**OFFICIAL SALARIES**  
A QUESTION IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS.  
In the House of Commons on May 31 Lord Bessendish Bechtold asked the Secretary of State for the Colonies whether the salaries of officials in British East Africa have been reduced if so, upon what basis and whether a similar reduction will take place in those of British East African dependents.  
The Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies (Mr. Edward Wood) said: No reduction has been made in the substantive salaries of Government officials in the British East African Dependencies. A reduction has, however, been made of financial stringency has been found necessary in the special temporary local allowance which has been granted since the 1st of April, 1920 to European officials in Kenya Uganda and the Tanganyika Territory. This allowance, at the rate of 50 per cent of sterling salary was granted for two years in the first instance to compensate officials for the fact that, owing to currency changes, their sterling salaries were to be converted locally at 10 shillings instead of 15 rupees to the pound. The allowance has now been reduced to 20 per cent of sterling salary. The other East African Dependencies, whose currency is different, and where no local allowance is paid, are not affected by the decision.

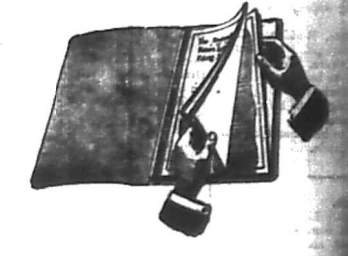

The chief cause of the trouble was that neither of the teams turned out to full strength, the game suffering accordingly. As far as competition matches are concerned there is a further element to be considered—the football public. Whether rightly or wrongly, for the moment does not matter, but the Football Association has decided that a "fine" shall be charged for all competitive matches. The public who therefore pay to see a match do not expect to have to go up to a ground, pay, and then see the sort of game that was put up on Wednesday.

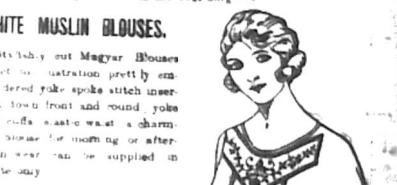

CLOSING SCENES IN THE FIGHT FOR SACKVILLE STREET

NATIONAL TROOPS WIN AMID FLOOD & FIRE

Destruction of Many Important Buildings

THE ELUSIVE DE VALERA.

The Battle of Dublin is reported as having reached its closing stages with the victory of the National Forces. Sackville Street and O'Connell Street and their Hotels have been the scene of heavy fighting and many important Rebel Prisoners have been taken.

Heavy Fighting took place in the morning.

London, July 4. Heavy fighting took place in the morning, the National forces employing smoke-bombs to cover their rushes against the O'Connell Street stronghold... National troops were heavily machine-gunned by buildings whose few defenders were compelled repeatedly to change their positions by means of tanks in order to concentrate on the defence of particular points.

Sackville Street Siege.

After a day of relentless rifle and machine-gun firing, the Free State troops are gradually closing in on the rebels' stronghold. They have barricaded the ends in Sackville Street, the fall of which is regarded as imminent. It was reported last night that one of the buildings was aflame.

Irregulars on the northern bank.

Irregulars on the northern bank are holding up trains and seizing supplies. They are fortifying Glenavon Castle in West Donegal and have seized Lord Templemore's residence on Inch Island. General O'Duffy, Chief of Staff of the National Army, in an interview said he was absolutely satisfied that the revolt in Dublin was broken.

In the Provinces

A communique from Dublin reports substantial progress in the county districts. All important centres in the midlands are now held by National forces including Kilsenny, Allilua, Mullingar, Longford, Trim, and Nenagh.

Local volunteers in South Tipperary assisted National troops in capturing Irregulars from the route to Clonmel.

The National forces have scored further successes in Donegal, capturing a number of Irregular parties and controlling all the approaches by land and sea, making it impossible to reinforce the rebels.

The surrender of Sackville Street followed an all-night sniping in Dublin by remnants of the Irregulars who were still firing from the windows of the Granville Hotel with an inferno of flames on either side. The last of the occupants of the Granville Hotel surrendered at three o'clock.

O'Connell Street Siege.

The last stand of the Irregulars in O'Connell Street was marked by a stubborn defence and regular counter-attacks even after the Granville Hotel was aflame. They fired from the upper floors and being close-guarded
