ENGLAND'S HUGE WIN South Africans Routed in Final Test Match

VICTORIOUS TOUR Beneficial Results Anticipated from Visitors' Displays

"E.A. STANDARD" SPECIAL CALE. FROM OUR SOUTH AFRICAN CORRESPONDENT.

Cape Town, July 17. The third test match, and the final match of the tour of the English Association Football Team was played here to-day.

The ground was in good condition after rain overnight, and the spectators numbered well over 12,000.

The fair weather favoured the pair in which tremendous interest was taken. The conditions generally left little to be desired.

The teams lined up as follows, reading from right to left:

ENGLAND. Goal: Gough (Sheffield United).

Backs: Longworth (Liverpool) and Elvey (Luton).

Halves: Bamber (Liverpool), Hilchick (Manchester United), and Vesely (Bradford).

Forwards: Turbull (Millwall), Mercer (Hull City), Fancaster (Sheffield), Smith (Bolton Wanderers) and Davis (Swindon).

SOUTH AFRICA. Goal: Morgan (Western Province).

Backs: Ford (Natal) and Vriens (Transvaal).

Halves: Skene, Mason and Scott (all Western Province).

Forwards: Bredrick (Transvaal), Smith (Free State), Green (Transvaal), Fitchat (Free State) and Stuart (Western Province).

From start to finish, South Africa was hopelessly out-classed. England gave a brilliant exposition of team football, and the English players, all of whom were superbly skilled with superior skill, and finally ran out winners by the huge score of nine goals to one.

Fancaster scored England's first goal 30 seconds from the start, after which there was no question as to which side would ultimately prove the winners.

In the course of the game Fancaster's scores—three were goals making his individual total four. Smith scored two goals, including one obtained from a penalty.

At half time the score stood at four to one in the Englishmen's favour. The second half produced six goals, including one scored by South Africa from a penalty.

The weather in this second test was ideal, and the play in the splendid, fast state that up-country South African footballers are accustomed to playing in under conditions which were favourable to South Africa we were not surprised to see that not merely as indicated by the scoring end but by the general run of the game.

There is no getting away from the fact that we have a long way to go before we can play soccer as it is played by England's best. We freely admit it. It is, of course, not to take my disrepute, seeing that Rugby is the game we play best, but to take the lesson of the tour to heart and to benefit from them, the more so as soccer is getting more popular in South Africa; it is played more than it used to be. The huge crowds at the Wanderers on Saturday between 20,000 and 25,000 were sufficient proof of the interest in the general public.

It is, therefore, all to the good that our football soccer team should be sent out from England and by a series of matches throughout the country show us not only how the game should be played, but by competition against us make our faults stand out in bold relief.

Our teams have made many mistakes and developed serious shortcomings both in the tactics and the strategy of the game. But we are going to benefit that revelation of our faults. Our younger soccerists will have received many a wrinkle as to the need for individual play, and our old team managers will have been taught many a valuable lesson in how a side should combine and work together.

GRAINS NECESSARY. Our English visitors have demonstrated that the most essential of brains is as necessary for a good game of soccer as a display of strength and speed.

The Englishmen are accustomed to playing in all sorts of conditions, but they were surprised by the victory of the South Africans. But when that is said, I think it about exhausts the excuses for South Africa. The Englishmen were outmatched in all departments of the game. Still, it is a great pity that the match was spoiled by the weather, and played under conditions which hardly constituted a fair test. Had the weather conditions been perfect, the Englishmen would still have won, probably by a larger margin, but there would have been more satisfaction in it than in a scramble with rain and wind. The strategy of the South Africans was superbly skilful, and they were able to take advantage of the weather conditions, and played under conditions which hardly constituted a fair test.

But when all these clever individual touches were brought into the game, the Englishmen were routed. And really, it was just too good for the South Africans, who, as one man, initiate a movement towards the opposing goal, and drawing rings round the other side. 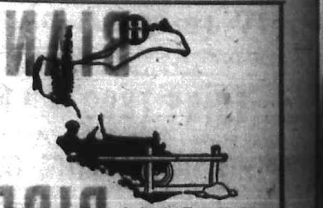

SCHOOL TEACHERS The Proposed Cadet System Criticized GIFT OF TEACHING

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard": Sir, I should feel gratified if you would allow me, through the medium of your paper, to draw the attention of those interested in the proposed cadet system to the fact that the Legislative Council of a resolution moved by the Director of Education regarding a cadet class of teacher.

For some few years, several per cent of our teachers have been provided, have been using our best endeavours towards the improvement of our schools in this colony, feeling that before it could be said to be a white man's country, means must be provided for the efficient education of his children.

Within the last two years a very serious improvement has taken place, and it is gratifying to note that general sympathy is expressed with the Acting Head Master who had taken over but a few hours previous to the accident.

Now, the first object of educational authorities in demanding a teacher's diploma is to satisfy themselves that he is competent to teach, i.e., that he has the gift of teaching.

What, therefore, will be the position in the event of the proposed institution of the Director of Education being carried to effect? A candidate without a diploma will be engaged at a salary of £200 a year, in course of time he may prove absolutely worthless to the school, and his presence on the staff will be a constant embarrassment to the school.

I am aware that at some public schools it is the custom to take very young men without diplomas, but these schools are within my experience of a university to which the students may return to do their course of study to such an extent as to be considered to be qualified; moreover, our public schools possess machinery for the training of such a man which the Government school does not possess.

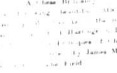

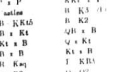

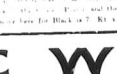

INDUSTRIAL ALCOHOL

Schedule Disappearing Petrol Supply

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
Sir,—With reference to the matter as dealt with in your issue of today, and rightly emphasised as of vital importance, not only to this colony, but to the Empire and the world at large, may I call your attention to the lengthy memorandum prepared by me and published in your columns about two years ago.

Keeping the rates—which as beyond question—of this colony's capabilities of production of industrial alcohol, most of the questions raised in your columns to-day are dealt with and answered in that memorandum.

If we take the report of the Economic Commission and ask the help of the Director of Agriculture, this exception, i.e., the extent of the colony's capabilities, can be ascertained.

I may be allowed to point out that alcohol must be manufactured from a surplus production, in the sense that it is not commercially feasible to make alcohol until the food demand is supplied.

It is hoped that the memorandum above referred to will shortly be available to the public in pamphlet form.

May I remind your readers of the production of the late Prof. Vivian Lewes, when he stated that:—"The day will come when a world's handiwork in fuel will turn to vegetation."

And of that of Prof. Wesley, at Pittsburgh in 1897.

"I am no geologist were I to lead you to believe that nature's laboratories can manufacture this spirit (petrol) at a hundredth of the rate at which it is being exhausted. They cannot, and—no distant date—our children will only obtain the drops."

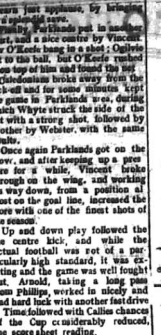
