ADVANCE KENYA. We publish to-day perhaps the most interesting Customs and Shipping return that has been given us for many months past, one that is calculated to put heart into many producers who have gone through the thin time consequent on fallen or dead markets and certainly to cheer the coffee planter. During the week ending July 29 no fewer than 4538 bags of Kenya coffee went to the world markets, among the ports of destination being Zanzibar, Aden, Port Said, Durban, London, Havre and Rotterdam. Provided prices remain steady and the coffee shipped has received the attention this expensive crop demands and is up to quality no inconsiderable sum of money will come into the Colony and find its way into increased plantations, and bring some badly needed measure of prosperity to the planter and, incidentally to the natives. There are further pleasing features in the list of exports, and not the least of them the 76 cases of beam that have gone to London. We read the other day of a local ham having been thoroughly appreciated in London: We hope next to learn that the difficulties of export connected with pig products have been overcome and that Kenya hams and bacon have taken the place of those at present purchased in markets outside the Empire. It has been claimed by every pig expert who has ever visited Kenya that the Colony is peculiarly adapted for pig-breeding and is capable of producing an animal that will in turn produce hams and bacon second to none. On the strength of all that producers have heard many have been induced to take up this branch of farming

and in some cases, on a large scale, and the cry has become a common one that there is no market. In fairness to the settler who has harkened to the voice of those who have induced him to launch out into an industry that he otherwise might not have touched, every effort should be strained to continue and increase the export trade that we are pleased to see has evidently begun and to enlarge local factories to an extent that will enable them to handle a larger number of pigs than they can under existing circumstances. Wattle bark makes its appearance on the export list after a considerable time, and goes, we notice, to the Continent. Sisal, Flax, Ground Nuts in fair quantity and potatoes are other items worth noticing and perhaps particularly the last named in view of the reduced railway freights.

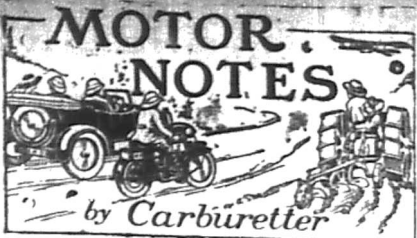

The modern car is really a masterpiece of mechanism. I have run to date 7,700 miles in my Hispano and so far have never been stopped on the road...

Last Sunday night was quite an experience I had to take a passenger who had to catch the Nairobi Mail train into Nakuru and it was very tedious. I left the farm at 4.15 p.m. and started running down a very steep escarpment for the first 1 1/2 miles...

Arriving at Nakuru I found the train had just arrived, but of course it was at the extreme end of the long platform, and it was deluging rain and I should like, incidentally, to compliment the Uganda Railway on having such an efficient Stationmaster, who could not have been more helpful and civil.

Nairobi-Arusha.

I have just received the following letter from Mr. Egleston of Messrs G. North and Sons, who left last week for Arusha, and as I think it would be of interest to readers I append it herewith.

Dear Carburettor,

I finished Arusha without mishap and found the B.E.A.A.A report on the road most helpful. I am told by Mr. Hubble, however, that the road is worse now owing to the heavy rains in March last.

From the Waterworks to Heat House is very bad indeed and I have to travel by the side of the old road most of the way. I spent the first night at Kajajao in Mr. McHardy's house, the journey from Nairobi having taken four hours.

The next day I continued to Longido West in nine hours. The road is very good until the drifts near Ngwangu was passed. The bridge over the sand-drift about 2 miles from Kedonges is still standing, and although I was heavily laden it did not appear to give at all. About three miles before Ngwangu there are patches of sand, and I had some trouble to get through one of them. The bridge over the second drift from Ngwangu has disappeared and I crossed about 20 yards or so to the left.

The crossing is very steep at the side and I had to unload the car to get up the further bank. The third crossing is tackled about 200 yards to the right and is quite easy. At Longido West the road forks, and the right fork leads to Arusha. I mention this because I hear that the car which proceeded me a week before took the wrong road here and went miles out of its way. The left road is the Mochi road and is, I think, impossible. While the first 12 miles through the desert are excellent, the rest of the road to Bekker's farm is very bad. From Bekker's farm, too, it is rather bad for about twelve miles and the sand on one hill was so bad that I had to drop into bottom gear to force my way down-hill.

I saw very few natives on the road, and if one were in difficulties it would be very hard to get any assistance. I think. Somewhere on the road near Bimbi there is an Indian duka I believe. There is also an Indian duka at Ngwangu, so it is necessary to camp on the road one night. From Nairobi to Arusha I took 48 hours, actual time driving 18 hours. It is no easy ride, and I advise no one to attempt the journey unless their car is in good order, and if possible get someone else to accompany them in case of trouble.

