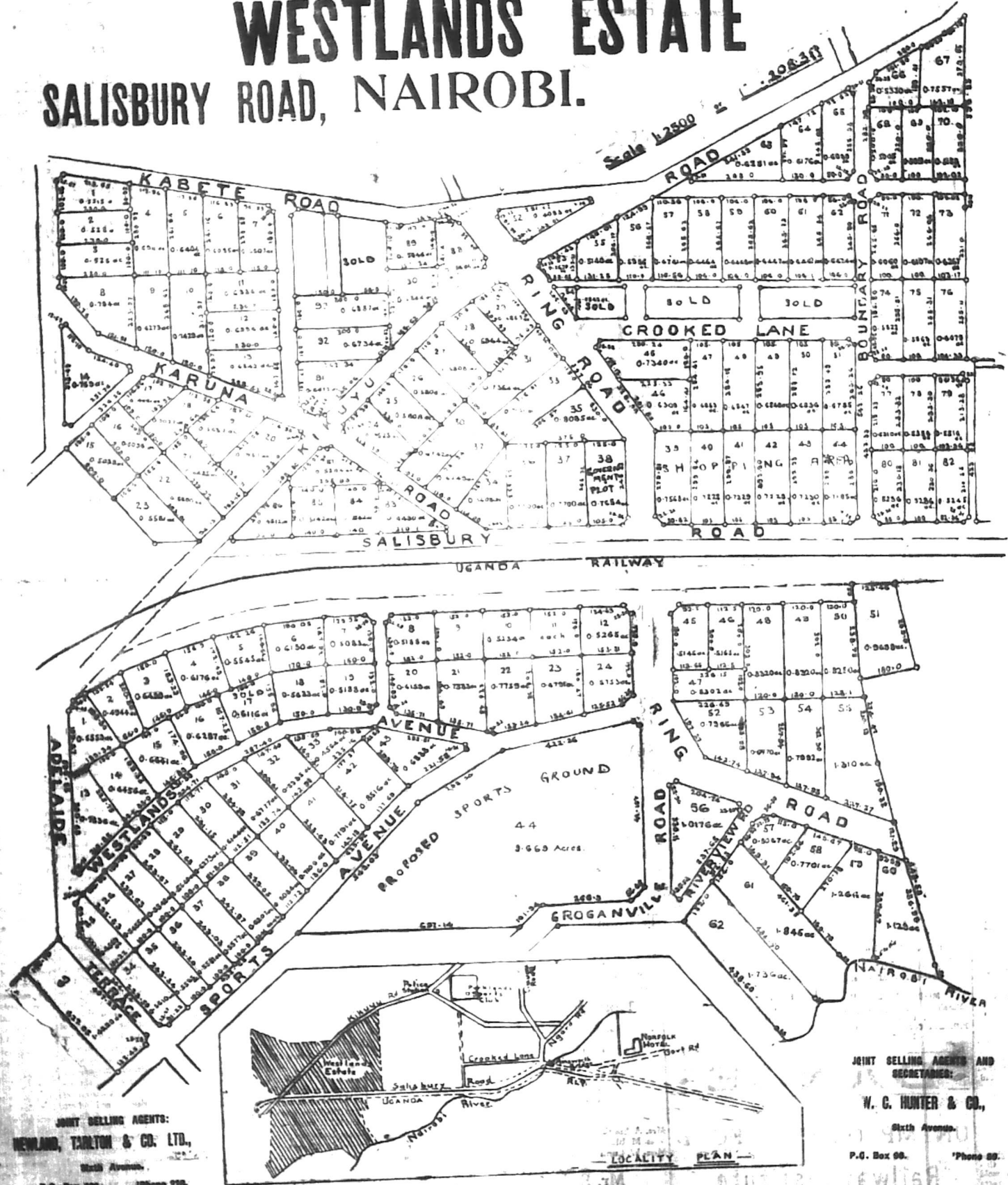

LABOUR DIFFICULTY ON THE NEW LINE.
FLAX GRADING.
(From Our Own Correspondent.)
Your readers will know that I have the subject of flax on the brain and no wonder. Every week I drum away on the same monotonous note. "Liffidance!" Well, let us now change the note and call it "Apathy." Both are expressive of the position adopted by the flax growers on the Plateau; they have known for some time that the Government export grades are to be withdrawn at the end of this month, and though they made a spasmodic effort to get him retained for another year which the Department has turned down, the flax growers will not make the slightest effort of their own initiative with the object of coming to terms with the grader in order to keep on on the Plateau.

In future, flax grading will be performed by Government licensed graders, and enough graders only will be licensed to cope with the work. REPORT OF FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION MEETING.

TRANSFERS OF PLAYERS.

The following is the report of the meeting of the Kenya Football Association Council, which was held at the Secretary's Office on Monday, July 10, 1922, at 4 p.m. when were present: Mr. W. W. Hillier (Chairman), Messrs. Gower, Gaudin, Willey, Rev. Orr, Watson, Alabrah, Mansaray, Field and the Secretary (Mr. Lester).

