



IMPORTANT STATEMENT OF FINANCER, EDUCATION, IMMIGRATION AND RAILWAYS

His Excellency the Governor delivered yesterday the longest and the most important speech made by His Excellency in Kenya...

In respect to the Indian question he adopted the new draft Immigration Bill to be based on equity, despite the absence of the Indian side...

He also announced that he had recommended the acceptance of the recommendations of the Municipal Commission on the subject of Indian representation.

He expressed very great optimism regarding the general situation in the Colony, and said that the Government will do its utmost to ensure that the central institutions with Kenya's stability and the need for development.

With regard to Finance he mentioned that the financial deficit for 1923 would be reduced to £200,000 and that for the first part of 1924 Government receipts had exceeded estimates by £25,000.

His Excellency repeated his assurance that native development would not interfere with the labor supply subsequently new taxes.

He made important statements in connection with the building and opening dates of the branch railways, and in regard to the retention of Mr. Fellow and that the railway would be discussed during the G.M.'s forthcoming visit to London.

Important developments in education are foreshadowed. One of the outstanding features of the Governor's speech was his announcement that he is taking steps to dry serious accounts which stand against the railway for a book by Mr. G. F. Andrew and will ask the Colonial Office to take further action.

Finance he made clear his policy of "no economy" in Government expenditure.

His Excellency said: "This is the first Session of Council since the Legislative Council Amendment Ordinance 1924, and I have a strong sense of privilege and responsibility in presiding over the deliberations."

He is very optimistic to this Colony that the present tranquility and progress should not be disturbed by the suspension of the Government's policy.

The Municipal Commission. You are aware that a recent Commission was reported upon Municipal affairs, particularly with reference to representation on the Municipal Council.

It is my duty to say to you that the Commission's recommendations were made in a responsible and a serious manner, and I am glad to say that the Government will do its utmost to ensure that the Commission's recommendations are carried out.

THE COFFEE INDUSTRY.
The Coffee Planters' Union will discuss on Monday (next) today as we understandly mentioned yesterday a motion embracing two very important questions: (1) The formation of a Coffee Control or Advisory Board, and (2) the imposition of a levy upon coffee growers to provide a coffee fund to facilitate and develop the industry. With the principle of both suggestions we are in complete accord. The coffee industry has now reached a stage in its development and in the progress of the country, when it can be regarded as having definitely emerged from its seedling clothes. We noted recently the discussion by members of the public by members of the committee upon the subject of the many high, a respectable tendency, always a feature of Kenya affairs in the past month to appeal to Government for help. That attitude is commendable and indeed essential when an industry in its infancy, but coffee planters had assumed proportions when it must begin to stand upon its own legs, and enabled, by assistance in the aggregate it represents millions of people out of which the State cannot derive any considerable revenue. But the establishment of a Coffee Control Board, more so the Government, the planter, and

knowledge is essential. We are aware of course that the principal coffee industry has a special consideration when there are many other branches of agriculture with an equal claim for such attention. These difficult days, however, but we do think it is the duty of the Treasury to support in general detail for the amount extracted from the coffee tax and for Government to show with greater clarity that the money is spent. To fail, a levy, to fail, to be distributed through a trust, to support that every planter will pay a share based on a principle which is equitable. It is also essential that the commercial firms which handle coffee should be enabled to contribute as there will undoubtedly be considerable benefit to be derived from the extension of loans and through the institution of a Board of Control, their business would not provide an equally acceptable basis, but it is not our duty to be weighed, and we suggest for the consideration of the C.P.U. members our broadly outlined proposal of a levy on production which will ensure a sound distribution of the responsibility and of the benefits.