They tell me that the road from Arusha to Mochi is now repaired and in good condition. I am going on there later.

Motoring at Home.

I have had a visit this week from Mr. Lawson who has just come out from Europe, and looks very fit and the signs of health again.

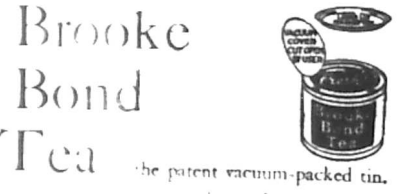

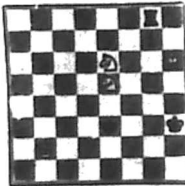

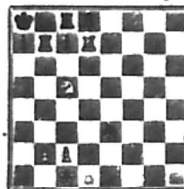

NEW RAILWAY FROM HWANZA TO TABORA.

COMPETITION WITH U.R.

In the course of a leading article entitled "A Paramount Duty," the *Dar-es-Salaam Times* says: "The extraordinary development in Cotton production in the Mwanza district induces us to return to the charge of the necessity for the completion of the projected line, (which has already been partially constructed) between Tabora and Mwanza. We are well aware that the first cry raised will be 'We have not got the money!' but when it becomes a question of the country's material benefit, it devolves on our government to use every possible endeavour to raise the money as a loan from the Imperial Government, for a construction which will eventually pay for itself, and which will incidentally help vitally the territory's progress. All the benefit from that wealthy area is at present going to the neighbouring colony of Kenya, and will continue to do so for years to come unless our Administration, by a progressive measure, divert it into the natural outlet through the territory. This point has on previous occasions been raised, and His Excellency Sir Horace Byatt has pronounced emphatically against the scheme, one of his reasons being the sentimental one of not desiring to take into competition with the Uganda Railway, which was one of the undertakings of the German project and partially completed construction. While sentiment in its right place is to be admired, it is especially more important for the local administration to concentrate on the development of the country that is to be concerned about the feeding of the Uganda Railway Administration on this matter. The present mode of transport from Mwanza to sea board is first by steamer on Victoria Nyanza to Kasumu, then by road to Malindi, 587 miles, with the double handling at the ports and delays consequent thereupon. On the other hand, from Mwanza to Malindi the projected line is about 200 miles, and from Tabora to Dar-es-Salaam 416 miles, making a total of about 716 miles, with what would be a through traffic, no double handling, no delays, the opening up of a large area of valuable resources, and an incentive to the railway to increase its rolling stock. The substantial benefits would easily be repaid with interest, and would give rise to a considerable concentration of traffic from the Lake area and portion of Uganda, thus without necessarily putting ourselves into competition with the Uganda Railway. It could be as great a boon to the producers of the Lake area as to the producers of the Mwanza district. The German project in relation to competing with the Uganda Railway had in view the development of an important territory. As in the case of the Central Railway, the Lake-Mwanza line would pass through certain arid portions but the hinterland which would be developed thereby would be of great value in grain and in cattle raising, even apart from the extra-territorial development in cotton production. No doubt we overlooked the possibility of important mineral deposits in the area, which would be opened up. Reports of gold discoveries continue to reach us, and although they are not yet developed sufficiently to allow one to judge whether large goldfields will result, it must be remembered that during the German regime a considerable auriferous area was being explored with good results in the district the mines and plant are still awaiting further exploitation. As regards Cotton the British Cotton Association's counter-claiming that the Mwanza district is a tremendous area for cotton planting is available. Last year as a result of only 30 tons of seed distributed 222,000 lbs. of ginned lint were returned, for the 1922 crop, 35 tons of seed were distributed, and a very much larger yield is naturally to be anticipated. Last year this quantity will be augmented considerably. Everything points to the necessity for the speedy completion of the Tabora-Mwanza section of line. Surveys are completed, earth works have already been built for 180 kilometres, and complete line laid for 40 kilometres by the Germans. If our Administration have the true welfare of the territory at heart they will leave no stone unturned to push on the fulfilment of the projected line. It is a paramount duty to develop every possible source of wealth as well as every available source of supply of indispensable commodities. Furthermore, increased traffic facilities will mean a large increase in trade.

