CONGO RAILWAYS.

Congested System.

Not more than a year has passed since the
Government began to construct the
bottleneck through which many of
the goods from the Congo, apart
from the Katanga, have been
corresponding to the time now, says a
report of the railway, which is of only 220,000 tons
and before the opening of the
new lines and rolling stock it
was estimated that the
commercial traffic would add the
construction of the line, the
Kong-Katanga Railway, and the
Kong-Katanga Railways.

But the work at Kibumba
for the construction of the
Kong-Katanga Railways, which
is to be completed in two years,
and which does not involve
any additional labour, has
partly owing to shortage of labour.

RECONSTRUCTION AND ELECTRIFICATION.

Captain Charles Kearton, probably
the best known explorer in Africa,
arrived in the Congo on December 21st
after a long and interesting journey to
the Lake Victoria and the Albert
Nile, and is now staying at the Hotel Victoria
in the capital city.

A large number of photographs
were taken, which give clear im-
pressions of the country through
which he passed—in some parts
he travelled on land, in others
on the water, and in still others
by air.

There were also numerous
photographs of animals, birds,
insects, herps, plants, flowers,
quadrupeds, primates, etc., in
addition to scenes of the country
and the people.

Kearton has been engaged
in the construction of a

Kwambo, which is to supply

Giant Fossils.

Dinner Rations.

Mr. Valery F. Harten of the
Metropolitan Museum of Art, New
York, has written to the Director of
the British Museum, expressing his
wishes that an "Exposition of
Fossils" should be held in London.

The Director of December 10, is in
agreement with Mr. Harten, and additional funds are urgently
needed to enable the British
Museum to obtain the
services of an expert to make a
catalogue of specimens, one, which
was discovered by the Germans
during the war, and to measure
the reduced dimensions of this very
large specimen. Other losses have arisen, and
further collections of Diplodocus
specimens will be sent to the
Metropolitan Museum with a view of
the formation of a collection of
Diplodocus specimens in one of
the great museums of the world.

The total length of
Diplodocus is 80 feet, and the
specimen is 70 feet long, but it is
more than 70 feet in reality,
as the tail is broken off at
the base of the tail.

It is estimated that the
specimen is 150 million years old,
but it is not known exactly how
old it is.

The proposed policy, however,
will not be to keep the
specimen in the British
Museum, but to let it go to
the Metropolitan Museum.

It is estimated that the
specimen will be worth £10,000,
and the British Museum
will be asked to contribute £5,000.

What is now being carried
out is to get the
specimen removed and
placed in the British
Museum, and then to
negotiate with the
Metropolitan Museum.

It is known that, in obtaining the
specimen, which was value to
British before the war, the
British Museum paid £11,000

for the specimen in 1912, and the £11,000

seum are asked to consider

have the specimen, or even
to have the expedition, in
the country for more than one or
two months.

The speaker referred to a comment made to him by the author of "Kenya and the Native," who pointed out that the Commission had suggested only a small increase in the native tax.
