**CATTLE DISEASES**

Below is the Veterinary Report for the month of July, 1922, presented to the Director of Agriculture by the Chief Veterinary Officer.

**Rinderpest.**

No fresh outbreaks reported. Quarantine for previous outbreaks have been revoked in the Lumbwa and Eldoret Districts.

**Pleuro-Pneumonia Contagiosa.**

One fresh outbreak reported from Kericho. In the Eldoret District one quarantine remains for a previous outbreak and one quarantine has been revoked. In the Nakuru District a previous outbreak caused a mortality of thirty animals. Incubations have been carried out.

**Foot and Mouth Disease.**

No fresh outbreaks reported. In the Nakuru District the quarantine for a previous outbreak has been revoked.

**Horse Sickness.**

In the Nairobi District eight cases have been reported with only one recovery. Fourteen deaths have been reported from the Naivasha and Gilgil Districts. The high mortality recorded in the Veterinary report for the Month of June, from the Nakuru District was mostly confined to the Naivasha area.

**East Coast Fever.**

From the Nairobi district eleven fresh cases have been reported and two cases from the Eldoret district have been confirmed. Previous outbreaks have been reported from the Districts of Nyeri (2), Mombasa (2), Nakuru (1). One fresh outbreak has been reported from Lumbwa.

**Epizootic Lymphangitis.**

One fresh case reported from Nakuru.

**Ulcerative Lymphangitis.**

From the Eldoret district nine fresh cases have been reported.

Five animals have been destroyed. Five cases have been confirmed in the Kericho district, two of which have been destroyed. Two fresh cases have been reported from Lumbwa, and two cases previously reported remain in quarantine.

**Trypanosomiasis.**

One fresh outbreak of horine trypanosomiasis and one case of canine trypanosomiasis, reported from the Nairobi district. Ten farms remain in quarantine and quarantine has been revoked on two farms. One outbreak previously reported from the Lumbwa District.

**Blackquarter.**

One outbreak reported from the Nairobi District.

**Swine Fever.**

From the Nakuru District one old outbreak is reported with a high mortality.

**Piroplasmiasis.**

One case reported from the Nairobi District.

**White Scour.**

Nakuru, one fresh outbreak causing four deaths.

**Purulent Dermatitis; Sheep and Goats.**

Nakuru, one fresh outbreak causing four deaths.

**Sheep and Goat Fox.**

From the Nyeri District one previous outbreak.

**Equine Malign.**

Nakuru, one fresh outbreak.

**Tuberculosis.**

One previous outbreak remains in quarantine in the Lumbwa District.



**An Anomaly.**  
It is hardly necessary to add that the greatest cleanliness is insisted upon and before the native milkers sit down to the pail they wash the cow's udder and their own hands. Kavirondo's, but only three or four of them, are employed for this work, because they are used to the double handed system of milking in their own homes. They have, of course, to be carefully treated before they are considered fit to be trusted with these valuable animals. All the trouble and attention that the conscientious modern dairymen throw into his work really deserves a question to be asked: why all this thoroughness is going on at the farm under review, between it and Nairobi the primitive Somali, endowed by permission to use for nothing the public lands, is able to undercut, with his very doubtful and insanitary supply, the cost-paying so-called European.

Amongst Mr. Ayre's sixty-six cattle are some whose names recall many famous prize-winning strains of this grand breed. But he is by nature a true countryman who has loved cattle all his life; and he came into the world that business situation and detailed order and accuracy that are an essential stock-trade of the thorough accountant.

**A Memorial to the Governor.**  
 Nairobi, 4th May, 1922.  
 May it please your Excellency,  
 Under instructions from my  
 client, George Mugakenji—brother  
 of Harry Thuku—given prior to  
 his arrest at Kiambu I have the  
 honour to approach your Excellency  
 in connection with the arrest and  
 removal of (1) Harry Thuku and (2)  
 George Mugakenji.  
 As the outset I would beg to state  
 that I have undertaken this work  
 on very definite understanding that  
 all I would do for my clients had to  
 be done on absolutely constitu-  
 tional grounds and with a view to,  
 if possible, get the Government of  
 your Excellency to show some ele-  
 mency to my clients. The Ordinance  
 No. 18 of 1920, under which  
 my clients are deported, very clearly  
 lays down that your Excellency has  
 absolute power in the matter of the  
 removal of natives, but before this  
 power can be exercised it must be  
 shown that there shall be sufficient evi-  
 dence on oath to satisfy Your Excel-  
 lency of the genuineness of the  
 charge.  
 As far as I am instructed neither  
 of my clients have the slightest  
 notion what the evidence against  
 them amounts to or, by whom it  
 was given and in what manner.  
 Evidence on oath according to the  
 Indian Evidence Act, which is in  
 force in this country, means state-  
 ment of witnesses made on oath in  
 their examination-in-chief and also  
 includes statements made by them  
 in cross-examination and re-exam-  
 ination. It is not evidence unless  
 until it is subjected to cross-exam-  
 ination by the party accused or his  
 advocate and furthermore it cannot  
 be set until it has been so sub-  
 jected. I have referred to this im-  
 portant matter of cross-examination

