World's News by Cable.

Mr. Chamberlain.

Feb. 7.—Mr. Chamberlain has started for Cannes.

Mr. Chamberlain and the Morning Post.

Feb. 8.—Mr. Chamberlain gave an interview to a representative of the "Morning Post." He vigorously denounced any down whitening of the Tariff Reform Programme such as dropping food taxes. The scheme which the Imperial side was the strongest, side of Tariff Reform and that he always found the working classes to be Imperialists.

Another New Line for B. E. A.

Feb. 7.—It is announced in Liverpool that a British Company will start a new direct service via the Suez Canal to British East Africa. The scheme will largely depend on Government guarantee. It is stated that the Union Castle Line co-operates.

Doubts about the Proposed E. A. Line.

Feb. 8.—The project of an East African Steamship Service with a Government subsidy has been received with considerable incredulity.

Socialistic Troubles.

Feb. 8.—Socialist demonstrations against the Prussian Franchise Bill have been held at Breslau, Solingen and Brunswick. Collisions with Police occurred at Breslau. Several were wounded with swords. Many arrests have been made.

A Great Naval Programme.

Feb. 9.—The French Cabinet have submitted to the Chamber a Naval Bill providing for a Battle-Fleet of 28 Battleships, 10 Scouts and Destroyers and 24 Submarines.

Feb. 9.—The King of Sweden was successfully operated on Monday night for appendicitis.

Anti-Sedition Legislation.

Feb. 5.—At Calcutta Sir Herbert Hiley introduced to the Viceroy's Council an Anti-Sedition Press Bill. Heavy deposits are required as securities from Proprietors of Printing Presses. The seizure of newspapers, books, etc. is authorised.

The Press Bill Passed.

Feb. 9.—The Legislative Council at Calcutta have passed the Press Bill. At the close of the Debate amid some sensation the Viceroy announced that Government had decided to release the individuals deported and arrested in Dec. 1908.

The Regency Period.

Feb. 10.—It is expected in Stockholm that the King of Sweden will be better in a fortnight and that the Regency of the Crown Prince will probably last only 3 weeks.

The re-introduction of the Budget.

Feb. 10.—Mr. Asquith is in London and it is understood that the first business after the debate on the address will be the re-introduction of the Budget in view of Financial exigencies.

The Seine Again in Flood.

Feb. 10.—The Seine is rising again and some quarters in Paris are being struck at the danger points.

The Trial of Knowlden.

Feb. 10.—At the trial of Knowlden it was shown that he took the drawings and instruments home for the purpose of studying with a view to passing certain examinations. He has been bound over to come up for judgment when called upon.

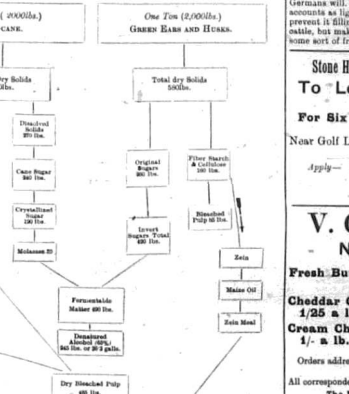

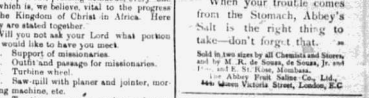

NATIONAL MUSEUMS.

I am aware that the National History Society proposed a Nairobi Museum but I feel sure that the favour of the Government of Nairobi set overclouded the fact that Mombasa from its position was more likely to meet with success. Unless private subscribers be helped considerably, one would need to be admitted to the building, and the proceeds would be larger if the building in the Mombasa owing to passengers from the steamer agents most probably dropping in. If a good collector was secured and a representative collection of the E. A. and Uganda Mammals made it would not only attract all sportsmen, but would act as a most excellent advertisement of the game which he is not met with by big game hunters in these Provinces which are now being in a good deal of money into the country. The matter seems well worth consideration if only as a means of recording the specimens of animals which will be exterminated in course of time. Yours truly,

