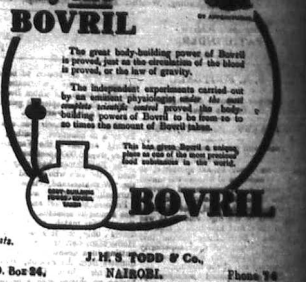

CHIEF LIAISON LETTER TO MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT.

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT

London, July 8.

Mr. Srivastava and his Indian colleagues have issued a letter to all Members of Parliament, enclosing a copy of a statement forwarded to Lord Milner, the Colonial Secretary. This statement summarises the Indian demands in East Africa as follows:

Extension of electoral franchise and equal representation on the Legislative and Executive Councils and the Nairobi Municipality. Absolute equality in the ownership of lands. Repeal of the Segregation of Races Act. Freedom for Indian immigration and equality of treatment.

Removal of all racial disabilities. Proper education for Indian Children. Reversal of the recent policy concerning exchange, and an assurance that there will be no tampering with currency.

The statement finally lays stress on "the very grave situation existing."

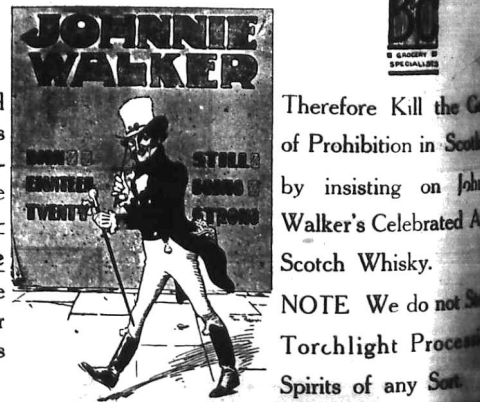

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CASSAVA

To the Editor, "The Standard." Mr. W. H. Hawtry has evidently taken my remarks on cassava very much to heart and in the wrong spirit. I would like him to remember that there are many other countries in this country, the majority of which are without any experience of planting and therefore, unless the pros and cons of so called new crops or catch crops are fully discussed they might grow such crops to their disadvantage.

The object of all good coffee planters is to improve their land from the very beginning, and it is very foolish to plant an exhausting catch-crop at anytime. Mr. Hawtry himself declares that nobody in this sense expects to grow a heavy pod of foot crop, year after year in the same spot. He also now admits, in an earlier part of his letter that his idea is only an experiment and cannot be carried out for being a good one.

These two admissions from apparently an experienced planter are sufficient justifications for my criticism, and not merely a desire to counter new words.

May I, without wishing to labor the controversy and with your prior consent, comment on the points brought in Mr. Hawtry's letter? He says, "no one is eating cassava mania as more than one eats nuts or fruit." Why did he not say more appropriate comparison with, say potatoes sweet or otherwise. We all know that cassava is kept for considerable time over months and then eaten without the slightest danger. Again do those people know the difference between mushroom and food stools?

Finally, Mr. Hawtry must expect, when he expresses an opinion either through interview or by writing in the Press, on planting matters, to have "the chief among us" taking notes. This is a plain fact which could not spend it all this country with a planting community.

## Chief Native Commissioner's Proposals for Extension of Mission Schools

### SUBSIDIES FOR MISSION SCHOOLS

#### AFRICAN TRAINING DEPOT AND KABETE REFORMATORY

The following is the memo prepared by the Chief Native Commissioner on the subject of Native Education. The recommendations regarding the subsidization of mission schools are published in the following issues:

Native Education is dealt with in the 1920-21 Estimates under the following heads:

- Mombasa Division C School. This school was formerly known as the "Arab School" and includes Arala and Umanja Native School, Machakos. It is a purely native school.
- All Bin Salim School, Malindi. This school has been founded by the Hon. Mr. Bin Salim, who has a full understanding of Arala and Umanja.

We propose forming Native Schools in the native districts on the following lines:

- 1 Headmaster £400 by £20 in 1920
- 1 Chief Technical Instructor £600 by £20 in 1920
- 1 European Carpenter Instructor £250 by £10 in 1920
- 1 European Masonry Instructor £250 by £10 in 1920
- 1 Native Technical Instructor (at various rates)
- 1 Native Teachers (at various rates)

Transport charges, etc. Houses for European staff school dormitory and other buildings to be erected by the school attendance material for the school to be purchased by the Government. Maintenance, equipment, etc.

Total total cost for one unit in 1920-21

Personal emoluments: 1,600  
Upkeep of buildings, etc: 10  
Transport, etc: 400  
Maintenance, equipment, etc: 2,740  
Total subsequent recurrent charge: 4,840  
One such unit has been opened at Machakos, but the per cent will depend upon the acceptance of similar returns increasing the expenditure asked for this year in the Estimates is: 1,714  
Upkeep, etc: 450  
Bookings (Item 1 p. 133): 700

To complete this unit on the lines indicated, expenditure is required amounting to: 4,840

(Note a house for Headmaster is already in existence and £700 for buildings is included in 1920-21 Estimates.)

It is proposed to deal with the establishment of Government and Mission Schools on the following lines:

(a) In districts where there are established responsible and recognized European Schoolmaster and Mission undertaking technical education in part of the curriculum the Government to refrain from opening a Government School, and to deal with the missions under a system of lump sum payments to share with and subsequently under a system of capitation. Former to be arranged on a basis of engagement, attendance and results up to date, the latter to be arranged on a basis of results. We feel that to meet the only possible way of getting the scheme on to a footing. All such missions to be regularly inspected and to be subjected to an annual school code.

The amount of the lump sum in no case exceed two thirds of the recurrent cost of a Government school, based on the standard set by the Government Unit.

The Hon. the Director of Education is requested to be advised with the Director of Education that the above scheme is a fairly reasonable

and may be impossible to meet in more than a small degree at present. I, therefore, suggest that we deal with the matter this year by a One Line Vote and that the departments concerned be authorized to obtain what is possible for the money found to be available. If this is accepted it will enable us to proceed according to what money is found to be available on the lines in the attached Schedule.
