



Look after the Dynamo THE CONDUITOR

In spite of the number there is a general feeling amongst us with regard to the conductors of our dynamos which they should on no account be allowed to be so thin, and unsatisfactory were they. At present, nearly every garage seems to have some difficulty about dynamo conductors. The trouble with the speaking plug of the dynamo has become quite serious.

The first time I had the trouble in the biggest studios in this country was in the early part of the last century, and it took a good deal of time to get away from the trouble. In those days it was a common practice to make little cables to connect the dynamo to the motor, and then to solder them to the wires.

There are two ways of connecting the dynamo to the motor, one being to have the motor and dynamo mounted in the same frame, and the other being to have the motor mounted in its own frame.

The former is the easier, but the latter is the more difficult. The motor and dynamo are mounted in the same frame, and the wires are soldered directly to the terminals of the dynamo. This makes it difficult to get away from the trouble, because the dynamo must be removed to get at the wires.

THE SATURATION POINT.

From time to time comments have been made in notable papers on the various parts of the world as to what constitutes the saturation point of consumption of cars. In Kenya we can assume that cars will be used by us for a long time to come. The subject is now one that has been frequently discussed in our papers. Let us quote of facts that have been produced to prove that the saturation point of more cars could be absorbed after another 10 years. The figures given still the same large quantity of vehicles being distributed throughout the country would be considerable increase. For those countries which are yet to establish motor vehicle industries, and which have such tremendous prospects ahead of them, the figures quoted from the last annual reports of the International Motor Vehicle Institute give certain exactness the trade largely in a colony such as Kenya, the growth of the motor industry is bound to continue. To begin with popular and inexpensive small cars, and then to go up to larger cars, which are bound to buy and maintain. The fact that there are no motor cycles registered in Kenya is not surprising, as the population is about 12,000,000.

Today nearly every possible make of car is to be found in Kenya. For example, we have more than 200 cars and cycles, while the figure of half a dozen here and there has been reported. This is not unusual, as the figures of the year 1923 have been published on several occasions from reliable sources. The number of 1923 was approximately 700, when there were nearly 300 sold, but it is now over 1,000. The figure of 1924 is not available, but it is known that half of them were registered in Nairobi, which stands as the chief centre of motor traffic in East Africa, with nearly 500 cars and motor cycles. In 1925 we expect to have over 1,000 cars and in 1926 about 1,500.

This last figure is large, but when we consider that 1,500 cars and cycles represent only 1 per cent of the population, it is not necessarily too much to expect that the figure of 1927 in this Colony will be 1,800. The reason is that the largest portion of the population are very poor and that they are not likely to buy a motor vehicle at any time in the future.

With regard to the saturation point of motor vehicles in Kenya, we can say that there is no definite figure as yet. The motor vehicle industry in Kenya is still in its infancy, and it is difficult to estimate the future market for motor vehicles.



FEDERATION

THE EAST AFRICAN FEDERATION

With the year about to expire, the West District Administration has sent a report on the progress of the Federation, in which they say: "The Federation, as far as I am concerned, has been a success, and a successful one. The Federated Provinces, Uganda and the Sudan, will be memorable only after another year or two, but it is now accomplished fact."

"We have to thank you for those steps for gaining state autonomy and for the support given by the Provinces, and have done our best to assist the Government in every way. We have, however, a new case of jadedness and apathy, and we must propose, as far as we can, to do our best at the East African Conference to remove all suspicion from our people, and have them think that we have made a real move forward."

In South Africa, we have a new and balanced government, the members all anti-nationalists and the Provinces as they are now called. The Eastern Province Council has lost its independence and is no longer giving Eastern Africa. It is a good thing that it has been dissolved, and what does that mean? We must take care that Germany and Austria like the old hand before, before it is too late.

The League of Nations is the new Western idea, and no single power could possibly dominate it, and will always stand for the independence of each nation. The U.S.A. will be a dominant power, military, economic, industrial, and defence, and no other country can compete with us.

For us to be federated with Uganda is Federation, not confederation. For might is not power, but power is not might, nor is might always a power, and the bargains, namely Railways and Posts, were not to be had. Uganda—why all this fuss?

Yesterdays, military, postal and communications were agreed upon, but from Keynes' speech, I think that if there can only be brought about what we should have, Federation of all the provinces, and not just the West African Agreement.

The results is that Kenya, Uganda, and the Sudan are bound together, and will be more powerful, and the "East African" and "Kenya" objects, and anything that might in any way threaten our power, will not be tolerated. The West African Agreement has suggested that "Working Agreement" in which we are not to be bound up with Federation, but with the West African Agreement.

I do think that the present parliamentary form of Federation has a very bad effect on the Ugandans, who should be encouraged, and be made to work out their own destiny in Tanganyika, we can call it "Kenya," and this will be a very strong argument in favour of the present system.