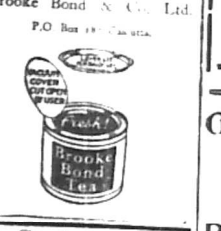

It is not possible to discuss a single article in a journal of the very extensive nature of the proposals of the Economic and Financial Committee regarding the Budget. But it is possible to give to that Committee and the Government, the very warmest of praise for the evident thoroughness of their work and the general soundness of the suggestions they have made under conditions that have doubtless militated against their endeavours to secure economy with no loss of efficiency than the country's services possess at present. The statement we publish this morning is a monument of careful and sound consideration on the part of the Committee and of his identification with the aspirations and will of the public. To those who say that it is also obviously considered an indictment of Governmental extravagance or incompetence or both we reiterate that it is still a Crown Colony with a Government responsible only to Downing Street and the British Public; and that there would thus have been a case for His Excellency the Governor in refusing the advice tendered by un-official members of the community and of rejecting their demands. Sir Edward Northey took the bolder and more proper step of inviting the advice of the public, and the measure of the benefits that that advice and help has been and will increasingly prove to be to the country is the true criterion of Sir Edward Northey's success as a Governor. He deserves at least and now the credit of initiative and of adventure into principle and methods of Colonial Government that had never before been tried. The significance of that act for the future of the Colony and of Imperial policy is far too often overlooked though it cannot well be exaggerated. It will be recalled that in his speech some two months ago Major Grogan indicated an ideal budget of £1,200,000 in 1923. It is a matter of satisfaction that that figure has been so nearly reached. Details of the proposals must await further consideration. At the moment we would draw attention to the reduction by His Excellency of his Duty Allowance, to the far from wholly satisfactory decrease in the Secretariat to the implication, in the Native Affairs Department, that the Native Affairs Department will cease to the reversion to the old provincial system and to the proposed amalgamation of the Police and Military Forces. There is evidence of a reduction of the salaries of heads of departments that we whole-heartedly welcome, though at present it seems to be restricted to posts as they become vacant. It is gratifying to learn that the Medical Services in the Reserves are to remain unimpaired while the elimination of free dentistry for officials will, we may hope, be followed by reconsideration of the principles and incidence of medical assistance. The Chief Veterinary Officer and the Director of Agriculture are to be one office, a step that, largely unobjectionable in principle, must be examined carefully in practice. The P.W.D. is to be kept in being a step on the wisdom of which we have previously expressed our view and the Local Allowance is to go finally. The Committee propose to consider the necessity for suggesting adjustments in the emoluments and conditions of service. That seems an unnecessary elaborate and tentative combination of words, seeing that the necessity is obvious to most, and the withdrawal of the Local Allowance will make but more clear that the gross inequalities of a Service that has the initial failing of deriving so much of its attractiveness to recruits and of its cost to the taxpayer from pensions equally ambiguous and equally badly devised as the Local Allowance. The work of the Committee is by no means complete, and the absence from the present statement of any reference to such Departments as Education, for instance, indicates the difficulty and importance of work yet to be done. GIROUARD CUP SEMI-FINAL
Parklands Defeated by Four Clear Goals
MOMBASA CARRY ALL BEFORE THEM
THREE GOALS SCORED INSIDE TEN MINUTES

Saturday was a late day as far as the football public of Nairobi is concerned, when the powerful team from Mombasa visited the capital in order to try conclusions with Parklands in the semi-final of the Girovard Cup. Since Mombasa entered for this trophy three seasons ago, the matches that they have been engaged in have always been the centres of the keenest interest, inasmuch as that team has never yet been defeated. The team arrived from Mombasa on Friday afternoon, accompanied by a moderate band of supporters, and during Saturday morning the large number of blue and white rosettes seen in the town demonstrated that the visitors were favoured in some quarters. The players were also fully confident of being able to repeat the feats of previous seasons. The possibilities of Parklands had been frequently discussed during the previous week, and the home team's sympathisers were at least as confident as the visitors of carrying off the match. The result was that long before the appointed hour Parklands ground was the scene of great animation with crowds arriving early in order to obtain good seats. The arrangements on the ground generally were all that could be desired, and are a compliment to the committee of the club. When the teams took the field, Mombasa leading the way, the largest football crowd for this season anywhere, had gathered round the pitch. Amongst the spectators was Sir Chas. Bowring. Both teams received rousing receptions from the rival supporters, and those who may not have previously known how to spell the name of Kenya's capital town, should now have no difficulty in so doing, considering the number of times that it was spelt over by the Mombasa men. The weather conditions were excellent, and the pitch was perfect.

Mombasa: Fraser, Bo'and and Metcalf; Hills, Higginson and Fairclough; Harding, Morley, Teasdale, Bull and Wickham. Referee: Mr. Pickering. Linesmen: Messrs. Field and Gregson.

