THE CHURCH IN KENYA.

The reverend gentlemen who delivered their addresses at the recent Diocesan Assembly in Nairobi have unanimously concurred in the recognition of the fact that the Church in Kenya is here to stay, and will continue to grow. They are carrying out its work to the full, and the dignified protest by the Legislative Council, which called the attention of the Bishop to the religious needs of the Colony, may be regarded as a tonic to the Church.

We bid farewell to those who will remain in Nairobi until the end of the year, and welcome those of the Coldest, and today the spiritual reply by Rev. O. H. Knight of Kilifi, whose ability to provide another chapter in the growth of the new spirit.

Finally, the Church is taking steps to meet the spiritual needs of the Colony and of its white population. We do not suggest for a moment that the Church in Kenya should

be synonymous with mission and witness and the闌門 of the country's problems. But the dialectical and dialectical nature of the Church will recreate the spirit of helpful guidance and sympathetic understanding which the Church, as an institution, has had from the life of the Colony. The Church will propagate a system of spiritual activities and difficulties in the interests of Church opinion in Britain will be a valuable contribution to the welfare of the Church in Kenya. Itself host church, it will also bring the people of the colony, a more practical and less theoretical, attitude to its aspirations in the daily double task of strengthening the link between the country and increasing its influence and usefulness. The Bishop of Nairobi has decided to continue his ministry in this work for some time. That admission makes it clear that we have progressed far along the road to a clearer understanding of the needs of the Church and the people to whom we offer our services in different fields. Let the Church endeavour to discover what our common efforts can do for our common cause and to divert our roads to the same goal. The induction of a missionary in the next session of the Legislative Council is an important step in this direction. The Church authorities in the country will be able to give the maximum of co-operation to the members of the Church in the colonies. Let the Church endeavor to dispose of the belief that the missions states in Kenya entirely dominate the interests of one section of the people of Kenya. The members of the Church in the Colonies themselves have been more heartily and sympathetically into the daily life of the settlers, and more easily able to identify with the settlers, than they have been able to do with the natives.

The Church can remain permanently detached from the life of the people of the Colony, or it can remain attached through the life of the people of the Colony, although the mission field often requires more work than the small and devoted band of missionaries in the Colony.

In the word "missionary" there is no room for the

We are to avoid the indifference outside which will lead us to split and separate like the leaves in the wind. The Church has a continuing power if it is properly and wisely used in all sincerity.

Some of these substances are very important for building interests.

is a vital need, yet not to neglect that the greatest care must be taken in the selection of a suitable site, as well as the location of the buildings.

The Municipal Engineers and the Civic Buildings Committee, will also demand the purchase of plots of land in return for the contribution of the £30,000.

The whole subject needs dealing with more than a mere question for a quarter of a million pounds.

Would it not be wise for the Civic Buildings Committee to consider their organization in connection with the other committee?

New Municipal offices cannot be considered urgent, unless the cost of present premises is prohibitive, and the accommodation insufficient.

The Civic Buildings Committee will consider the details of any large income scheme explained to us by the Mayor.

We hope that the Council

will be interested to know more about the scheme.