Members Representation.
The Secretary reported that the Mombasa Club had appointed Mr. May—who was in attendance—as representative on the Council. The Chairman in charge, Mr. May pointed out that Mr. May would not have a vote, but could speak on any matter concerning Mombasa Club.

Finance Committee.
The Report of the Finance Committee of July 4, was submitted. A Visit—The Chairman of the Finance Committee reported the result of the interview with the General Manager, Uggwa, on the matter of obtaining a reduction in the charges for refreshments; to the effect that the Railway could not grant any reduction.

Ground Cup.
Railway Funds—The result of the interview with the General Manager in connection with this matter was that he was unable to provide any reduction in the charges for refreshments; at present charged, but that Council could apply to the Railway Board to have the matter further considered.

After discussion it was resolved that the Secretary should write to the Railway Board, through the General Manager asking for a further reduction in refreshment charges for teams travelling on the Railway. It was further resolved that Council should apply to the Railway Board for an increase in the number of concession fares granted from 16 to 20.

Team Expenses.—After discussion it was resolved that Railway fares be paid to teams as an advance against expenses, which may be incurred in travelling in connection with "Ground" cup ties. This ruling only to apply to the present season.

Subject to the above the report was adopted.

Selection Committee.
The following motion was moved by Mr. Gower—"That this Council lay down as an instruction to future selection committees that teams shall not be handed to press for publication until cleared by each of the members of the committee present at a meeting duly convened."

The motorists, and other mercantile men and women of this Colony had not really needed the indictment of the Government and Railways of Kenya that Messrs Smith Mackenzie and Co., as agents for the British Imperial Oil Co. Ltd., provide in their letter to-day in order to convince them that up to a very recent date indeed these twin indictments had reached a very dangerous efficiency as instruments of suffocation of all the lively, struggling industries and enterprises of the Colony? And some energetic measure of public response will be evoked by the Company's appeal for assistance in getting things made more easy for the importer and consumer of petrol. Almost complete silence has lately descended over the negotiations as to a petrol storage site at the Coast, and the public know little of any transactions in this connection more recent than the two equally inspired proposals to place the site either near a certain store, or adjacent to the only wireless installation in the country. The British Imperial Oil Co. Ltd., can rely on unreserved popular support in doing their utmost to make arrangements as the earliest possible date for the importation of motor spirit in bulk, and we do not think that an appeal under this head, addressed to the Bowring Committee, would fall on deaf ears. We trust one will be made. Similarly, we would support any reasonable agitation for the alleviation of the extravagant and altogether disproportionate rates charged for general freight on the Uganda Railway, and on this head, too, we would suggest to the Company itself, and to that astounding conjurer of all difficulties, the R.E.A.A., a strong representation to the Economic and Finance Committee on the ground that, as the Company points out and the public opinion confirms, "motor spirit is not a luxury, but a necessity to the Colony." Railway freight to Nairobi, the Company states, is more than 7/6 per case. The other impositions total some 4/6—Customs duty and consumption tax, and we must beg leave, on this item, to part company with the British Imperial Oil Company. For the imperative need of the Colony at the moment is revenue, and until we are confronted with very much more detailed, documented and impressive evidence than the "considered opinion" belonging to no indicated person or group, be it noted—to which the Company refers as an evidence that the "Colony's developments will be greatly hampered by the aforesaid impositions," we shall defend the taxes, which, it may be observed, fall on those businesses, such as printing works, equally with those at whose desire, in order to avoid motor taxation, the consumption duty was imposed. We would like to be furnished with statistics and data in support of this "considered opinion." The development of the Colony from the point of view of ownership and use of motor vehicles as evidenced by the constantly increasing clientele of the R.E.A.A. does not appear to have been gravely jeopardized by the collection, as revenue, of something like 10 per cent of the total cost of petrol in Nairobi. We regret this point of divergence from the Company. We could have wished to go all the way in this complete harmony we feel with their denunciations of Government dilatoriness, and lack of vision and the crushing, murderous rates on the railway. But our sorrow deepens. As the good intentions of the "Shell" proprietors are gradually unaided by their agents, and we are becoming prepared to regard these wealthy monopolists as our very good friends invested with a beneficent purpose just as well as our omnipotent, we crash into disquiet or as orthodox statements such as "comparisons cannot be drawn between the price of motor spirit in England and this country." "Consumers should be careful not to believe statements as to very low prices applying in other areas." "Our principals . . . have the interests of the consumers well to heart." These and other statements need amplification, we feel. And we recall sorrowfully that last year the "Shell" Company declared a dividend of 27 1/2 per cent, a decline from the previous year's figure, 35 per cent. We try to assess by how much that very comforting return would be reduced by say, approximating the landed price of petrol in Kenya with that obtaining in England, for instance, for just one year, and we feel almost disposed to beg that, since the difficulties of supplying Kenya are so considerable compared with conditions that attend supply in England, the losses and the gains should be roughly pooled, and this poverty-stricken, ill-equipped land be allowed to gain some additional property to the eventual gain not only of itself but of the Shell Company as well. After all, 27 1/2 per cent is a good profit even in these days. But to be serious, we are no supporters of the selfish and unthinking criticism that is so often levelled
