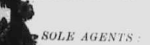

CORRESPONDENCE. PARALYSIS OF THE BLADDER

The Editor second assistant Editor with the opinions expressed by Correspondents. LIMORU FARMERS' ASSOCIATION. TO THE EDITOR OF "THE EAST AFRICAN STANDARD" Dear Mr. Editor,—We wish to draw the attention of the public through the medium of your paper to the fact that the Farmers near and about Limoru have formed an Association, calling themselves the Limoru Farmers Association.

The first meeting was held at Mr. Dair's house on the 19th March. It was the first of Agriculture being present. This meeting was explained in the columns of the Standard, and the necessity of Co-operation. Numerous resolutions were passed among which the most important were, the registration of Natives by Government, the institution of passes to Natives on the same method as in the South. That no Natives registered on private farms should be allowed to quit such farms or be made that a Government Bill and travelling facilities should be stippled to the District. As a result of this meeting had the Water Board for the election of Officers, President, Mr. W. H. A. Camp, Vice-President Mr. R. H. Hoddinott, Mr. H. Scott, Hon. Sec. and Treasurer were elected also a committee of five, the members being as follows, Messrs. Impey, Hall, Ivor, and Tilly.

Although the Association has only been formed a few months its good work is already making itself felt, and Members are profiting by each other's experience. The rules are being printed and the next General Meeting will be held at Mr. A. G. A. Leasky's Farm on the 1st of October, the proceedings of which I shall be happy to report you in the Standard.

Our Newest Colony.

Hand Heavy—Self-acting Reaping Glycas —Black Wattle—Fills—Millet Cultivation —Bees—Horse Breeding. Small Farmers who do not care to give their ploughing out to contract either hand or machine, are engaged irregularly for labour for that purpose or for their own ploughing with trained local oxen. These oxen are small but hardy and do a great deal of work when properly used and partly stall fed. As each season goes and trained oxen are being brought more frequently to the colony. The present average yield per acre is 45-50, is a high average for a native bred animal.

It will be seen that Wheat and Beans have been taken in the 1902-1903 season in the last article as main crops, the wheat for sale to the local consumer, the beans for export to Europe. In the course of time the demand for wheat has increased and the local demand and the farmer will be then called upon to compete with the world's wheat fields. This means an immediate drop in his revenue from wheat per acre from 20 to 25 shillings, a margin of profit. The yield of 15 bushels per acre is less than the average local yield as far obtained. The Glycas variety of wheat, more or less self-cultivated variety, has frequently averaged 30 bushels of dry grain and in that localities not particularly well suited for wheat cultivation. This season in the Nairobi Province, an increased average yield is coincidently expected. Local wheat is generally harvested during the months of February, March and September-October, and sown during November and May. There are as yet no steam threshing machines in the Colony but hand threshing and winnowing machines must present requirements. A flour Mill is shortly to be erected at Nairobi and in the course of time Mills will be established in central townships to deal with all locally produced grain.

These are districts in the Highlands in which the farming is being steadily carried on where neither wheat nor beans are suitable crops. In these Districts other grains are raised for example Maize, Oats, and Millet. The prices obtained for these grains are average throughout the year as follows—Maize, 4s 10 to 45-50 per ton; Oats, 4s 10 to 45-50 per ton; and Chaff only to the honey collected in hand of the mill is the most suitable for the small farmer. The average yield in Districts where it is hot and dry stands at fifty bushels of clean corn and apart from the corn, which can be exported abroad to good open markets, there is the by-product from which the best form of paper and kinds of cloth brushes are manufactured.

In Italy, Australia, and in some parts of India, the pasture which the seed are sown in is a valuable part of the crop. Even the comparatively inexperienced farmer finds no trouble with millet cultivation; the native labourers thoroughly understand the plant, its uses, and the best method of sowing with two seedings per season, whether sown for germination during the heavier or lighter rainy seasons. The value of the pasture, however, is not known to the African Native and even if it was known to them they would be helpless without a baling Press and a Squeezer, the latter taking the place of the flail, or treading, or hand picking methods of extraction. The cost of these two machines is about 200 shillings delivered in the Highlands, a rather high price, but it is a good investment when it is considered that the smaller farmer by himself but when divided up amongst four or five neighbours on the co-operative system it is not a great loss to his capital. The total value of the broom panicles—delivered at a Highland's Railway Station of good average colour and grade and pressed into 400 lbs. of bales—will be 45-50.

Similarly to the fact that Wheat and Beans are both found unsuitable products for some Districts, so are Fruit Trees. In such Districts the same usually devoted to the Orchard is very often planted up with the Wattle Tree. The variety generally selected is the Black Wattle, this variety grows remarkably well reaching maturity to forty feet within four years. The tree can be stripped of its bark at the sixth year, a special stripping machine,

The Greatest Gift of the Century.

Sept. 25.—Mr. Andrew Carnegie has made a gift of 14 million dollars yielding £12,500 per annum for the formation of a "Hero" Fund for the purpose of assisting those following peaceful vocations in the United Kingdom and have been injured in heroic effort to save human life, also the widows and children of those similarly killed. The King has approved of the scheme.

