MEET WEEK.

The session of the Convention of African States which opens on Monday will hold a high place in the local history of historic meetings of that body, and it may well mark the opening of a new chapter in the story of East African commerce. The full schedule of resolutions to be discussed is not yet available, but those which have been passed and published by the affiliated associations during recent weeks are an indication of the very great importance that attaches to the debates. The most vital problem for discussion is the one which means for reducing the costs of production, and the interest that has been taken in this matter throughout the country gives very good promise that it will receive intelligent, and effective treatment at the latest Convention. The columns have contained many varied suggestions of different value to that end. It will be surprising if further novel measures are not brought forward for discussion next week. We earnestly trust that the initiative will be allowed for the discussion of the question as no greater disservice to the welfare of the Colony's industry can be done than the assumption that the arbitrary reduction of the wages of labour is the main or only means in the high cost of production. The expense plays a very great part in increasing costs, but the fact that this is the most obvious of the causes is no excuse for any man who is not a thinking person. With all subject for instance, are subject to high overhead charges, and in industries in which such charges are considerable, automatic reduction of native wages here might have a relatively small effect in reducing labour costs production. The personal element often can never be estimated. The management will be less able to pay by high rates of wages than provision that is lax, and even if they seem the efficient enough, the employers fear men, but employ fully, will very probably gain from automatic reduction of wages.  I intend the lease of my eye course has gone through, and that the committee are busy engaged in completing the building of new house, the expenditure will be a little, but it will be well worth it.

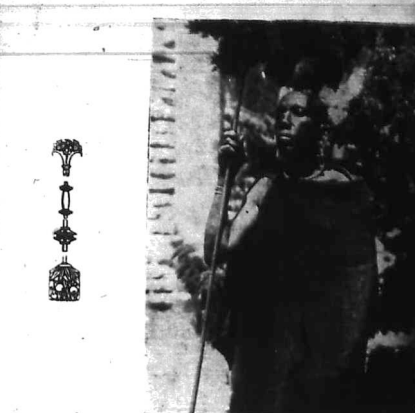