First Half.
Parklands won the toss and elected to play towards the club-house goal. Mombasa setting the game going. Mombasa immediately started to force the pace strongly, Morgan having to save a long-dropping shot from Harding. A minute later Hodge mis-kicked the ball again having to be stopped by Morgan. Parklands were by no means out of it, and Mulholland, being very prominent, occasionally got on the

The up and down game continued, and both sides looked like scoring in turn. Montague was given liberty opening by Mulholland, only to fail with his shot. Rifkin, taking a pass from O'Keefe, streaked away down the line and turned in when he was fouled by Bo'and just outside the penalty area. The free-kick went behind. Once again Mombasa ran away, and Wickham sent it a beautiful, fully well-placed centre, and Bayley misjudged the flight of the ball, and headed it to TEASDALE who, working his way in, increased the lead with a shot that gave Morgan no hope.

Mombasa had not yet finished, and within a minute was in again. HARDING got going on the wing, and after beating Howard, came round and shot. Morgan got to it, but the ball rebounded off him into the net.

Yet again Mombasa came on immediately after the kick-off and forced a corner. It was well placed, and BULL getting his foot to it, made it four.

Parklands then pulled themselves together, and for a while had nought of the better of the argument, but in spite of these efforts were unable to reduce the lead.

The game went off badly as time drew nearer, a good deal of the interest falling away. Teasdale distinguished himself with another great long-throw which Morgan saved, otherwise a little of a sensational nature occurred, although Mulholland tried hard, but failed to break through.

Time eventually arrived with Mombasa winners by a comfortable margin.

The Match in General.

The pace was particularly fast for most of the time and the tackling was fairly robust but clean. That Mombasa was the better team no one could deny; in fact, it was markedly so, although there might be some difference of opinion as to whether the superiority was to the value of four clear goals.

Where Mombasa's strength lay was in general combination, apart from the fact that each and every player was in form and played a good game. Fraser in goal was not given a great deal of work to do, but the rest of the defence were continually in action and did well. The halves were equally good in attack as well as defence, and Higginson, although on the sick list was always prominent. The forwards were always dangerous, and the two wingers worked remarkably well with the centre man, who was a continual source of worry to his opponents.

Parklands were disappointing—very disappointing. Morgan appeared to be one of the few men who was capable of anything great, and but for his goal-keeping the score might have been greater. The whole team seemed to be suffering from nervous prostration during the opening stages of the game.

The backs, Hodge and Wynne played up wonderfully well considering, but they were both erratic and mis-kicked badly once or twice. The halves were the weak link. Hodge worked like a Trojan all the while and was here, there and everywhere, but he had little support from his partners who were right off their game. The forwards,

PLATEAU NOTES

THE NATIVE GRAMMAR AND HIS STOCK.

A PUBLIC MEETING.

The Chamber of Commerce has considered and agreed to a suggestion by the D.E.A. Farmers' Association of Nairobi, for the convenience of all concerned that a standard weight per bag for both maize and maize meal should be universally adopted by the trade and recognised by all bodies calling for tenders, and the public generally, the weights considered to be most convenient for all concerned being 200 lbs. nett for maize and 180 lbs. nett for maize meal.

The Secretary was instructed to communicate with the Plateau Maize Growers' Association, and as this Company is really very much interested.

Rather Unique.

A visitor to Eldoret a few days ago was induced to take a ticket in a raffle for a thoroughbred horse belonging to a well-known resident, as this was the last unsold ticket, the draw took place the same evening and our visitor was the lucky country trying to sell a horse which he is afraid to keep on account of lymph and which nobody is willing to buy for the same reason.

Squatters' Gossip.

The District Committee had a very full meeting a few days ago the sitting taking several hours.

The principal subject, and one which affects the agricultural community, is the number of cattle that squatters should be allowed to keep.

Even what I can gather, the Government has asked for the views of the District Committee upon the question of limiting the number and the proposals as to fix a maximum of ten per squatter when he comes on to a fresh farm with a subsequent maximum allowing for increase and purchase of thirty.

As the Committee was not at all of the same ground, the proposals were brought to the notice of farmers through the agency of the Police Patrol book, and they are being asked to state their views for or against a maximum and what that maximum should be, and the Committee will then take the average.

It occurs to me that the Committee has missed a very important point in connection with this matter and that is what is to happen if a squatter on A's farm starts with ten head, gets to a maximum of thirty in due course by means of increase and purchase, and ultimately wishes to leave that farm to squat on B's farm.

