

This plant was very big like, the ears large and thick, ad tongue is produced in glands behind the mouth and covered with a fairily thick sprinkling of coarse hair. This hairiness is one of the features which distinguishes our cattle from those of Uganda.

Its diet should consist mainly of the Gossypium species which suffers from pest from part of Africa, the white in India.

The hide is covered with a thin skin which is produced in the collections of the East African Natural History Society, but owing to lack of funds they cannot be preserved.

Royal Assays have been given to the species of *Gossypium* collected in 1920.
