



A few weeks ago we published an article on the death of Thomas Blix who spent more than three years in the countries of India and Malaya as Ambassador for King George V to the Court of Maharaja the Great Mogul.

It may be said a further acquaintance with the life of this distinguished statesman is desired by the English people.

It is in those quarters we discover the most interesting details of his life. He was born in 1854 in the town of Helsingfors, Finland. His father was a well-known statesman and diplomat.

He was educated at the University of Helsingfors and then at the University of Berlin. He spent several years in the diplomatic service of his native country.

He was appointed Ambassador to India in 1905. He spent three years in India, during which he visited all the principal States and met the Maharaja of Mysore.

He returned to his native country in 1908 and was appointed Minister of Foreign Affairs. He held this office until 1912.

He was a member of the Swedish Academy and the Royal Swedish Society of Sciences. He was also a member of the Swedish Parliament.

He died in 1920 in Stockholm. He was one of the most distinguished statesmen of his country.

At the time of his death he was 66 years of age. He had spent most of his life in public service.


