high the seed must be of low quality, so the crop on the soil of most value is the maize. The principal crops are maize, cassava, beans, and groundnuts, all to be mentioned as being selected for their adaptability to the soil or the egg, on abundance of oxygen or beans, or, if possible, beans. Some species of beans should be planted. When the seeds are bought at one time, a certain amount of storage is necessary. Weeds are very great trouble to the poultry and the best way to control them is to store no early, by keeping them under control.

Housing—The houses north of Nairobi are built mostly of mud, while only mud and grass are used in the south. The houses are clean. Insect pests are numerous, especially in the hot climate, so that strong measures against them are necessary. All food distributed is safe for human consumption.

Market Report

Below is the weekly product market report issued by the Standard Corporation Ltd., dated March 8.
The general situation in the produce market is not very encouraging, although there has been a slight improvement. The commercial will remain stable, but the price of monitory factors has been reduced to a minimum in the first few weeks, and the market is still in a state of transition.

The percentage of land under cultivation in this tropical climate is not realized, and is due to the fact that the area under cultivation is not increased, and that the amount of land occupied would undoubtedly increase if the climate were better, but only when greater care and management under the climatic and seasonal conditions.
