# LOWER COSTS OF PRODUCTION

## IMPORTANT RESOLUTIONS BY DISTRICT ASSOCIATIONS

Many Views on the Factors of High Prices

### REDUCTION OF NATIVE WAGES

#### THE JUNCTION OF THE FREE RUPEE

The campaign for reduced costs of production, as regards to foreign production, labour and other, is assuming considerable proportions throughout the Colony. The following resolutions from our District Associations all of which bear on the subject of lifting a great handicap from the industry of the Colony. Other meetings are in progress. Meetings are being held day by day at Nairobi, Mombasa and Eldoret, Nairobi on Tuesday, Limuru on April 14, and a Special Session of the Convention of Association has been called for April 12.

Letters from representative producers appear below. The editor wishes to call the attention of his readers that these are not necessarily his views, and take different views of certain points. It is left to the reader to make up his mind as to what is best in all its aspects before the Convention meets, and further communications from settlers and business men will add much to an exhaustive consideration of a matter of vital importance to the welfare of the Colony.

There seems to be a general agreement on the need for co-operation, the standardisation of wages, and the bringing of pressure to bear on the Government to secure a reduction in order to remove difficulties for trade and for us.

The representation of the Bapo, after demonstration, to claim at the exchange rate, also finds very considerable support; the unreasonably high wages paid to artisans are also strongly criticised, and the effect of the very heavy railway freight, which was referred to in a special session of the Legislative Council on Tuesday, as reported in another column, are discussed.

If it is to be the case that the subject is far wider than a mere economic discontent of certain classes, then the opportunity of the Convention to effect a real reform, for the industry and welfare of the Colony is exceptional, and it is hoped that public support, suggestions, criticism and help will continue to be forthcoming before and during the Convention's session.

A well attended meeting all over the country were pending of the Kyanjui Association similar resolutions, as those were held in the Kyambura Gulf asked to co-operate with other districts in the Colony in urging this reduction, and the reduction of native wages, etc.

If the Government would be willing to consider this, and then circulated at its exchange value there was no one in that Association who would be against it.


