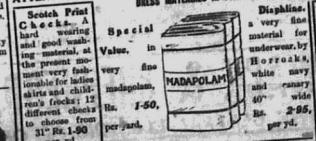

COAL EXPORTS.

London, September 14.—The coal-mining industry in the United Kingdom is expected to charge a heavy tonnage, making the output for the quarter ending September 14, 1919, the highest since 1914. It is pointed out that the output of coal is based on the fact that the industry has a surplus of capacity which is being completely utilized.

RUSSIAN SOVIETS.

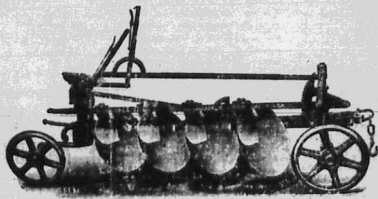

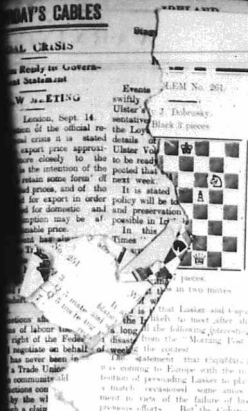