A says "No you cannot go to another farm as you have more than ten head" and B says "Although I want you it is impossible for me to have you as the law says you must not squat on a fresh farm with more than ten, and you possess thirty." So the poor squatter is between the devil and the deep blue sea.

Medical Services.

Government having found it necessary to discontinue responsibility for the cost of maintenance of the Hospital after December of this year it becomes necessary that provision should be made from other sources.

In order to agree upon a scheme by which the necessity for closing down the hospital may be avoided, a public meeting is being held in Eldoret to discuss ways and means.

By the by, we have a Prince and an Earl as patients in the hospital at the present moment.

REPORT BY THE CONFERENCE

The following made up the Committee:—

Anglicans: The Archbishop of York, the Bishops of Gloucester, Peterborough, Ripon, Salisbury, together with Dr. Hamilton, Reginald Professor of Divinity at Oxford, and Dr. Walker from the Nonconformists: Rev. J. D. Jones, M.A., D.D. (Moderator); Rev. A. E. Garvie, M.A., D.D.; Rev. J. Scott Lidgett, M.A.; Rev. A. S. Carnegie Simpson, M.A., D.D.; and Rev. J. H. Shakespeare, M.A., D.D.

The Report, as accepted by the Conference, was as follows:—

On the Nature of the Church.

"1. The foundation of the Church rests not upon the will or consent of beliefs of men, whether as individuals or as societies, but upon the creative Will of God.

"2. The Church is the Body of Christ, and its constitutive principle is Christ Himself, living in His members through His Spirit.

"3. As there is but one Christ, and one Life in Him, so there is and can be but one Church.

"4. This one Church consists of all those who have been, or are being, redeemed by and in Christ, whether in this world, or in the world beyond our sight, but it has its expression in the world in a visible form. Yet the Church as invisible and as visible is, by virtue of its one life in Christ, one.

"5. This visible Church was instituted by Christ as a fellowship of men united with Him, and in Him with one another, to be His witness and His instrument in the spread of His Kingdom on earth.

"6. As a visible Church it must possess certain visible and recognizable marks whereby it can be seen and known by men. These have been since the days of the Apostles at least the following:—(a) The profession of faith in God as revealed and incarnate in Christ; (b) the observance of the two sacraments ordained by Christ Himself; (c) an ideal of the Christian life protected by a common discipline; (d) a ministry, representative of the Church, for the preaching of the Word, the administration of the Sacraments,

"7. Baptism is by the ordinance of Christ, and of His Apostles the outward and visible sign of admission into membership of the Church.

"8. The Church visible on earth ought to express and manifest the one Life in Christ of the one Body.

"9. The true relation of the Church and local Churches is that which is described in the New Testament—namely, that the Churches are the local representatives of the one Church. The actual situation brought about in the course of history in which there are different and even rival denominational Churches independent of each other and existing together in the same locality, whatever justification arising out of historical circumstances may be claimed for these temporary separations, cannot be regarded as a circumstance with the Purpose of Christ and every endeavour ought to be made to restore the true position as set forth in the New Testament.

"10. The marks which ought to characterize the Church visible on earth are possessed by those existing separate Churches and societies of Christian people in very varying degrees of completeness or defect. Hence, even though they be parts of the visible Church, they cannot be considered as all alike giving equally adequate expression to the Lord's mind and purpose. Some, indeed, may be so defective that they cannot rightly be judged to be parts of that Church. But such judgments, though made in trust that they are in accordance with the Divine Mind, must be regarded as limited to the sphere of the visible Church as an ordered society here on earth. It would be presumption to claim that they have a like validity in the sphere of the redeemed in Christ, for within that sphere judgment can only be given by the All-knowing Mind and Sovereign Mercy of God."

The Ministry.

"1. A Ministry of the Word and Sacrament is a Divine ordinance for the Church, and has been since the days of the Apostles an integral part of its organized life.

"2. It is a ministry within the Church exercising representatively, in the Name and by the authority of the Lord, Who is the Head of the Church, the powers and functions which are inherent in the Church.

"3. It is a ministry of the Church, and not merely of any part thereof.

"4. No man can take this ministry upon himself. It must be conferred by the Church, acting through those who have authority given to them in the Church to confer it. There must be not only an inward call of the Spirit, but also an outward and visible call and commission by the Church.

"5. It is in accordance with Apostolic practice and the ancient custom of the Church that this commission should be given through Ordination, with prayer and the laying on of hands by those who have authority given to them to ordain.

"6. We believe that in ordination, together with the commission to minister Divine Grace is given through the Holy Spirit in response to prayer and faith for the fulfilment of the charge so committed."
