WORLD'S NEWS BY CABLE.

The King. Sir Charles Hardinge Honoured.

With the Emperor Joseph. Aug. 11.—The King has started for Cronberg where he meets the Kaiser; hence he will not be able to meet the Emperor Francis Joseph and thence to Marienbad.

The German Official press welcomes the King's visit hoping it will result in a cordial relationship between the two countries. Aug. 12.—The King arrived at Cronberg in brilliant sunshine and the meeting with the Kaiser was most cordial. They motored to the Castle through cheering crowds.

Aug. 13.—The King has left Cronberg for Ischl. The Kaiser bestowed the Iron Eagle of the 1st Class on Sir Charles Hardinge who is accompanying the King.

The King has arrived at Ischl. The meeting of King Edward and the Kaiser is the topic in Europe and it is remarked that the King wore the uniform of the Blucher Hussars whereas he was in uniform of the 1907 visit.

Both Sovereigns appeared in the best of spirits and were pleased at the meeting.

Aug. 13.—The King and the Emperor Francis Joseph arrived at an ovation from a crowd of thousands as they drove to the King's Hotel where they were received by the Archduchess.

Aviators Enthusiastic.

Another Aeroplane Record. Aug. 10.—The American aeroplane Wright, flew 31 kilometres in 100 seconds at Le Mans in France.

Aug. 11.—Aviators are intensely enthusiastic about Wright's flight and say that the airship was perfectly birdlike and responsive to every motion of the steersman. Wright refused to continue his flights until the plague of his photographers ceases.

Stolen Reliquary. Aug. 10.—A Reliquary valued at 300,000 francs has been stolen from a church in Bordeaux.

Macedonian Reform Russia Advises Giving Turkey's Sultan a Chance.

Aug. 10.—Russia has communicated to the powers a note on the Anglo-Russian reform scheme, but only for their information in which she considers that in view of events in Turkey the powers should defer action implying distrust of the Sultan's wish to carry out reforms.

It is added that Russia will follow attentively and sympathetically Turkey's efforts to assure the working of the new regime and abstain from interference. If Turkey's efforts are resultless, however, the powers must resume the work of reform. 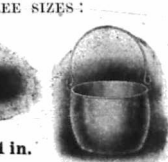

Visits to East African Farms.

No. 1. Meroroni Estate Nakuru.

Many of our Settlers whose business necessitates their stopping periodically within in Nairobi or other towns in the Protectorate are deprived of the privilege of visiting their farming holdings and consequently have no idea of the amount of work being done by the men on the land. It is a common mistake which is shared by many people that the farmer has an easy time of it, his labours commencing very often before daylight and do not finish until the sun is well below the horizon. He is patient and agricultural he has to work in response to a kind invitation from Mr. A. N. Flemer of Meroroni Estate, Nakuru, he had the pleasure of spending a day on the farm.

It is a comfortable chair that is a great boon by good a good of trotting over, as any person could wish to sit behind, our representative left the Nakuru Hotel on his nine miles to Mr. Flemer's farm. The country passed through on the journey was typically African but of no great particular interest beyond striking the traveller, as being typical. Turkish Affairs.

Austrian Gendarmeries. Reorganisation.

Aug. 21—Austria in reply to the Russian communication, states that it is favourable to Austria and that only such sea wire repairs as the only subject for all Turkish subjects enjoy rights.

Aug. 22—America is recalling her gendarmes officers.

Aug. 22—Reuter's Constantinople learns that the Porte has decided to appoint a British Adviser to reorganize the Navy and a French adviser for Finance.

Aug. 22—A functionary from the Turkish Foreign Office is going to the Persian Frontier to settle the question of the disputed territory.

Aug. 24—The Russian Gendarme Officers in Macedonia who are at present absent have been granted an extension of leave with a view to their recall.

Home Government Courting Financial Disaster.

Aug. 24—"The Observer" states that Government with a view to avoiding annual Anglo-German Wranglings has agreed on a necessity of a four years' Naval programme in 1911 when it is hoped that Germany will be able to consider the possibility of a Naval entente. Such a programme will provide for building 30 "Dreadnoughts" or Indomitable and cost 50 millions above the present estimates.

The Cabinet is still undecided as to the method of raising the money they will adopt.

His English Doctor and English Cavalry Instructor escaped and arrived at Casa Blanca. Mulhahid has been proclaimed Sultan of Tangier amid popular rejoicing.

While it is expected that France will continue her policy in Morocco regardless of the change of Sultan, Government organs agree that Mulai cannot be recognised until the European conference has met and consented to conclude an agreement with him.

Abdulaziz Declines to Abdicate.

Aug. 27—It is reported that Abdulaziz refuses to abdicate and intends collecting a fresh Army. In Paris political circles view the situation in Morocco calmly and it is premature negotiations in recognition of Mulhahid previous to guarantees of his recognition of the Algerian act.

A Great Purchase.

Aug. 27—The National Gallery has purchased from Lord Talbot de Malahidi for £25,000 a family group painted by Frans Hal.

A Broker Broke.

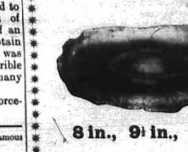

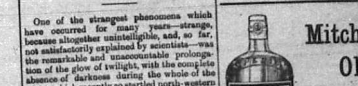
