[FRANCIS RÉGIS' ANSWER.]

London, October 22.—All the representatives of the Dominions, excepting those from the United States and Canada, have now arrived at Cheltenham, where Col. Alfred Whited Astley, a member of the History Committee, houses, and have been staying at the Hotel Imperial, deferring their departure.

A communiqué states that to-day the answer of the Imperial Conference was provided over by Mr. Premiers were fully received, and the conference was adjourned till Wednesday.

It has been decided that the proceedings shall be confidential.



"AFRICAN EXPERIENCE."

There are many people, many classes of people, who claim African experience, just as there are many classes of Africa. In fact, the number of classes varies, so that the experience of different authorities on Africa as variously developed, and therefore their outlooks differ.

The African official who has made his permanent home in African regions, will, of course, be a good judge. Africa, in his estimation, is a "good place." Do you suppose that the European settler and the born-and-bred European colonist can up against it?

GENERAL SMUTS SPEAKS OUT.

**CALL FOR A CONFERENCE OF ALL POWERS INTERESTED
IN REPARATIONS.**

Vital Need for United States to Attend.

**Illegality of French Occupation of
the Ruhr.**

WHAT GREAT BRITAIN SHOULD MAKE CLEAR.

The Empire That is Entitled to a Voice in Affairs
of Europe.

"The Empire which was entitled to an authoritative voice in the affairs of Europe should," said General Smuts in the speech which follows. "It made it perfectly clear, in friendly but unmistakable language, to whom it may concern, that in certain eventualities this country would have to regard its own interests and take whatever steps were necessary to that end irrespective of the effect that might have on old friendships."

[THROUGH SMUTS'S AGENCEY]

London, October 22.—Smuts, who is beginning a London tour, has issued a statement giving his views on the European powers' policy of the Versailles Treaty, and advocating a conference of all Powers interested in reparations to be held in the United States to participate.

Preference.

General Smuts made an unusually outspoken speech for a responsible Statesman at the Royal Institute of International Affairs. At the outset he referred to the Imperial Conference and said the principles of the Conference had already been announced were going to be of very great advantage in obtaining the support of other countries, however to what was called Imperial Preference.

A VITAL NEED.

Dealing with the European situation, he said that the attitude of the Government of Great Britain mainly interested in repairing the damage done by the Republicans, and the League of Nations Committee proposed to deal therewith. He stressed that the decision of the Committee regarding the terms of which negotiations were about, might result in a general war if the absence of any Power should not prevent the rest from getting together. In this case, the United States should stand as an active member.

Illegal Occupation.

The Reparations figure, contained in General Smuts's speech, was generally recognized as too high, but the South African statesman agreed that a reasonable figure was not necessarily undesirable. If only political questions such as the return of Alsace-Lorraine were settled, he said, there would be no difficulty in finding a way. He strongly supported the British Government in the view that the Versailles Treaty was illegal under the Versailles Treaty and warned British individuals against participation in any Ruhr spasm.