TO THE EDITOR OF "THE EAST AFRICAN STANDARD."—
 Dear Sir,—Having become conversant with the fact that the letter which you published in this issue, I—as one who has taken active part in the efforts to establish a Museum in Mombasa—have pleasure in stating how far progress has been made. I am glad to hear that the fund has been commenced of which I am the temporary trustee. This fund will be devoted to the establishment of a National Museum at the Coast. Efforts have been made to bring the control of the Mombasa Museum under the auspices of the East Africa and Uganda National History Society. This Society proposes to establish a Museum at Nairobi and I understand a museum collection has already been made. If the Mombasa Museum could be carried on under the same constitution as the Nairobi Museum it would be a great success. There are many varieties of specimens which it would be fatal to keep in the humid atmosphere of the Coast and these specimens could be exchanged with Nairobi side by side. However, many difficulties have cropped up as negotiations have proceeded towards bringing the Mombasa Museum under the control of the East Africa Society. The fact that the Mombasa Museum to be a successful issue it is essential to interlock the classes of the Coast Committee, but so far it has not been done. It is well to interest all those who are interested in the East Africa and Uganda National History Society. I think it is feasible to interest them in a Mombasa Museum. On the whole I am inclined to the opinion that the Mombasa Museum will need to be established apart from the Society in question, and as a separate institution of its own. It does not mean that there will be any difficulties in the Mombasa Museum Trustees, or Guardians, co-operating with the Society in controlling the Nairobi Museum. I am of the opinion that when a definite and sound scheme for the establishment of a Museum in this country is put before the Government there will be no difficulty of obtaining small grants towards the cost of their upkeep, in the meantime I would recommend that the Mombasa Museum be put on a footing which will enable it to obtain grants from the Government. THE GRIEVANCES OF ONE WHO HAS LEFT US.

By H. W. BUCKLAND IN THE EMPIRE REVIEW.

I have just returned from Nairobi, where I resided for some four and a half years, and have been reading with interest the article that appeared in the November number of this Review entitled "Landing Through on British East Africa." I can fully endorse the writer's advice. Indeed, as necessary, does it appear to me that the basic public policy appropriate which is going on in this part of the empire that I am reluctant to give you my own experience.

Let me say at the outset there is a definite wrong with the country under British rule in Africa is a magnificent country, with every prospect, except minerals, and I speak with some knowledge, having spent twenty years in India, eight in Rhodesia, and six in East Africa besides paying a long visit to Australia. But it is not a white man's country, and on this point I join issue with the writer. It is a country where, after a few months' sojourn in our midst, his noblest in comparing the country with the Western States of America. A planter's and ranching country, British East Africa may be said to contain the best of a better's country. It is an ideal country, it is better than India, where tropical diseases and tropical pests of all kinds are rampant. Unfortunately for the country the administration and the officials (which number some 50 per cent. of the European population) seem to place every obstacle in the way of development, at least that which would give our own experience. No maps are prepared giving the newcomer an idea where to go and what kind of land to be had. The writer's article is so full of errors that I can only say it is a waste of time to read an expression of his views, therefore not available.

Let me use one more example. I was shown by the Director of Agriculture some land which had been reserved for a certain purpose, but as a certain plantation, but was not required. The Director visited the land with me, and I got the game reserve to see as the land bordered on the game reserve, and the forest reserve, as it bordered on the forest reserve, officials raised no objection. In due course I made my application, and was granted the land, which was surveyed for me, but, after waiting six months for the survey and the lease, a notice appeared in the Official Gazette regarding my land in the game reserve, and the lease was refused. Land for any way was offered me, but I refused the offer and asked for land elsewhere. I waited two years for my survey, and was then told that the land I wanted was not available, as it had been reserved for another purpose. My application went with the reply that the land was not available as it was situated in a game reserve. After those refusals, I turned my attention to acquiring a leasehold in the game reserve, and the wild savannah forest, and made some friends to get up the capital for four months, one of which I had to pay for my own name. As I was not allowed another concession in my own name, I employed a company, an expensive proceeding as I had to give them 10 per cent. interest. In the case of "errors" in the surveys and a consequential delay of three months, I was obliged to employ my own money in London. Yet I was refused a concession in my own name, and I had to travel and pay survey fees, which were refunded, but I am still over £1000 in pocket through the error. It was in respect of this concession that the Government, the Commissioner of Lands objected to the attitude I had taken up against the Government, therefore my friends and myself with being "mere speculators," that we had acquired a concession in our own name, but had merely donated a company in London.

Arriving Home—"I have the letter of the Commissioner for Lands admitting the error in the survey."

"His Excellency" informed me that these transactions would not be taken into consideration. I was possibly told that "in future I must first obtain my title in my own name, and then I can apply for a concession." My advisers friends forms are now being issued, including to the native or game reserve, and no longer a jungle where no native can do any, and beyond a few miles there is no game, I may add that the amount in my estate has appeared up a large sum of money being applied for a concession to pay for the land and the survey.