of evidence because I am of opinion  
 that the provisions of the Ordinance  
 that a native can be removed (de-  
 ported) on evidence on oath which  
 satisfies the Governor of the Colony,  
 can scarcely have been said to have  
 been carried out when such evidence  
 taken on oath had not been subject-  
 ed to the said test of cross-examina-  
 tion. I presume of course that there  
 was no such cross-examination and  
 do so from the almost dramatic cir-  
 cumstances which attended George  
 Mugakenji's arrest the particulars of  
 which I, above all people, am best  
 able to furnish. One afternoon  
 George Mugakenji asked me to get  
 out to Kiambu to interview Mr.  
 Hope who was finally settling the  
 question of a chief for the Goshu-  
 cum community. I had been en-  
 gaged for this matter some weeks  
 previous. I accordingly took  
 George in my car and drove out to  
 Kiambu. One the way I thought I  
 recognised Mr. Hope going into  
 Nairobi. I nevertheless went on  
 Nairobi. On arrival at Kiambu I sent  
 George up to the District Commissioner's  
 Office to see if Mr. Hope had actu-  
 ally left. As George did not return  
 for some time I made enquiries and  
 found he had been arrested. I im-  
 mediately went on and saw Mr.  
 Campbell, the District Commis-  
 sioner, who confirmed the fact of  
 George's arrest on a warrant signed  
 by Your Excellency which was  
 given me—Mr. Campbell could  
 however give me no details.  
 Now George had been in my office  
 for several days and was evidently  
 absolutely unconcerned about any  
 action the Government was taking  
 against him, which to my mind  
 clearly goes to show a certain  
 amount of innocence. In any case  
 he was not aware of any evidence  
 having been recorded against him,  
 and I think I am safe in saying he  
 certainly was given no opportunity  
 to cross-examine the evidence prior  
 to his arrest nor does it appear to  
 me that Thuku was given the  
 chance to do so.  
 I have referred to the matter of  
 evidence given on oath not being  
 subjected to cross-examination  
 because I feel that the value of such  
 evidence is particularly attenuated  
 nothing of in any case has not that  
 sufficiency of value which would en-  
 able Your Excellency to act in ac-  
 cordance with the provisions of the

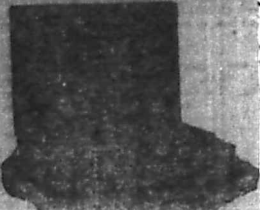

Philadelphia, August 17.  
The majority of people who went to Goodwood were prepared for anything. They remembered Ascot, when the weather was about as unpropitious as it possibly could be. They accordingly wore clothes that would do for winter, or which might do for summer, or which might do for both. Up to the middle of the week they have been fairly fortunate.

The opening day (Tuesday) was a little fine; the second day, while it presented no sunshine, was not so bad as it might have been. The rain only fell in the evening. As a result, people enjoyed themselves very thoroughly, and the racing itself was quite good.

The Stewards' Cup yielded a surprise, however, since Tetrameter, owned by Sir Henry McCalmont, won easily, the favourite being Hamstead. The number of runners, thirty, was the largest since 1892, when there was a field of the same dimensions.

At Liverpool on Tuesday last week, five favourites won out of six races. There was, too, some good racing at Hurs Park on Saturday, the best event being the Two-Year Old Plate, which was won by Le Lincaster.  
Royalty has patronised Goodwood the same as usual, and it has certainly been a social event. Up to the present, however, most people are disappointed that Captain Cuttle, the winner of the Derby, has not yet competed. There is no doubt that this horse is immensely popular, though some affect to depreciate its ability on the ground that it has not yet been sufficiently tested.

