My-porters and boys having behaved very well hitherto. I resolved to give them a treat. Inc usuing-toats had just arrived at the top of the creek and the fishermen were passing the eamp carrying enormous loads of fish. Addressing and the fisherman, carrying enormous loads of fish. We reckoned up that each porter had an average 4 lbs. of fish for dinner. There was some difficulty in getting those who had over-gorged themselves to make a start next morning. Under such circumstances the native, if he gets a chance usually hibernates or a tune, as the pythons do. Fish is so abundant here and at many other coast vallages that a great deal of it is wasted, the natives being too improvident and indolent to cure the surplus supply. Quite a paying industry, we believe, might be started if the people could be supplied with salt at a cheap rate and the Chiefs were induced to take an interest in the rate and the
