## THE TRANS KENYA LINE DISPUTE

### Protect Meeting at Kitale.

### THE ELDERLY DEPUTATION

### Strongly Worded Telegram to the Governor.

### [FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT]

Kitale, State, July 30.—A further and more advanced stage was reached yesterday in the agitation from Kitale to get some recognition for the deviation in the little line from the main East African railway, which had been opened. It has been held, however, that the matter is of little importance, and in consequence, in addition to the meeting held last night, the deputation, which had taken place, gave on the previous occasion reported in the East African Standard, was able, however, to tell his hearers that he had been received by the Elder Chamber of Commerce, which had taken steps to have the Elder's deputation which is to be received by His Excellency on Monday.

### KENYA LAND DAIRY MATTER FOR ENQUIRY.

Mr. H. Hamilton (L. ## TANZANYIKA ESTIMATES.

Revenue and Expenditure for the Period 1924-1925.

## GENERAL ECONOMY INDICATED.

Native Education Put Before the European Hoods.

## THE "SELF-SUPPORTING" IDEAL.

The approved Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure for Tanganyika Territory for the year 1924-1925 were published yesterday.

The total Revenue for the current financial year is estimated at £14,024,720, an increase on the estimated Revenue for 1923-24 of £12,753,324.

The total estimated Expenditure for the same period is £15,422,200, or £1,397,476 more than the Revenue for management, stores and services.

The Agricultural Department shows an increase of £2,000 this year over last, while the other forty groups of expenditure show a decrease.

The previous year's expenditure, however, includes loans which are required to meet the costs of

£2,500,000 which were raised for the construction of the railway from Dar es Salaam to Mombasa.

Comparing the differences between last year's and this year's totals, Total Expenditure for last year had a net deficit of £2,000, while for 1924-25, and of £8,671,110 for 1923-24, or £1,397,476 more than the amounts of Extraordinary Expenditure and, taking the increases as against the decreases in ordinary expenditure, the deficits are £1,500,014 and £4,172,200 respectively.

## Port Expenses.

The Port and Marine Department made an increase in expenditure of £1,000 for port expenses,

as compared with that of last year, and the amount of port expenses is estimated to be £200,000.

The Colony was "the Lord Miller" for nearly twenty months ago, the upshot of which was that the Government had to spend some £2,000, while the organization and maintenance of the Force and the raising of the Army run away with an additional £2,000. This has been another reason to keep the "Lord Miller" administration in Durban harbour for a good deal of time. Of course it would be easier to give the vessel away.

The total estimate of £112,800 for the year 1924-25 is a reduction for 1923-24 of £15,000 million, and for the needs of a population of 2,700,000, a million is dead little enough.