### HOME TRADE

#### LATEST REPORT OF FINANCIAL OUTLOOK.

#### REPARATION PROBLEM.

Messrs. Wigginworth & Co., Ltd. in their Fortnightly Report dated July 20, state:

"The markets in general have been quieter during the last two weeks, mainly owing to seasonal influences, but labour unrest in the United States, and the erratic movements of the Continental exchanges, particularly that of Germany, have been a check to progress. The Reparation question has now become of supreme importance, for with each fall in the value of the mark the value of the taxes raised by Germany diminishes, and the breach between expenditure and revenue widens. The matter will no doubt be brought to a head with the coming Conference in London.

"The encroachment of debts is in the air. America seems to welcome the suggestion of Great Britain renouncing all her claims upon her Allies as a solution which no doubt commends itself also to our Continental friends. The high opinion of Britain's ability to meet all claims upon her while renouncing her claims on others is certainly flattering to the national esteem, but the resulting burden on the industry of the country, which has to deliver the goods, has still to be measured.

"The strength of the pound sterling is for the moment greatly helped by the competition of the Continental nations to secure a stable unit of value in exchange for their own depreciated currencies, and it is significant in this connection to note the large volume of deposits held by the principal banks of the United Kingdom in face of falling values in this country.

"In the twelve months ending the 30th June, 1923, the deposits of the five big banks show a shrinkage of only about 1 per cent. from 1,620 to 1,600 million sterling, while loans and advances in the same time, have shrunk from 735 to 655 millions, i.e. over 10 per cent. The high appreciation of sterling renders export trade very difficult for Great Britain and the Board of Trade figures throw some light on the subject.

"While the average cost of our imports this year was 50 per cent. above pre-war and of our exports only 23 per cent. above pre-war the cost of the exports of United Kingdom produce was over double the pre-war figures. It goes without saying that high prices reduce sales, and the following figures may be of interest from this point of view.

"Our exports of manufactured goods during the first half of 1923 compare even less favourably with 1913, the value on the 1913 basis being only 83 per cent. of the pre-war year.

"A welcome announcement is made by the Port of London Authority and other London wharfers, a further reduction of twenty points in the percentage addition levied on dock and warehouse charges being conceded. The import and export rates on goods now stand at 73 per cent. above pre-war, in place of the previous 93 per cent. while rent on goods and dock dues on shipping are reduced from 25 per cent. to 20 per cent.

"The movement of the exchanges in the last few weeks has been governed mainly by political hopes and fears, but on balance since the beginning of the month the French and Italian exchanges show very little change. Berlin has suffered a depreciation of about 20 per cent. We give our usual list of exchanges:-

**OVERSEAS TRADE**

**BRITISH EXPORTS AND COLONIAL LOANS.**  
(From Our Own Correspondent.)  
London, July 27.  
Kenya Colony and East Africa generally will be interested in a question and reply in the House of Commons last night.  
The Parliamentary Secretary to the Overseas Trade Department was asked if he would state in figures what effect increased borrowings in London by foreign and Colonial Governments during the last six months had had upon our exports; and whether he would make representations to be made to the Treasury, the Bank of England and the London Joint Stock banks to co-operate and by the usual financial processes to encourage, firstly, Colonial and Empire trade, and secondly, Allied trade, before offering similar facilities to foreign countries.  
In reply, Sir Philip Lloyd-Greame said it had been computed that during the first six months of the current year foreign governments borrowed in Great Britain only £13,100,000, as against £41,800,000 borrowed by governments within the Empire in the same period. British exports amounted to £251,700,000. It would therefore, be appreciated that the volume of capital borrowings on the London market by foreign and Colonial Governments was small in relation to the value of exports, and variations in the latter totals were dependent upon many factors. As regards the last part of the question he did not think it necessary to make the representations suggested, since there was no reason to suppose that the raising of loans by foreign governments in the London Money Market had any prejudicial effect upon Imperial trade.

