





OMINOUS SPLIT IN NAIROBI TOWN COUNCIL

CITICISM OF EUROPEAN CONTROL OF MUNICIPAL AFFAIRS.

Divided Vote on Asiatic Representation
Future Dangers of Undersized European Majority.

FUTURE HOPES OF MISSIONS, KAYLAN AND UDALL.

The important subject of the composition of the Town Council was discussed. Comptroller Giles pointed out that the prediction of Indian votes was not reliable. He said that it would be well to go forward with a general meeting of the town's people to get their views on the subject and it is now proposed to call a fuller report on the subject at the next session of the Council.

Comptroller Jacobs said that he had been in touch with the members of the town's representative body.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Udall. The speaker on the subjects of the future representation of Nairobi was Mr. Udall, who had been a member of Council and in the elections to the Town Council which will take place in October.

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Comptroller Giles said that if there had been a proportion of five Indians to one European in the Council, he would have no objection to the Europeans being asked to go to the head of the Council. He said that it was necessary to maintain a distinct European majority in the Council, but they had a small majority. It might be recommended that the Europeans be asked to give up their seats on the Council and there would always be a sufficient number of Europeans to represent the interests of the Europeans.

Comptroller Jacobs said that he did not think it was necessary to do so.

Mr. Udall said that the Indians were getting a majority on the Council and that it was necessary to do something to maintain a distinct European majority.

Comptroller Jacobs said that he had been in touch with the Indians and objected to the proposal to do away with European representation.

Comptroller Giles said that he had been in touch with the Indians and that he would support the proposal.

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Comptroller Giles said that their knowledge throughout their many years of experience in India has taught them that it is not necessary to do with regard to Indian representation in the Council.

Mr. Udall said that the Indians were getting a majority on the Council and that it was necessary to do something to maintain a distinct European majority.

Comptroller Jacobs said that he had been in touch with the Indians and that he would support the proposal.


