 red-pencil crosses Umalli, Ruffale, &
 Chire, Mysle. I have been unable to
 identify the depots at Mysle,
 but I assume that it is somewhere in the
 neighbourhood of Chire Mysle, so that
 the piece of country which we have
 gained - probably as indicated roughly
 by the dotted red-pencil line - we have
 no indication of what has been given to
 Abyssinia, but I think that we may
 rest assured that Major Ferguson, who has
 had previous experience as Comr for the
 Sudan, abyssinian delimit., has made

not a satisfactory arrangement.

Paraphrase of telegram from Lord H. Hervey to Sir E. Grey, dated Adis Ababa, February 26th, 1909. 79

Southern Frontier Commission.

My immediately preceding telegram.

I received yesterday a letter from Major Gwynne stating that the new line which has been marked out up to Moyele varies materially from the line marked on the map attached to the Treaty. We have conceded to Abyssinia a large portion of country to the West of Ursulli. On the other hand the Kuffoli corner has been cut off and placed in our territory so as to include the Inspector's station at Moyele, that will be found to be situated to the North of the line marked in red, and also the wells and road.

It is reported that Mr. Zaphiro is accompanying the Commission back to Adis Ababa in which case it is impossible to send him a message.

May I use my discretion to explain the necessity for the changes in the line to the German whom the Abyssinians have appointed their Commissioner.