**COTTON**

**THE LEVY AND SOME OF ITS LESSONS.**  
Sir Charles W. Macra writes to the "Manchester Guardian" in regard to the prospects of Parliament passing the Empire Cotton-growing Corporation's Bill to make a levy of 6d. per bale upon cotton purchases.  
When achieved the continued legal enforcement of this levy will mark a great step forward in the progress of industry in this country.  
"It inaugurates a policy which we have advocated for many years, that of managing industries as a whole and not in the interests of individual concerns."  
"It was the policy of dealing with an industry as a whole which was tested and found to work admirably when we resorted, by mutual agreement of the employers and the operatives, to work short time in the cotton trade to deal with the shortage of raw material and to defend the gamblers in cotton in 1903-4, and its wisdom was put beyond all question by the long and successful working of the scheme introduced by the Cotton Control Board during the war."  
"One of the most useful devices of the Industrial Council at an enquiry in 1912 into industrial agreements and their observance was the decision that where three-quarters of an industry masters and men decided upon any line of action for the welfare of an industry, the remaining quarter, according to the rule of the majority, should be compelled by legal enactment to fall into line with the majority."  
"By the action adopted in 1903-4 Lancashire was saved from disaster as it was again during the crisis of the Cotton Control Board and contented that had we the same regulation established permanently the cotton industry would be able to avoid most of its troubles and

THURSDAY, AUGUST 24, 1922. The dinner at the New Stanley Hotel on Tuesday afforded many points of vantage to the spectator of our Society in Kenya, though he would find it difficult to disengage any one of its aspects from its neighbours and to say definitely that it was clearly and exactly comprehensive and explanatory of the function or of the company or of the Colony's past, present or future. There was a sense of the parting of friends but newly met, understood and appreciated, a resentment of an indefinable injustice which had somehow fallen not wholly unexpectedly, in the always oppressive discordance in the respective points of view of the one, to whom it represents a severance, a finality and an adventure into a new life and that of the many to whom it is but an incident, a shock, certainly, but an external significance in the lines of each. Functions of this kind are always carried out under this disability, and all the speeches suffer this distinction of the essentially individual, and the unavoidably general. In this case there was the additional fact that as His Excellency Lord Delamater and Major Grogan all observed, and as none present could forget, there had been moments of great divergence of opinion. All the more significant, therefore, was the actuality of the tribute that the more unreserved marshalling of the facts of the past few years conveyed. Major Grogan expressed the development of Kenya during the years of Sir E. Northey's Governorship as a "geological period." That is not an exaggeration. History has moved at a rate greater than the most ardent youth could have expected, and the transformation from "Inca-land" to "Dominionland" is the signal mark and characteristic of Sir Edward Northey's rule. That is the achievement that is inseparably associated with his name, the verdict of history on his success as a Civil Imperial Administrator, and the comment of fact upon the illusions and imaginations of Mr. Churchill. And that is perhaps the distinct and abiding impression of the banquet. That work, as we have said previously, will not pass; Sir Edward Northey's abilities and vitality and youth are placed in another sphere, and in probably very different circumstances, but the service he has rendered Kenya pass into the stuff of her history. Sir Robert Coryndon's work begins where Sir Edward Northey's ceases. It is complementary, extensive, final: there is no discord or break of tangent. The direction of our history is decided, and all future work will be built on the foundation of Dominionhood and not on the ruins of Inca-land. Sir Robert's function is the erection of the edifice that is to rise on that foundation since the choice of foundation is irrevocable. In no other succession of Governors in this country has there been more clear a promise of continuity that appears in this instance. We look and work to that continuous development, and we read the event of Tuesday with the hopefulness that aspect gives rather than in the somewhat depressing atmosphere that a real farewell imparts. Kenya lives; and though the new Governor, and his successors, will, as Major Grogan prophesied be haunted by the pernicious aftermath of the refusal by higher authorities of success to other of Sir Edward Northey's ideals, on courtesy and Indian questions, the history that has been made in these last three years in all our future. No future, and no past misunderstandings can affect that fact, nor should any lesser consideration affect Sir Edward Northey's satisfaction in his share in its creation. It would not be wise, THE INDIAN we think, for any QUESTION, party concerned in the progress of Kenya to mistake the present attitude and anticipation of the other in relation to the Indian question lest any should reach a false sense of security. The Colonial Office must not be permitted to think that when Major Wood and Earl Wigginton

Sir, I felt able, just a month ago, to send workers and food out to a new district, Kustanai, east of the Ural Mountains, where no relief had reached, and the people had been driven to cannibalism. I'm glad to say we shall be feeding 100,000 there, though 200,000 is the number needing it. "The coming of the harvest will help a great deal, as what has been planted has grown very well - not more than one-third of the new crop has been planted, so that we shall still have to feed perhaps one-third of the people in Buzhuk area, for another year. The most interesting work we shall do there will be not constructive work - supplying the people with soap and clothing, so as to clear away disease germs; re-stocking the farms with livestock, tools and agricultural machinery; and perhaps even re-planting those that have fallen into decay owing to the clutch being torn down for food."
