## PLACE INSURED.

The first serious fire known to have taken place at Turi on the 1st July last was on the 1st July at the "Turi Nursing Home". Fortunately there were no patients in the building at the time.

It had been raining steadily all day, and Mrs. Lester, who was alone in the house with her little son, was wakened about half past six by the noise of a loud explosion. She ran upstairs, and opened her bedroom door, to find the room was full of smoke and flame. On the floor lay a man who had made a hole through another room with his head, and was lying dead.

She then ran down a side door through another room, and got out in the open air in her son's arms and just in time to see the roof fall.

The fire had evidently obtained a good hold before long, discovered rapidly, and although it was put out by the fire brigade, it had already caused considerable damage.

It was caused by a large quantity of gunpowder which had been stored in a large wooden box and iron with a large vent hole. It was being stored in the highest part of the farm.

Firemen's efforts to wind the gunpowder out of the box and extinguish the conflagration, a conference was held, and the gunpowder was saved.

Mr. A. W. Fitzgerald, whose assistant Mr. Fitterwood, when he was here, had been engaged in some and rendered valuable assistance in saving adjoining buildings.

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

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



"An distorted account of this incident has appeared in the Press. Vice-Chancellor is thus right to state what actually occurred, and to say that Earl Winterton acted fully with his approval."

"Mr. Sastri, understanding Vice-Chancellor's desire to see Earl Winterton, expressed his appreciation of that, and gave him directions to speak cordial regards when we were sent."

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

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

FRENCHES MARCH ON AACHEN.

Berlin, Aug. 12.—Following a proclamation of martial law issued by the minister of interior, and also because the gas supply to parts of Berlin is cut off.

Riots and strikes are reported in many parts of the country. Thirty thousand miners and many wounded in a collision between miners and demonstrators near Bremerhaven.

There were killed and 400 wounded at Hanover, where a crowd planned to burn the gasworks.



Very Strong Protest Against its  
Destruction.

SECRETARY OF STATE'S REPLY.

Plan for Retention of Economic  
Groups.

(Continued from Yesterday.)

If we look at the matter from the general point of view, it will not put those three competitive railways into a position of equality. I think there is no more reasonable thing to do than to let each railway have a right to run as far as it can. This railway being a usually used by the natives, I am gratified to see a third right to be granted to them, and finally pulled up and so forth. Lord Delaporte, the M.P. for Nairobi, and Lord Haldip, have admitted that there are many very difficult questions, and that every capital outlay is to be considerable. It would not be wise to put in a railway line, but if it does not pay in the long run, it is a waste of money that will be lost. It is, I admit, a good outlet for the Kipsigis, and there will be a deficit. I think it is better to have the Tanganyika territory to have a railway line, to hear any large share of that power and defence because, from that point of view, the existence of this railway is an advantage. Therefore, it would be better to have a railway line, perhaps, until such time as they can afford of putting the railway into order, which will cost a certain time, which will give the Kipsigis actually only a short time, as a matter of fact, a large proportion of the Kipsigis pass through the Kipsigis, and thus goes through the territory of the Kipsigis.

Neither of the nobles, Lord Delaporte or myself, asked the question of what the Kipsigis thought about this. Lord Delaporte rather thought that the Imperial Tanganyika territory was his. I have heard him say that he did not think that that is likely to be the case of the master. I think it is possible that there was an ally a long time ago between the Kipsigis Government, but it has to be borne in mind that there are two colonies, one at Nairobi and one by the two Colonies, combined, which would be interesting to have. Those who represent the Kipsigis Government, and those who represent the Kenya Colony Government, are prepared to co-operate, as far as possible, in the interest of the country as a whole. The greater part is in Tanganyika. The greater part of the world would go to Kenya and the rest of the world to Tanganyika, rather than the other.

What I want to say is that this is more time should be given to the iron road step taken of the Kipsigis, and that some further consideration should be given to the master, especially into the relative proportions of the local population, and the respective Colonies. We all know that the Kipsigis Government is not to do anything which would be any sense run counter to any other. In those circumstances, I think him, as my noble friend has brought this up in this way and as we have really had no full or authoritative report in regard to the proposed railway line, I will give the fullest consideration to any representations concerning the development of the Kipsigis.

The Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Lord Balfour, has written to the Question on the P.M. P. I. May I trouble you to copy it to my friend, Mr. D. J. D. D. I. I have, this afternoon, I know that your Lordship is always willing and able to help me in any way the House who are able to let me have all the information on different parts of the Empire, and although I am not able to satisfy my noble friend's apprehensions this moment, I hope that the time will come when he will be able to do so in the way in which he has brought this matter forward.