The Shah's Reply.

Sept. 25.—Renter learns that the Shah's reply to the Anglo-Russian Note agreed to refer new elections and convolve the assembly but in view of the disturbed condition of Azerbaijan he must choose his own time.

The Australian Defence Scheme.

Sept. 26.—The Admiralty in reply to Mr. Deakin agrees to the Australian Commonwealth providing and maintaining a local flotilla of 6 destroyers, nine sub-marines and two depot ships. This will cost 14 million and a force of 1,204 Officers and men will be maintained.

Victory for Tariff Reform.

Sept. 26.—Result of the Newcastle Election.—Bewick (Unionist) 1893 Short (Liberal) 1173 Hartley (Socialist) 2971

Enquiry Necessary into Causes of Boiler Explosions.

Sept. 26.—The funeral of the victims of the accident on the "Lapostolleville" was most impressive. M. Thomson being present. There is a growing feeling that something must be done to end these accidents.

Spanish Royalties.

Sept. 26.—The King and Queen of Spain accompanied by the Foreign Minister arrived in Paris yesterday where they stay for 24 hours en route for Vienna.

Sept. 24.—A cyclone has visited Guadeloupe.

Malaria to be stamped out at Mauritius.
Sept. 29.—The "Times" devotes a leader on the report made by Major Ross on malaria at Mauritius detailing his proposals to exterminate it at an annual cost of £90,000. The "Times" says that if this estimate is compared with what the disease costs the Colony, it becomes manifest that the adoption of the proposals is likely to effect a great saving, not only in life, but in money to Government.

The Colony has an enviable opportunity of giving the Empire an example of practical sanitation.

Demonstration Against Licensing Bill.
Sept. 29.—A monster demonstration attended by 300,000 people was held in Hyde Park yesterday to protest against the Licensing Bill.

National Insurance Scheme.
Sept. 29.—Mr. Haldane speaking at Lady Park hoped that an opportunity would soon arise of giving substantial inducement to workers to make provision for bad times. This is regarded as indicating a Government scheme for National Insurance against unemployment.

The New Lord Mayor of London.
Sept. 30.—Alderman Sir George Truscott has been elected Lord Mayor of London.

World's News by Cable.

Bulgaria & Turkey. A Crisis. The Oriental Railway. First Move of Great Britain. Trouble in the Near East.

Sept. 26.—During a railway strike the Oriental Railway by Bulgaria in charge of soldiers and a fresh Turkish note insists on their withdrawal and the restoration of the line to the Company.

Sept. 28.—The Porte has notified the Powers that the occupation of the Oriental Railway by Bulgaria is a violation of Turkey's Rights and requests intervention.

Sept. 28.—Conferences between the Russian, German, Austrian and Italian ministers are regarded as taking considerable advance as to Eastern affairs. There are persistent reports that Austria contemplates steps to secure the permanent incorporation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and there is every indication that Bulgaria is determined to keep the Oriental Railway and ignore Turkish protests.

Sept. 29.—At Constantinople Turkish officials circles view the Bulgarian imbroglio favourably and think it can be settled by compromise. Britain has informed Bulgaria that she considers her retention of the Oriental Railway negotiable. A meeting of several thousand held at Sofia resolved in demanding Government to retain the Oriental Railway.

Lord Tweedmouth's Resignation. Recipient of the Famous Kaiser's Letter.

Sept. 29.—Lord Tweedmouth's resignation on account of ill-health has been accepted.

The Conquest of the Air. Sept. 30.—Willbur Wright has accomplished 48 Kilometers in 67 minutes 11 4/5 seconds.

Another Collision. Sept. 30.—Linn's London steamer "Argonaut" from Toronto to the Mediterranean has been sunk in a collision in a fog of fog denseness.

One hundred and eighteen passengers and 113 of the crew had just time to get away in the boats, but lost everything.

Severe Floods in India. Sept. 30.—Abnormal rains have caused disastrous floods in Southern India. Hastenbad and Deccan with heavy loss of life.

Thousands of native houses have disappeared. 1,003 Deaths. Oct. 1.—The death roll at Harderabad amounts to over 1,000 and an epidemic is feared owing to the putrefying corpses.

There were no casualties among Europeans.

An Understanding Probable over Morocco.

Sept. 25.—The German reply to the note of the 24th instant is most moderate in tone and generally accepts the proposals.

Confidence is now expressed in Paris that an International understanding will be reached.

The French Press recognizes the compulsory force of the German note giving reason to hope that an agreement is possible in main points and details.

Sept. 28.—The opinion prevails in Paris that the German reply to the Franco-Spanish Note does not offer a single real objection.

Oct. 1.—France and Spain are drafting a fresh note to Mulai Hafid wherein the guarantees demanded are modified in accordance with the examination of the first note by the Powers.

Another Railway Accident. Sept. 28.—A passenger and freight train collided on the Northern Pacific Railway in Montana during a dense snow-storm.

