My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 139 of March 12th, I have the honour to transmit herewith a list of the posts in the Protectorate Service which it is considered should be secured. Certain additions have been made to this list since it was forwarded to Your Lordship with Sir James Hayes Sadler's despatch No. 405 of November 21st 1907.

2. With reference to paragraph 3 of Your Lordship's despatch under reply, I have the honour to report that after consulting the Governor of Uganda I do not consider that owing to the small number of posts to be insured, a local fund would be advisable neither do I think that a joint fund for the two Protectorates would be very satisfactory, and I have the honour to recommend the continuance of the existing system of insuring with the Law Guarantee and Trust Society, but I am of opinion that it is most desirable in view of the frequent changes either temporary or permanent in the holders of posts to secure the posts themselves and not the individual incumbents

incumbents and I submit these proposals for Your Lordship's favourable consideration.

3. I venture to ask for an early ruling on these two points and should be grateful if Your Lordship would inform the Crown Agents of the decision arrived at and instruct them to discontinue the existing premia from January 1910 and enter on fresh agreements in accordance with the revised list of posts and the amount for which security is to be found in each case.

4. In this connection I have the honour to invite Your Lordship's attention to the fact that in the case of certain posts the amount for which security is to be found laid down in the list enclosed herewith exceeds that existing at present and I submit that it would be somewhat hard on the present holders of those posts to call upon them to pay an increased amount in respect of their security premia. I have the honour to suggest for Your Lordship's favourable consideration that in such cases the extra amounts involved should be paid from the funds of the Departments concerned until such time as a new officer is appointed to the post in question.

5. I have not included the Uganda Railway posts, which I consider should be secured, in the enclosed list as there seem to be difficulties in the way of working the system. I will address Your Lordship separately

separately on this subject.
