





His Excellency the Acting Governor is prepared, in order to reduce the number of elephants in certain areas where they cause damage to cultivation, to issue licences to approved Europeans and Africans. Such licences will be valid for a period of six months from the 1st, January 1922.

1. The licensee will be subject to the following conditions: (1) Every licensee shall specify the number of elephants he desires to shoot and shall pay the fees specified below in respect of such elephants or furnish a bank guarantee.

(2) No licensee shall be allowed to take out a licence to shoot more than twenty elephants at any one time but further licences may be issued in any application.

(3) The licensee shall not be required to take out the ordinary game licence but no other game shall be hunted except a game licence issued under the Ordinance.

(4) Licensees must undertake to shoot with rifles of not less than 375 calibre.

(5) The following fees shall be payable in respect of elephants shot: (a) For every pair of female tusks exceeding 20 lbs. in weight or for every pair of male tusks not exceeding 40 lbs. in weight. 50/-

(b) For every pair of female tusks weighing 20 lbs. in weight or for every pair of male tusks exceeding 40 lbs. in weight but not exceeding 70 lbs. in weight. 100/-

(c) For every pair of tusks exceeding 70 lbs. in weight. 150/-

8. All licensees are liable to be withdrawn at any time without notice should any of the above conditions not be complied with.

Interesting Specifications.

The desire not to be bothered by changes and innovations is a very natural one; perhaps that explains why when our legislators have introduced an income tax we would not be bothered with it!

Inspired by this simple, standardised legislation Messrs. H. W. Star Ltd., designed a new type of cart, or what should be called a tractor, as a type long overdue.

It is not a new type except in the trade—being exactly what the farmer has longed for, or if it is an innovation, it is so slight that I doubt that it can be pulled up to the line with one hand almost as easily as a ricksha, and with a tractor, one will still get a grip on the fair roads.

The Specifications. This is the full specification: Wheels 4 ft. axle 2 1/2 inch; tyre 3 inch; pole 5/8 inch; shaft 3/4 inch; body bottom of boards fitted lengthwise; bolts 1/2 inch through out one size of spanner fits all.




