

MR. STEPHEN GENEVIEVE'S VIEW OF EAST AFRICAN REQUIREMENTS

"The importance of the East African and Uganda Colonies to the British Empire is well known, and the outstanding feature of this speech was the attitude of the speaker towards the South African Government's handling of the Boer War.

The speaker, Lord Kitchener, Chairman of the Union-Castle Company, who had been present during the debate, said that his Company was losing money in its East African service, and that the cause of this loss was that the South African Government had not handled his business in the same manner as had been done by the Uganda Government.

In the Uganda Colony, he said, the administrators of the Public Works were unable to meet the requirements of the people, like East Africa without any difficulty at all.

He also said that he believed that any further extension of the Uganda Railways to that date would be a calamity, and that the present Government had not even attempted to pass any legislation in that regard.

Speaking of the Uganda Railways, he said that they were not well built, and that the material used in the construction of them was not up to the standard of the railways in this country.

In addition, he said, the roads in the Uganda Colony are in a bad condition, and that the state of traffic from the interior to the coast and to the port of Mombasa is extremely bad, and that there is no prospect of improvement.