The shocking car was demolished and ignited twenty being killed and several injured.

Latest Novels.

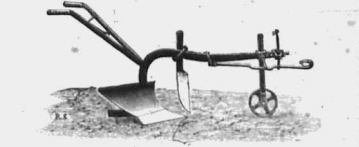

World's News by Cable.

Grave Situation in the Near East.

The Oriental Railway.

Protest of the Powers.
Oct. 2.—France has joined in the protest by the other Powers against the retention by Bulgaria of the Oriental Railway.

Oct. 3.—Russia has sent a memorandum to Bulgaria proposing to submit the railway question to the Powers who were signatories to the Treaty of Berlin. France supports the proposal.

Buying War Horses?

Oct. 5.—Markets affected are showing a certain uneasiness as to the situation in the Near East, owing to reports of Bulgarian officers buying horses in Hungary.

It seems to be generally accepted that the Bulgarian Railway question will be peacefully settled, but there is no sign of Bulgarian yielding. It is pointed out in certain quarters that Bulgarian position renders active coercion difficult.

Austria's Note.

Oct. 6.—The Austrian Ambassadors have presented to the respective Governments, to which they are accredited, an autograph letter from the Emperor Francis Joseph dealing with the situation in the Balkans. Great importance is attached to the contents of this letter. According to the most trustworthy accounts it reviews the whole situation in the Near East and deals with the necessity for a change in the relations of the Monarchy with Bosnia and Herzegovina, the occupation of which is regarded as definitive, but assurances are given that the change contemplated will not transgress the limits imposed by the Treaty of Berlin.

Much Bellicose Talk Means no War.

The Sultan's View.
ANNEXATION AND REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT IN ONE BREATH.

Oct. 8.—An Anti-Austrian mass meeting was held at Belgrade on the evening of the 6th instant, when shouts were raised of "Down with Austria" and there was much bellicose talk.

Britain's Proposal.

Oct. 6.—Great Britain has made proposals to Bulgaria and Turkey with a view to the settlement of the Railway question. Turkey has agreed that in the event of the Railway being temporarily restored to the Company, she will consent to the issue being transferred from the Company to Bulgaria, the Porte's rights being safeguarded.

Annexation and Declaration of Independence.

Britain is urging the Powers signatory to the Treaty of Berlin to recommend the question to Bulgaria, and it is understood that the Great Powers have agreed to act accordingly.

Government Securities Dropping.

Oct. 7.—The gravity of the situation in the Near East is universally recognised.

An Order for 50 Aeroplanes.

Oct. 6.—The French financier Mr. Weiller has ordered 50 Wright aeroplanes from a French factory. He anticipates that they will perform important services in line of war and he hopes to organise aerial sports.

It is authoritatively stated in Berlin that Germany's reply to the Emperor of Austria's letter is a promise to support the annexation of Bosnia.

Bulgaria was yesterday proclaimed an independent Kingdom at Tirnovo, the ancient capital.

M. Iovskiy arrived at Paris the evening before and conferred immediately with M. Clemenceau, who afterwards had an interview with Francis Bertin.

Consuls have dropped and Turkish Government Securities 11.

At Constantinople a protracted sitting of the Council of Ministers continues. It is understood that the Porte will protest to Bulgaria and the Powers against the violation of the Treaty of Berlin.

Prince Ferdinand has telegraphed to the Sultan that he was compelled to respect the voice of the nation and hoping that friendly relations would be maintained.

The Council of Ministers is considering the reply which it will present to the Emperor against the Prince's action and refuse to recognise his independence.

the Cornish coast, the most striking example of Nature's incapacity to be seen anywhere on the globe.

And the Causeway itself is the centre of attraction. Here many thousands of regularly carved columns, mostly pentagonal, and averaging about two feet in diameter, are arranged in fantastic clusters: some grouped together like a vase, some arranged as for the purpose of a table, the sides and back formed of upright columns of varying height which partly surmounted the rock and looked like some, faintly like gigantic house-cornucopias.

Standing upon the top of the rock, the eye is attracted by the appearance of pillars the some in altogether striking and bewildering. On all the columns sculptured as by the hand of man; at all the rear the line of cliffs from which they project at two or three points the ends of some of these strange rock monuments, in front the jetty or causeway, a tongue of rock wholly composed of these five or six-sided columns, stretching out three or four hundred feet from the land, while beyond is the open of the breaking in clouds of foam against the submerged pillars rocks, set as if further extreme from by the break of the gold north into foams and bergs of solid ice.

And while contemplating this marvellous example of Nature's handiwork, the thought comes into the mind that although in this instance man might perhaps achieve a similar result, yet in connection with animals he has in nature's pocket. And he who created him, upon the earth, by yielding up his own human life to support the ones for his redemption has provided a means by which we may inherit eternal life. For when enduring the blackness of the world was on our behalf suffering the penalty for our transgression.

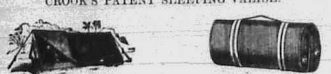
