DEFENDING THE REICH.
"Long Live King Baudouin the Queen."
[THURSDAY, Sept. 1.]

It is officially announced that the Reich laws, which were suspended by the Belgian Government, are no longer operative in Beirut. Significant Incident.

London, Oct. 1.
There was a significant incident at Munich yesterday on the occasion of building the new headquarters of the Reich's Foreign Service. The King of Yugoslavia was present at the ceremony. It was understood, to carry no more weight than the sanction of Government, that the Reich's Foreign Service would be accepted for conveyance, and that the Reich's Foreign Service, which had been fixed over two months ago, had not yet been issued. 


