The story of another notorious attempt to bribe the Uganda Railway was told in our last issue. That done, we now turn to another, equally notorious, attempt to influence the Uganda Railways, goods being sent in through certain illegal ports in connection with charging for services. This was presented by Mr. E. S. Fugle, K.C., on behalf of the Uganda Railways, to the extreme regret of the company, the information being that the defences of the railway of Kenya, May 14, had made no progress.

The defendant was a contractor and brought his case to the Bar on July 1. The application made it was that he had been compelled to do what he did, and when duty it was to put out and make available ships, he had given the Uganda Railways the best he could.

The court was told that when the court sat in Mombasa had had a long time ago, and the defence now maintained, although the truth may only be known to God, that the freight charged on the weight of the goods was not the right weight, the trucks were passed at their original weight, and that figure would stand.

It was also alleged that the defendant had stated that if the former Uganda Railways manager, Mr. J. C. Cook, would give him £100, he would be satisfied.

It however turned out that Mr. Cook and Miss M. G. Cook, the husband and wife, had been called in to the office of the Uganda Railways manager, and when it was announced that he was to be dismissed, they were given £100, and would receive three more when he left.

The defendant explained that he was under pressure from his wife who brought his case from a career in the Uganda Railways.

Witnesses explained that the man was a very experienced and astute detective, and when he was accused of being a spy, he said that he was in fact a spy, and would have been given £1000.

The following morning, Monday, the court received the report of Mr. F. W. Watson, the magistrate, and later in the day set aside the £1000 given to the defendant in view of the Treaty. Mr. F. W. Watson, however, refused to accept the £1000.

Asked by the magistrate whether he could give any reason why the defendant should be allowed to go free, witness said that he had been out in the local afternoons, and was grubbing about, and that defendant was keeping up appearance, and that he had been embarrassed when the persons passed. Defendant had asked for a private consultation, but witness replied that he had no time for that.

In answer to a further question, witness said that he had been offered £1000 to bring the defendant back to the dock or accepted any money for that purpose.

A witness, in the course of cross examination, was asked if he had not been paid £1000 to look at the defendant's bill at completion, and he said that he had, and in consequence withdrew his statement in conversation with the magistrate.

Further hearing was adjourned until July 21.
