Another view commonly expressed is that the Highlands have become an area of European settlement and the funds must follow the movement. It is probably far more correct to the supporters of this policy that the reason why the European settlement in the Highlands exceeds the European settlement in the Lowlands is simply because incoming Colonists have noticed that the past policy has been to develop the Highlands at the expense of the Lowlands and they naturally preferred to follow Capital.

When this policy comes to an end and a fairer policy—one more suited to general prosperity—is adopted, a settlement of the Lowlands by Europeans will rapidly equal in numbers the Highland Settlement and in industrial output. Lowland Settlers will leave their fellow Colonists ridiculously in the rear.

The only policy which appeals to those who are fully acquainted with the facts is one which combines the equitable treatment of both the Highlands and the Lowlands. Capital expended in the Lowlands, which is for the benefit of the sections, is Capital well spent but it should not be held that such Capital must be set off against capital expended in developing the Highlands. This capital should be allocated each to each, and thereafter a fair proportion of the remaining capital should be expended on the whole development of the whole Protectorate.

Until this financial policy is adopted no Administration can lay claim to be anything else but a failure.

## CHINA.

Death of Emperor and Empress.  
Suggestions of Foul Play.

## The Regent and Reformers.

Nov. 17.—The Empress of China is better, but the Emperor, who has been ailing for a long time is seriously ill.  
The Emperor of China is dying and has been removed to the Death Chamber.  
It is rumored that he is dead.  
Prince Chun has been proclaimed Regent and his son Puwei heir presumptive.  
The Grand Council assembled in the palace.  
The Dowager Empress was present, but swooned.  
Reuters's correspondent at Peking thinks that the Emperor is dead, and the Dowager Empress ill beyond recovery.  
Reuters's Agent at Peking says that the Dowager Empress is dead. And that the two year old child, Puwei, mentioned above has been proclaimed, and Prince Chun regent, no trouble is anticipated.  
Three years mourning has been decreed.  
The death bed observance, the same 3,000 years ago, marked the passing of the Emperor and Dowager Empress; both died alone unattended, through a circle of expectant spectators stood a rod distant unable to approach owing to the sacredness of their Majesties persons.  
Chinese Reformers in Australia have received a telegram suggesting their play in connection with the death of the Emperor. Similar reports are current at Peking respecting the Emperor.

## Anxiety in Germany.

## Emperor and Buelow's Meeting.

## Severe Criticism on the Emperor.

Nov. 17.—Germany is anxiously awaiting Prince von Buelow's audience with the Kaiser.  
It is beginning to be understood that his assurances for the future, given in the Reichstag, were made without any consultation with the Emperor, whose approval is uncertain.  
The Topic in Berlin to-day is the Kaiser Zeitung's severe condemnation of the Emperor's absence from Berlin during the present crisis and his apparent indifference thereto. Owing to the sudden death through apoplexy of Count Heesen Haeseler, principal Aide de Camp to the Kaiser, His Majesty has abandoned his visit to Kiel and returns to Berlin on Tuesday where he will grant an audience to Prince von Buelow.  
The Emperor receives Prince von Buelow on Monday at Kiel where he attends the awarding of the Naval decorations.

## Nov. 18.—It is understood that the Kaiser and Prince Buelow have reached an agreement and that Buelow remains in office.

The conference lasted two hours and thereafter Prince Buelow returned to Berlin and officially announced that the Emperor had listened most gravely to his report on public feeling and replied that it was his foremost duty to uphold the consistency of the Empire policy.  
His approval of Buelow's statement in the Reichstag and assured him of his continued confidence. At Berlin stocks price jumped on the publication of the news.

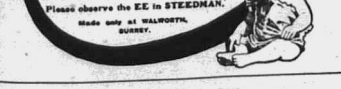

Nor her lower espal has touched the line of the watery horizon; now, for one moment, a burst of light proceeds from the great ocean; and now the last point of light for a few hours to lose its brilliancy flash star on the water, disappears into the darkness. Landmarks, the few stars on the low line may be faintly discerned in silhouette against the darkened sky, while from time to time the many and varied notes of the night utter their melodious tones to the accompaniment of the measured rhythm of the wash and flapping of the waves on the sandy shore.  
Aye, it is beautiful, all beautiful. The glowing, red and fulminous the darkening shades of the twilight merging more and more into the night, peaceful and reposed; and so the glory of the stars, so transcendent and so solemn, all tending to uplift the soul from the worldlings of earth to the contemplation of the Great Creator of it all. And yet, although so richly soothed and so comfortable, the willing, by suffering, as our Substitute, the punishment due to us, to give us, by the sacrifice of our own free-will the opportunity of inheriting a realm in the glories of heaven. And thus who approach the throne of grace in the Saviour's name and pleading His merits will in no wise be cast out.
